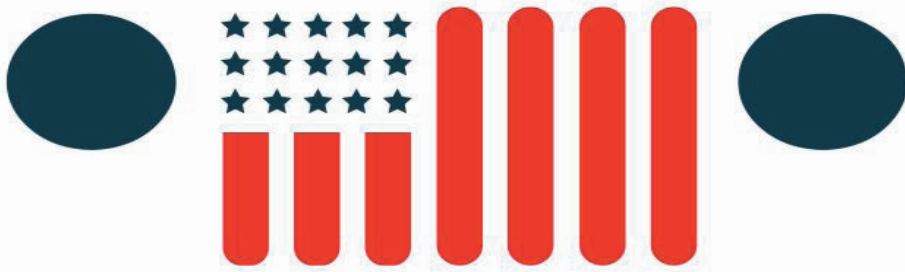

## WHAT'S COOKING

### Summer is here!

We are having typical Minnesota weather, chilly one day and steamy hot the next! It seemed like it was too warm for the birds, there weren't as many at our feeders yesterday! I don't blame them, I would stay in the shade of trees too if I were them. Today's recipe comes from my friend Helga Anderson, everyone who tries them gives them rave reviews. I am writing the recipe as it was written but Helga uses 3/4 cup butter in the glaze and says they freeze well.

#### ZUCCHINI FRUIT BARS

1 1/4 cups flour  
1 1/2 cup sugar  
1 1/2 tsp. soda  
1/2 tsp. salt  
2 eggs  
2 cups grated zucchini (do not press liquid out)  
1 8 oz. can crushed pineapple, do not drain  
1 tsp. vanilla

#### Glaze:

1 cup butter (Helga uses 3/4 cup)  
1 1/2 cup sugar  
1/2 cup evaporated milk  
2 tsp. vanilla  
chopped nuts

#### Topping:

coconut

Combine bar ingredients in a large bowl; beat. Pour into a greased jelly roll pan. Sprinkle with coconut. Bake at 350 degrees for 20-27 minutes.

While bars are baking prepare glaze by mixing all ingredients in a sauce pan, except for the nuts. Bring to a boil and boil for 2 minutes. Remove from heat and slowly spoon hot glaze over hot bars. It will seem like a lot of glaze but the bars will absorb the glaze. Sprinkle nuts on top!

Bob passed away unexpectedly on Saturday evening, June 5, 2021, at the St. Francis Regional Medical Center in Shakopee, MN. The Lakeview Funeral Home and Cremation Service in Fairmont is assisting the family with arrangements.

Herman Robert "Bob" Fast always believed in upward mobility. On Saturday, June 5, Bob received the ultimate call of upward mobility. Bob's Lord and Savior Jesus Christ called Bob, and without hesitation, Bob gladly went to heaven.

Herman Robert "Bob" Fast was born in Mountain Lake, Minnesota, on Sept. 25, 1927, to Herman B. Fast and Anna (Wiebe) Fast. Bob was baptized in 1939 at Bethel Mennonite Church in Mountain Lake. Bob attended rural country school for 7 years near Butterfield, Minnesota. Bob was 11 years old when his dad passed away. He and his mother moved to Mountain Lake, where he finished his schooling.

Bob played football and basketball while in high

school. Bob had many memories of choir, class, plays, and school band. Bob graduated from Mountain Lake High School in 1945. Bob was very proud of his Mountain Lake Mennonite work ethic that he injected into the rest of his life.

Bob attended the University of Minnesota, where he played football under legendary coach Bernie Bierman until he was released because of a military disability. Bob went happily.

Bob loved talking sports with Karson Janssen because it was always about the University of Minnesota.

Bob went on to graduate from the University of Minnesota in 1949 with a bachelor's degree in civil engineering. In February of 1960 Bob earned his Structural Engineer Degree in the state of California. Bob later earned a master's degree from the State College of California, Los Angeles, in 1970 in public administration.

Bob was married to Doris Peters of Mountain Lake from 1948 until her passing in 1993. Bob and Doris had three children. Bob's belief in upward mobility in a person's career led him and his family to many wonderful opportunities. After Bob's graduation from the University of Minnesota, he went to work for Boeing Airplane Company as a design engineer in Seattle, which landed him as a bridge engineer for the state of Washington. Bob was very proud of his bridge designs.

