The Martin County Courthouse Clock

The recently re-conditioned Martin County Courthouse Clock will be on display for public viewing in the courthouse at 9:00 a.m. on Monday, August 23rd. Installation is scheduled for the following day, Tuesday, August 24th.

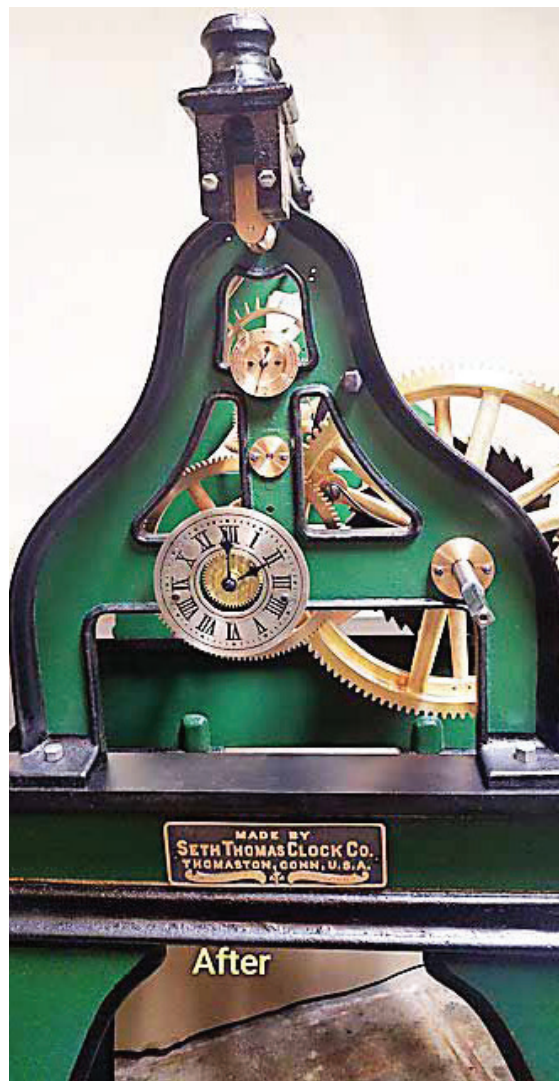
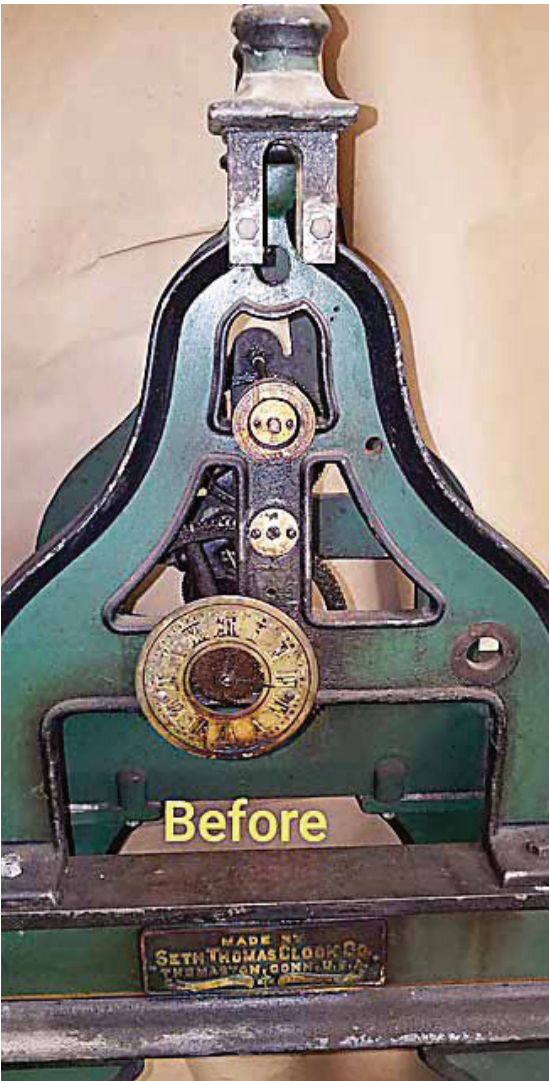
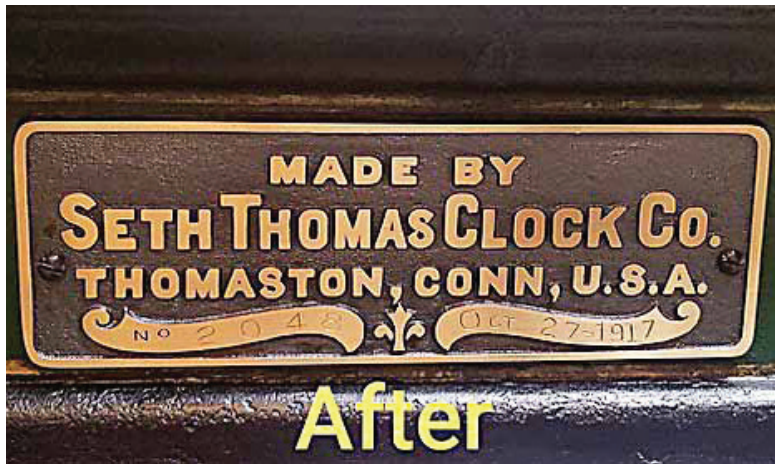
DeMesy of Mechanical Watch Supply, "Warren Johnson of Johnson Electric Company, later Johnson Controls, made the first clock. It was air driven (pneumatic)." This pneumatic operation had many operational problems. The history of the current clock, made by the Seth Thomas Clock

Company of Thomaston, Connecticut, dates back to 1917 when it replaced the former clock that was air driven. The cost of that Seth Thomas Clock, number 2,048 of 2,500 that were built, was \$479.00. Over the years, the clock has been the topic of discussion due to its occasional

inaccurate recording of time. A Sentinel article from June 14, 1941, read "Courthouse Clock Blows Fuses After Pigeonitis Cured." Apparently, this was caused by faulty wiring and not pigeons that had caused previous problems. A Sentinel story entitled "Time Marches On Again At Courthouse" from September 8, 1960, tells of the courthouse dome renovation at that time and the work on the gears and mechanism of the clock. The four faces

of the clock at that time were registering different times. That seemed to cause a great deal of confusion to onlookers checking for the correct time. An August 24, 1985, Sentinel story entitled "Courthouse clock keeps ticking along," details some of the problems that were developing with the clock at that time. According to this story, "it was losing time constantly." It went on to state that months were spent searching the entire country for some new

gears and a new motor before finally finding what was needed for the repairs. The current reconditioning restored the clock to exactly as it originally looked. This reconditioning is a result of a specialized trade requiring extensive knowledge and understanding of the clock movement in addition to the ability to manufacture new parts. To see the clock before it is installed, visit the Martin County Courthouse on Monday, August 23, 2021, at 9:00 a.m.

Deadline nears for Federated's Operation Round Up applications

Baked Peppers With Rice Stuffing

Serves 6

3 tablespoons olive oil
1 large chicken breast, diced
5 ounces lean pork, diced
4 ounces ham or smoked bacon, diced
7 ounces short-grain rice
2 garlic cloves, finely chopped
2 pounds ripe tomatoes, skinned, seeded and chopped
1 green bell pepper, finely chopped
3 tablespoons corn kernels
2 teaspoons paprika
Pinch powdered saffron
Salt and freshly ground black pepper
6 tablespoons chopped fresh parsley
6 large red bell peppers

Heat the oil in a large saucepan and fry the chicken, pork and ham or bacon until colored on all sides. Take the pan off the heat and reserve.

Meanwhile, cook the rice in plenty of boiling salted water until done - usually about 15 minutes, but follow the instructions on the package. Drain and reserve the rice.

Add the garlic, chopped tomatoes, green bell pepper, corn kernels, paprika, saffron, salt and pepper, and parsley to the pan containing the meat. Let the sauce simmer and reduce the volume of liquid by about half. Stir the rice into the sauce.

Oil a deep ovenproof dish big enough to take all the peppers. Cut off "lids" at the stalk ends of the peppers and remove the seeds. Stuff them with the meat and rice mixture and replace the lids. Tuck the peppers into the dish, cover with foil, and bake at 325 F for 1 1/4 hours.