Bob moved back to Minnesota, where he was a bridge engineer for the state. He was hired by Mogney, Tussler & Setter Engineering in Minneapolis as a building structural design engineer.

Bob then moved onto

Montgomery Ward as an industrial engineer. While there, he also applied his studies in time, space and motion for Montgomery Ward's warehouses in Chicago. These talents of Bob's did not stop him. He then was hired by Robin Hood Flour in Minneapolis as a project engineer. Bob's upward mobility rapidly sent him to AeroJet General. He was hired as a project manager and assistant department head. Bob worked there for 10 years. During his years, Bob traveled the country, and ended up in Florida during the Cuban Missile Crisis and was project manager on many of the missile silos that were built in Florida.

Bob then headed to what would be an outstanding career of community service for two communities in California. Bob started as a public service director and assistant city manager for West Covina. His passion for West Covina and its projects for a growing community were endless.

His work for West Covina then sent him on his upward mobility mantra to the city of Chino as city manager for four years. While at Chino, Bob was appreciated by his constituents. Bob's tireless work was the start of a community that kept growing and was progressive. Bob then headed back to West Covina where he was city manager for 14 years. Bob's relentless progress was never-ending. Bob served on numerous boards and organizations in West Covina. His love for the city was always in his blood. Bob's upward mobility kept going. Bob walked into Janzen's Greenhouse, shook his head and said to Jon Janzen, "I believe these greenhouses are not square." Bob would continue to use his structural engineering degree by building and refurbishing projects at the greenhouses.

Bob enjoyed his life with Odette. They traveled to Europe two different times, attending summer Lutheran Church-Missouri Synod conferences and for 17 years, spent time in Sedona and Scottsdale, Arizona. Bob had a great love of the Red Rock in Sedona and the many fine restaurants there.

Bob enjoyed a game of golf. He made many friends at Interlaken Golf Club. Dale, Swede, Ernie, Warren, Irv and all the guys made his life very enjoyable in Fairmont.

Bob and Odette enjoyed going out to eat. He made friendships with the waitresses and waiters at Green Mill and Bean Town restaurants, which further enhanced Bob's life.

Bob loved sports over the years. Bob and Sentinel sports editor and friend Charlie Sorrells had many spirited conversations regarding Minnesota sports teams. Bob was always smiling and appreciative of all the businesses who came to do work at the house - from De War Electric to Day Plumbing to Landscaping Plus to Roy Boucher. Bob also liked all the people at

Militello Motors and Graham Tire for their services. The employees at Janzen's Greenhouse became Bob's extended family; he truly loved all of them.

Bob was truly a man of faith. He and Odette held hands as they prayed before every meal. To witness his faith was a sight no words could ever do justice to. Bob's faith was enduring throughout all of his life.

Bob's engineering background and city management skills were integral to his everyday life. Bob's meticulous nature led him to making fine opportunities for him and those who surrounded him. Bob's love of politics came to him early in life. As a young boy, Bob and his mother traveled with his father Herman B. Fast to St. Paul. Bob's father was a two-time state representative - his first term as a Republican. Bob said his father felt the hand of God move him to the Democratic Party. Bob believed in everyone's right to vote. Bob was extremely happy about the last presidential election. The last 26 years Bob was surrounded by lots of love from family and friends. Bob loved everyone back.

Bob is survived by his wife of 26 years, Odette (Hotzler) Janzen Fast of Fairmont; three stepsons who were very dear and beloved to Bob - Bradley (Marcia) Janzen of Minnetonka,

Mark (Gayle) Janzen of Fort Lupton, Colorado, and Jon (LaNette) Janzen of Fairmont; four grandchildren and two Collie dogs, Violet and Halo Janzen.

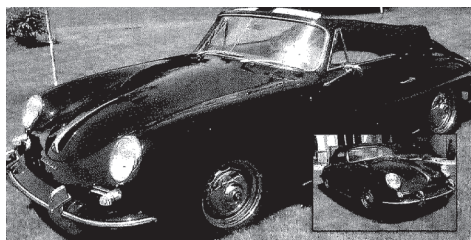

## FATHER'S DAY GIFT WRAPPED UP IN 'PACKAGE DEAL'

Cade and Beth Hartwig laugh – a lot. They also finish each other's sentences – a lot.