With his brothers and sisters, their children, spouses, grandchildren, and great-grandchildren, it's a lot of people. Ag Update: USDA REPORT PROVIDES MIXED RESULTS FOR CORN AND SOYBEAN YIELDS

The August 12 USDA Crop Report projected an increased 2021 average U.S. corn yield compared to last year and a similar national average soybean yield to 2020; however, it should be noted that both yield levels were reduced from the July USDA estimates. The August yield and production projections were based on a National Ag Statistics Service (NASS) survey of 18,600 crop producers in early August and on crop conditions as of August 1. The August USDA corn and soybean yield projections were actually lower than average estimates by grain marketing analysts, so the initial grain market reaction tended to be "bullish," with increases in both corn and soybean prices following the release of the August 12 report.

The August 12 USDA Crop Report estimated the 2021 total U.S. corn production at 14.75 billion bushels, which would be an increase of 4 percent from the 2020 production level of just under 14.2 billion bushels. The 2021 projected U.S. corn production also compares to 3.6 billion bushels in 2019, 14.4 billion bushels in both 2018 and 2017 and the current record U.S. corn production of 15.2 billion bushels in 2016. USDA is estimating 2021 total U.S. corn acreage harvested for grain at 84.5 million acres, which compares to 82.5 million acres in 2020.

The latest Crop Report

projects the national average corn yield in 2021 at 174.8 bushels per acre, which is a decline of 4.9 bushels per acre from the NASS yield estimate in July. This compares to U.S. corn yields of 172 bushels per acre in 2020, 167.4 bushels per acre in 2019, 176.4 bushels per acre in 2018, and the current record U.S. average corn yield of 176.6 bushels in 2017. Many private grain marketing analysts projected slightly higher national corn yield levels than the USDA report. There is a large diversity in 2021 corn yield estimates between the Eastern Corn Belt States and the western areas of the region.

USDA is estimating a record 2021 corn yield in eight States, including Illinois, Indiana and Ohio. The 2021 corn yield estimate for Illinois is 214 bushels per acre, compared to 192 bushels per acre in 2020; Indiana at 194 bushels per acre, compared to 187 bushels per acre in 2020; and Ohio at 193 bushels per acre, compared to 171 bushels per acre in 2020. Nebraska is projected at 186 bushels per acre in 2021, compared to 181 bushels per acre in 2020. The other end of the USDA State corn yield estimates for 2021 include South Dakota at 133 bushels per acre, compared to 162 bushels per acre in 2020; North Dakota at 106 bushels per acre, compared to 139 bushels per acre in 2020; and Wisconsin at 167 bushels per acre, compared to 174 bush-

els per acre in 2020. The 2021 corn acreage in North and South Dakota combined trails only Iowa and Illinois in estimated total corn acreage.

USDA estimated Minnesota's 2021 average corn yield at 166 bushels per acre, which would represent a 13 percent decline from the average corn yield of 192 bushels per acre in 2020. The 2021 statewide average corn yield also would also be lower than previous recent statewide corn yields of 173 bushels per acre in 2019, 182 bushels per acre in 2018, and the State record corn yield of 197 bushels per acre in 2017. USDA is projecting Iowa's 2021 average corn yield at 193 bushels per acre, which is well above the final 2020 corn yield of 178 bushels per acre that was greatly reduced by derecho windstorm that swept across Iowa in mid-August of 2020. Other recent Iowa average corn yields include 198 bushels per acre in 2019, 196 bushels per acre in 2018, 202 bushels per acre in 2017, and the current record statewide corn yield of 203 bushels per acre in 2016.

The USDA Report on August 12 estimated total 2020 U.S. soybean production at nearly 4.34 billion bushels, which would be up slightly from the 2019 production level of slightly over 4.13 billion bushels. Other recent U.S. soybean production levels include 3.55 billion bushels in 2019, the record production level of 4.54 billion

bushels in 2018, 4.39 billion bushels in 2017 and 4.3 billion bushels in 2016. USDA is now estimating total 2021 harvested soybean acreage at 86.7 million acres, which compares to 82.3 million acres in 2020.

USDA is projecting the 2021 U.S. average soybean yield at 50 bushels per acre, which is just below the 2020 national average yield of 50.2 bushels per acre. The 2021 estimated soybean yield compares to other recent national average soybean yields of 47.4 bushels per acre in 2019, 51.6 bushels per acre in 2018, 49.1 bushels per acre in 2017, and the record U.S. average soybean yield of 52.1 bushels per acre in 2016.