Armchair analysis might reveal that they finish each other's thoughts because raising four children while juggling non-traditional work schedules keeps them too busy to generate an entire sentence on their own.

The laughter probably stems from the happy chaos of raising those four kids.

"I remember one conversation we had," Beth

said. "He said, if you would have told me six months before we met, that I would be in love with a girl with three kids..."

"I would have said you're nuts. It's not happening," Cade finished.

Beth's first husband, Brandon Byers, passed away in 2009, leaving her a young widow with three young children, ages 6, 2 and 8 months. About a year later, Beth saw Cade, who is a funeral director at Lakeview Funeral Home, coming out of a

restaurant.

"I said, 'Hey, you're the funeral guy,'" she recalled.

She asked a mutual friend about Cade. Eventually, they struck up a friendship that grew into a deeper bond.

"When I moved in, the kids were 7, 4 and 2. I didn't know what I was biting off," Cade said, eliciting waves of laughter from Beth.

He remembers standing

in line with McKayla, the oldest, at a concert at the fairgrounds. She turned to him and asked, "Why are you here?"

"I was kind of questioning that myself at the time," Cade laughed, his wife joining him.

They married in 2012 and added a fourth child, Gavin Hartwig, now 7, to the family.

Before the two became a couple, Cade had spent his off-work hours tinkering on snowmobiles, riding his Harley or hanging out with friends.

"Now there's responsibility. There's soccer, school. I went from buying parts and restoring old snowmobiles and riding the Harley to this," he said, grinning as the four kids burst into the house after a weekly visit to their grandparents, Jay and Barb Byers, Brandon's parents.

"With Gavin, Brandon's folks are Grandma and Grandpa too," Cade said. "You know, you're scared how the other family is going to react if you remarry and have other kids," Beth said.

"But they welcomed me in. They're awesome," Cade said of Jay and Barb.

The three oldest children, McKayla Byers, 17, Hailey Byers, 14, and Carter Byers, 12, don't call Cade Dad, but they do refer to them as Mom and Dad in different situations.

"I'm not trying to replace him (Brandon)," Cade said. "I always said from

the beginning that it's my duty to make sure they remember who he was."

"Twice a year, on Brandon's birthday and the anniversary of the day he passed, we always go out to the cemetery, and Cade's right along with us," Beth said.

Finding time for the entire family to be together can be challenging. Beth's job at True Value has her working into the early evening hours, and Cade's job at the funeral home finds him often called out any time, any day.

But that is something they have dealt with since the beginning of their relationship.

"When Cade and I first started dating, the very first time we all went out as a family, we went to lunch. He ended up getting a call from work, and his dad had to come pick him up," Beth said.

Adding to the challenge is Cade's service as a member of the Fairmont Fire Department.

The very first fire call after they started dating lasted more than 10 hours.

"I thought, is this how it's going to be? And I still married him," Beth said. "I understand his workload."

Their last family vacation to the Wisconsin Dells was about four years ago, and it doesn't look like there will be another any time soon. Beth said with the oldest child preparing to go off to college

and the youngest in early elementary school, it's almost impossible to find a balance and a destination that will make everybody happy.

But the family still strives to spend time together.

"It doesn't have to be anything big. Sometimes, we're just sitting by the campfire or sitting on the porch or watching a movie in the living room," Beth said.

"Most nights end up with all of us sitting in the living room," Cade said. "I might be watching a movie. The kids might be on their phones, but we usually tend to end up in the same spot."