The USDA report lists nine States that are likely to have a record statewide soybean yield in 2021, again including the important production States of Illinois, Indiana, and Ohio. The estimated 2021 soybean yield in Illinois is 64 bushels per acre, compared to 59 bushels per acre in 2020; Indiana at 60 bushels per acre, compared to 58 bushels per acre in 2020; and Ohio at 58 bushels per acre, compared to 54 bushels per acre in 2020. Nebraska's soybean yield estimate for 2021 is at 60 bushels per acre, compared to 57 bushels per acre in 2020.

States with lower 2021 soybean yield estimates include South Dakota at 39 bushels per acre, compared to 45.5 bushels per acre in 2020; North Dakota at 24 bushels per acre, compared to 33.5 bushels per acre in 2020; and Wisconsin at 49 bushels per acre, compared to 51 bushels per acre in 2020. North Dakota is estimated to have the fourth highest 2021 soybean acreage in the U.S., trailing only Iowa,

Illinois, and Minnesota.

Minnesota's 2021 average soybean yield is estimated at 43 bushels per acre, which compares to 49 bushels per acre in 2020. Other recent statewide soybean yields include 44 bushels per acre in 2019, 48 bushels per acre in 2018, 47 bushels per acre in 2017 and the record State soybean yield of 52.5 bushels per acre in 2016. Iowa is projected to have a 2021 soybean yield of 58 bushels per acre, compared to 53 bushels per acre in 2020, 55 bushels per acre in 2019, 57 bushels per acre in 2018, 56.5 bushels per acre in 2017 and the State record of 60.5 bushels per acre in 2016.

AUGUST 12 WASDE REPORT

The updated USDA World Supply and Demand Estimates (WASDE) Report was also released on August 12. This report included the 2021 estimated U.S. corn production of 14.75 billion bushels and harvested corn acreage of 84.5 million acres, along with the latest USDA corn yield projection of 174.6 bushels per acre. The corn ending stocks for 2020-21 are now estimated at just over 1.11 billion bushels, which was increased by 35 million bushels from the July estimate. The 2021-22 corn ending stocks are now projected at 1.24 billion bushels, which was a decline of 190 million bushels from the July report. The projected corn carryout levels compare to 2019-20 corn ending stocks of 2.23 billion bushels. The projected corn "stocks-to-use" ratio for 2020-21 in the latest WASDE report is only 7.4 percent, which is at the lowest level since 2012-13.

USDA is projecting an average on-farm corn price for the 2021-22

marketing year, which extends from September 1, 2021, through August 31, 2022, at \$5.75 per bushel, which is an increase of \$.15 per bushel from the July estimate. The 2020-21 national average corn price, which will be finalized on September 30, 2021, is now estimated at \$4.40 per bushel. These estimates compare to national average prices of \$3.56 per bushel in 2019-20, \$3.61 per bushel for both 2018-19 and 2015-16 and \$3.36 per bushel in both 2017-18 and 2016-17.

The recent WASDE report used the 2021 U.S. soybean production level of 4.34 billion bushels and included decreases in 2020-21 soybean crush and export levels from previous estimates. The resulting estimated 2020-21 soybean ending stocks are now estimated at 160 million bushels, which up from 135 million bushels in the July WASDE report. The 2021-22 soybean ending stocks are projected at 155 million bushels, which is very similar to the current year estimate. USDA is now projecting an average on-farm soybean price for the 2020-21 marketing year at \$10.90 per bushel and at \$13.70 per bushel for the 2021-22 marketing year. This compares to national average prices of \$8.57 per bushel in 2019-20, \$8.47 per bushel in 2018-19, and \$9.33 in 2017-18.

Auction Buyers are welcome to register for the Auction between 8:00 am and 9:00 am on Friday, August 20. You will have the opportunity to bid on champion and reserve champion general exhibits as well as blue ribbon and higher livestock exhibits. Projects will not be sold at the Auction, only the ribbons.

The 4-H Auction is the culmination of a year of hard work and dedication for more

than 300 4-H members. Through project work, 4-H'ers learn a number of valuable life skills and lessons, including value of good time management skills to meet their goals and responsibilities, the importance of managing their own financial resources and making business decisions, and the value of teamwork, good sportsmanship, and competition. Martin County 4-H currently has about 100 buyers who support the auction. Buyers include individuals, community groups, area businesses, and service clubs and organizations.