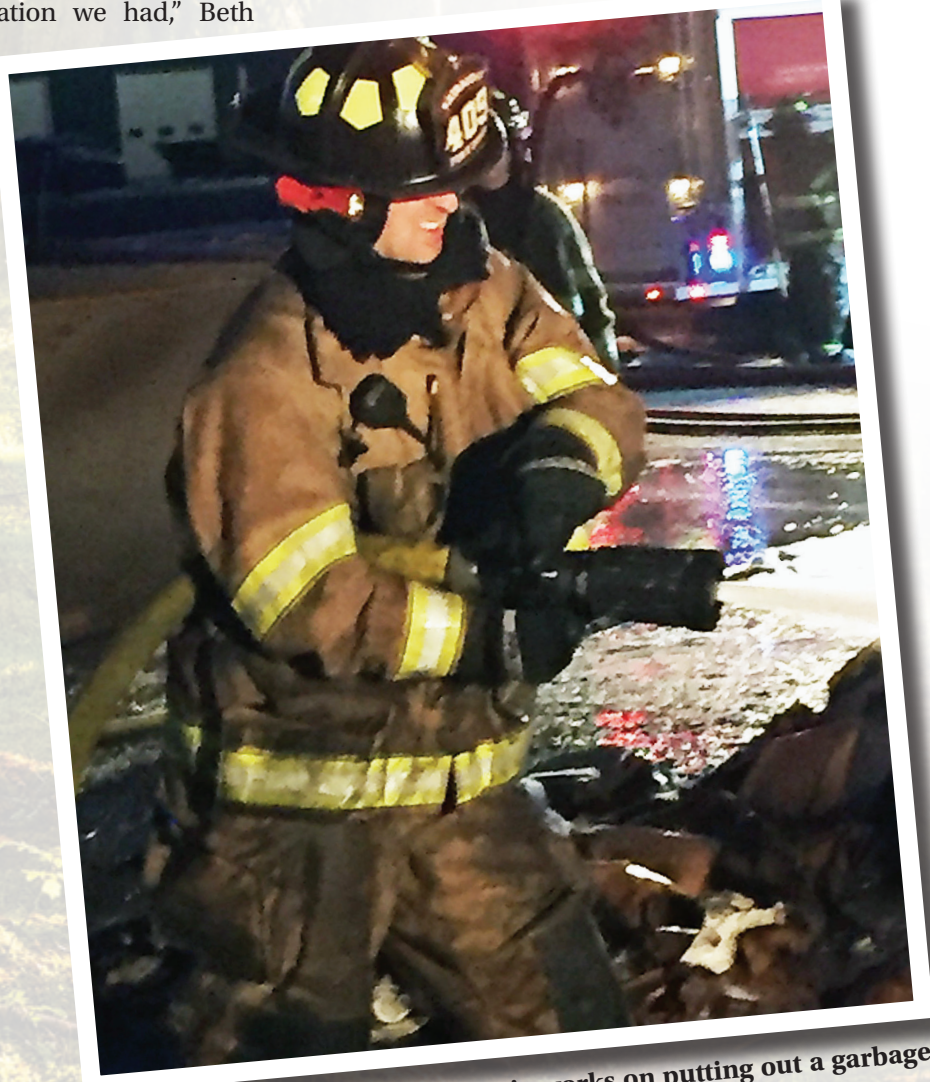
Occasionally, if Beth is working, Cade will load the kids in the van and head out for ice cream and a drive around the lakes.

"It's not the big vacations. It's the little moments in time that are important," he said.

"When Cade and I first met, you don't know how it's going to end up. You just don't know," Beth said. "But it seemed like it all just fit. I don't know how to explain it, but everything just seemed to fit perfectly."

"Like my mom said, he had to fall in love with me first, and then he'd fall in love with the kids. That was true. It wasn't just me. It was me and the kids."

"You said that from the beginning. It was a package deal," Cade said.

If you're a dad, you may be in line to get some nice gifts on Father's Day. But your greatest gift may be your ability to help your children. One way of doing that is to get them started in the world of investing - and making a few investments on their behalf.

### Here are three possibilities:

- 529 plan - If you in-

vest in a 529 education savings plan, your earnings can grow federally tax-free, provided the money is used for qualified educational expenses. (Withdrawals not used for these expenses will generally incur taxes and penalties on investment earnings.) If you invest in your own state's 529 plan, you might receive some state tax benefits, too, depending on how your state's tax laws apply to 529 plans. State-by-state tax treatment may vary, so you'll need to consult with your tax professional about

your situation.

Provided you stay within certain limits, you can also use a 529 plan to pay for qualified K-12 expenses and registered apprenticeship programs. And you can even use it to repay certain qualified student loans, within limits.

A 529 plan can affect financial aid, but its effect is generally lower than that of other assets. And as the account owner, you have control of your 529, so, if one child decides not to go to college or pursue further education, you can switch beneficiaries.

- UGMA/UTMA account - When you establish a special type of custodial account known as either UGMA (Uniform Gift to Minors Act) or UTMA (Uniform Transfers to Minors Act), you are providing financial resources that can be used for education or another purpose that benefits your child, such as summer programs.

One potential benefit of an UGMA or UTMA is that some of the earnings will be taxed at the child's rate, which is likely lower than your own. Plus, UGMA/UTMA accounts typically allow a wide range of investment choices. However, once children reach the age of majority (typically 18 or 21) they gain complete access to the money and can do whatever they want with it.

- IRA - A child with any

taxable compensation, such as money from an after-school job, is eligible to fund an IRA. You may want to open one on your child's behalf - and you can "sweeten" the offer by matching some of their contributions. You can't directly invest in the IRA, but you can give your child money for that purpose. Keep in mind, though, that the total amount contributed can't exceed your child's taxable compensation for the year.

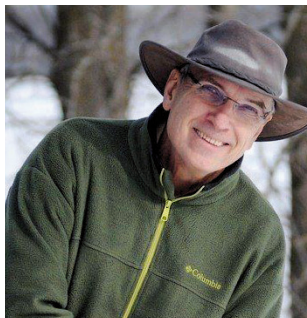
An IRA is a great introduction to the world of investing. For one thing, your child can make small contributions throughout the year, so investing in an IRA doesn't seem burdensome. Also, since an IRA can be invested in different types of securities, your child can learn about various investment vehicles - stocks, bonds,

mutual funds and so on. Plus, you can point out that, with a traditional IRA, taxes won't be due on the earnings until your child starts taking withdrawals decades from now. (And with a Roth IRA, withdrawals are tax-free, provided certain conditions are met.)

On Father's Day, you can show your appreciation for whatever gifts you receive from your children. But by investing in their future, you can gain some longer-term contentment.

## Naturally By Al Batt

In another time, I traveled around one day a week taking photos and peering at birds. No birds were harmed in the process. My faithful Chihuahua companion Sancho accompanied me. He got his name because of the book I was reading at the time I brought the puppy home in my coat pocket. Sancho

Panza was Don Quixote's squire in the novel "Don Quixote" by Miguel de Cervantes. Don Quixote represented illusion, Sancho Panza represented reality. The canine Sancho was a good friend. A good listener to my quixotic ideas.

Such undertakings built a thirst and I'd swing into the drive-through of a fast-food restaurant to get a cup of iced tea. This was Sancho's favorite part of birding and photography. He perked up when he saw the person at the restaurant's window and immediately looked his sweetest. "Oh, your dog is so cute. Would it be OK if I gave him a little bit of hamburger?" said the worker. It was OK with Sancho.

### Bluebird blues

Keith Radel of Faribault maintains 175 sites for blue-

bird nest boxes and told me bluebird numbers in those boxes were down 53% from last year. Many of his birds winter in Arkansas, Texas or Oklahoma and winter storms were hard on them. The best year Keith has had fledging bluebirds was in 2012. A nasty spring here dropped that number 53% in 2013. The availability of houses has led to double the number of chickadees nesting in them this year. He has two chickadee pairs nesting 10 feet apart and has noticed no disputes among them.

### President of birding

President Theodore Roosevelt was one of the most powerful voices in the history of American conservation. After becoming president in 1901, Roosevelt established 150 national forests, 51 federal bird reserves, four national game preserves, five national parks and 18 national monuments on over 230 million acres of public land. He identified 91 bird species he saw or heard on

the White House lawn.

### Hummingbird highlights

When the Spanish first encountered hummingbirds, they called them resurrection birds—believing something that shining must die each night and be reborn the next morning. Spanish missionaries used hummingbirds to explain the resurrection. Male Anna's hummingbirds dive at speeds of 385 body lengths per second according to a study in the U.K. journal "Proceedings of the Royal Society B." Mayan legend said the first two hummingbirds were created from small feather scraps left over from the construction of other birds. Hummingbirds are attracted to the color red. That includes parked cars, lipstick and hats.