General 4-H Exhibitors (Quilting, Wood Shop, Photography, etc.), who have received either a Grand Cham-

pion or Reserve Champion, as well as Livestock Exhibitors, who have received a Grand Champion, Reserve Champion, Purple, or Blue ribbon, are eligible to participate in the 4-H Auction. Exhibits are not sold; rather it is a premium-only auction as the majority of 4-H'ers use their premium money to re-invest in further 4-H projects, and more importantly, to save for furthering their education.

The buyer's premium money not only supports the individual youth, but also the entire Martin County 4-H Program - seventy percent (70%) of the premium will go to the individual youth to re-invest in future 4-H projects as

well as education and thirty percent (30%) will be deducted from each auction entry for the continuation of the 4-H Federation to promote educational activities for all 4-H'ers in Martin County.

When you support 4-H, you are supporting a positive youth development program that teaches youth essential, transferrable skills that they'll use throughout their lives, such as problem solving, decision making, coping, communicating, and responding to the needs of others. Using 4-H's unique learn-by-doing model, youth are able to establish goals and work towards becoming competent, productive citizens. The knowledge

Ask A Trooper: What is the purpose of solid white lines

by Sgt. Troy Christianson,
MN State Patrol

Question: What is the purpose of solid white lines, separating traffic moving in the same direction? Example the ones leading up to the Lowry tunnel in Minneapolis. Does it make it illegal to change lanes?

Answer: Pavement markings direct and regulate traffic. While there are several different types, we will focus on white lines.

White lines separate lanes of traffic traveling in the same direction. A line composed of white dashes indicates that drivers can change lanes in areas where this type of marking is present.

A line of shorter and thicker white dashes indicates that the lane will end.

A solid white line indicates that lane changes are discouraged in areas where this type of marking is present. Solid white lines also mark crosswalks, stop lines at intersections, parking stalls, and the edges of a roadway.

Double solid white lines indicate that lane changes are prohibited in areas where this type of marking is present.

A solid white line with a bicycle insignia along the side of the road indicates an area is designated for bicycle traffic only. Bicycles must travel in the same direction as adjacent traffic.

You can avoid a ticket — and a crash — if you simply buckle up, drive at safe speeds, pay attention and always drive sober. Help us drive Minnesota Toward Zero Deaths.

Tips for dorm room and campus safety

Life on a college campus can be exciting, especially for freshmen enjoying their first taste of life away from home. As exciting as campus life can be, it also can be a bit nervewracking for students who have never before had to fend for themselves.

Administrators and security personnel work to make school environments as safe as possible, but incidents can happen on any campus. A recent report from Campus Safety and Security, there were 38,100 reported criminal offenses, including burglary and identity theft, on college campuses in the United States in 2017.

Students need not live in fear on campus, but embracing various safety measures can make life at school that much safer.

- Hide or lock up valuables. You never know what may catch the eye of a thief. Devices and cash are near the top of lists of most commonly stolen possessions, but a desperate student may steal notes or even expensive textbooks if he or she is struggling. Always close

doors and lock dorm rooms when leaving. Keep valuables out of sight at school. Consider buying a dorm room safe and lock your locker at all times.

- Prepare for emergencies. Research the school's policies on emergency preparedness. Some have text alert systems for emergency situations like adverse weather conditions, while others have clear guidelines on what students should do if they feel threatened in any way. Participate in fire drills and learn the nearest exits and protocols for emergency evacuations.

- Utilize the buddy system. Most campuses are safe to move around, but it can't hurt to schedule certain classes, particularly if they take place after dark, with a friend so you can walk to and from classes together. Security experts say that elevators and stairwells are common places for assailants to target victims. If you ever feel uncomfortable, trust your instincts and err on the side of caution.

- Install window alarms. Many retailers sell battery-operated window alarms that can be adhered to windows. The alarms will activate if the window is opened or the glass breaks. These alarms can provide extra security even if your dorm room isn't on the ground floor.