### Guy wires

Bob Janssen of Golden Valley told me he and Ray Glassel were birding years ago when they found 978 dead birds (including two yellow rails) near a com-

munications tower by Lewisville. Guy wires can be bird-killers in a fog.

### Q&A

"What is your favorite raptor?" I think the American kestrel is the most beautiful. The northern harrier, once called a marsh hawk, kept me company when I was a mere stripling along Mule Lake. The peregrine falcon because its TV channel kept me entertained when I was hospitalized. And the merlin because I can't help but watch one when I see one. My least favorite is a Toronto Raptor.

"Does any bird have a beak longer than its body?" The sword-billed hummingbird is the only bird to have a beak longer than its body.

"Will barn swallows reuse nests?" They may use nests from previous years, but avoid those heavily infested with mites or other parasites. When reusing nests, they clean out old feathers and add new mud to the nest's rim. They put their cup-shaped nests on upright surfaces like docks, bridges, barns and the eaves of other buildings. The nests are built of mud reinforced with grass and lined with feathers and fine grasses.

"How many nests does

a cardinal have each year?" Cardinals (*Cardinalis cardinalis*) commonly raise two broods in Minnesota. When the first brood fledges, the father takes care of the fledglings as the mother builds a second nest, and lays and incubates eggs.

"Do dragonflies eat many mosquitoes?" Not nearly as many as I wish they did because adult dragonflies and mosquitoes can keep different hours, but the carnivorous dragonfly nymphs devour mosquito larvae.

# For the Dads

It's that time of year; the time we scratch our heads and wonder, "What do we get dad for Father's Day?" A tie? Dads don't wear ties very often anymore. A hammer? A golf club? After all, ties, hammers, and golf clubs are three of the most common gifts for Father's Day. Just spending time with your dad would be great, but is there something you could get him that he would really appreciate?

How about the gift of health?

You're probably wondering, "How do you give the gift of health?" It's especially tricky for a dad who probably isn't that aware of the true state of his own health and the fact that he should be doing something about it. Let's face it, many men do not put a real high priority on their own health. What if you could gently guide him in that direction? Dad gets to feel better and you get a healthier dad, so you both win!

Here's one way you can do that: buy your dad high quality supplements that will give him some energy and vitality back. 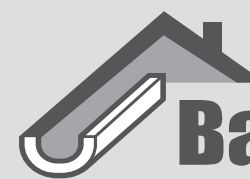

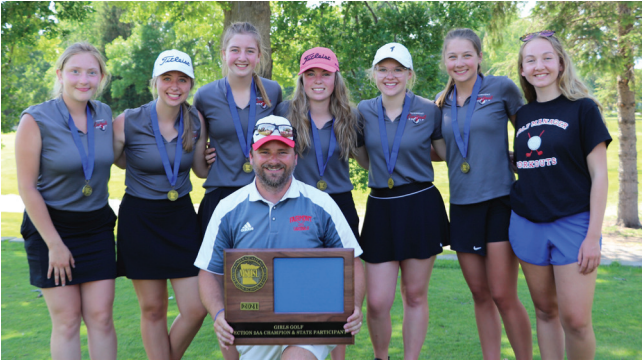

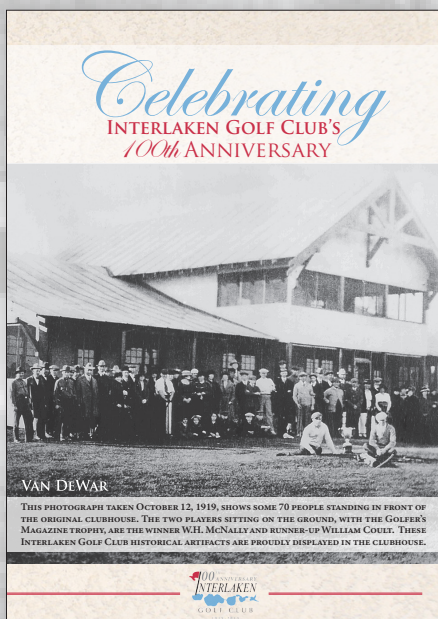