- Be alert when ridesharing. The safety resource Safety.com says rideshare crimes are on the rise. Always identify your driver and vehicle before getting in and ask the driver to identify your name, as he or she will have it and your destination. Wait for the ride in a safe place, and try to avoid riding alone.

- Maintain personal health. Be sure to visit the doctor and stay current on necessary vaccinations, such as the one for meningococcal disease. The Centers for Disease Control and Prevention says the risk for meningococcal disease in college students is slightly higher than the risk in other teens and young adults who are not attending college. Other communicable diseases can spread more easily on campus as well.

Fairmont Vouncil Reviews 4.9% Prelim Levy for 2022

At a special work session on Monday, Aug. 16, the Fairmont City Council scrutinized the proposed finances for 2022, which resulted in a suggested levy increase of 4.9 percent, or about \$280,000.

In addition, council members suggested finding funding for a gazebo for shade at the soccer fields, a canopy for concessions at the Winnebago Area Sports Complex, lifeguards at Gomsrud Park and the possibility of connecting the trail system at Cedar Creek Park.

The city must submit a preliminary levy to the county by Sept. 30, and that levy can be decreased but not increased before the final budget and levy are approved by Dec. 30. The council will approve its preliminary budget and levy at its Sept. 27 regular meeting.

Paul Hoyer, city finance director, noted that a levy increase does not necessarily equate a property tax increase. He said last year's 6.9 percent levy increase would have had no increase in the city's portion of property taxes, unless there was a change in a property's market value, because of the growth in the city's total tax base.

The general fund budget of \$9.4 million is funded by local government aid from the state, the levy and other miscellaneous revenue sources.

The major changes in the general fund include a 2.75 percent salary increase based on union contracts, a new full-time water resources engineer, reduction of a full-time employee in the building inspection department, contracting for an update in zoning codes and increased costs for automation to improve service to the community.

The council examined the budget needs and requests from the various departments.

The airport is allotted \$50,000 for improvements, \$35,000 of which will come from liquor store funds and be used

to upgrade the terminal building. Council members noted the terminal, which has not been refurbished in many years, is the first impression people see when they fly in on corporate jets.

The council is investing about \$85,000 in data processing equipment to upgrade engineering computers, replace laptops, buy a new copier for city hall and upgrade security cameras on city property.

The largest portion of the general fund budget, the public safety segment, includes upgrades in police vehicles, body cameras and radio equipment, among other things, for about \$79,000.

The fire department will be replacing radios and upgrading bunker gear and regulators, costing about \$79,000. The department also plans to use its charitable gambling proceeds to buy a rescue boat.

The parks department will be spending about \$215,000 on plows, mowers and a garbage truck. Upgrades and repairs at the Aquatic Park will run about \$26,000.

The street department is looking to replace two plow/dump trucks for \$200,000 and buying a self-propelled paving machine and trailer for \$125,000.

The street improvement program budget was set at \$800,000, including replacing the timber bridge on Memorial Drive, a project which should qualify for 80 percent funding from the state.

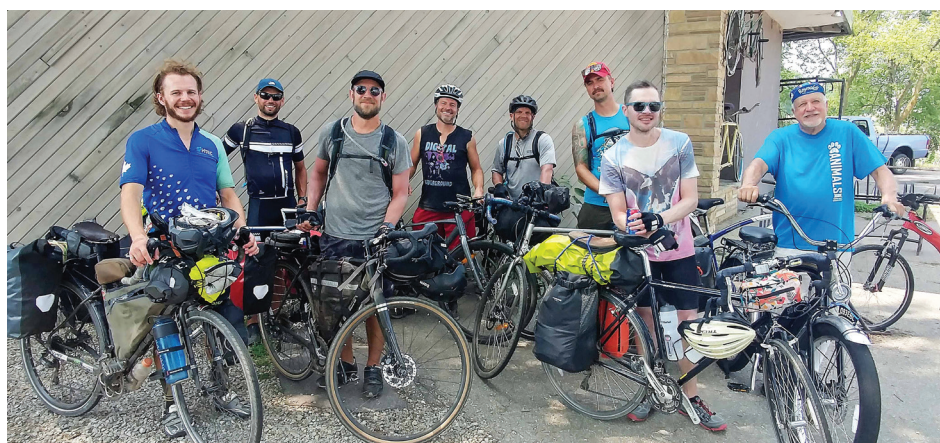
