## Slippers

The other day I picked up fresh tomatoes at the grocery store for our salad. The tomatoes were the best you're going to find this time of year on the north shore – but they were no match for the tomatoes I used to grow in my garden.

I held the overly firm orb in my hand. Having just past the winter solstice, I sang a line from an old Guy Clark song called, Homegrown Tomatoes: "Plant em in the spring, eat 'em in the summer. all winter without 'em's a culinary bummer." So true. Placing them in my basket, I thought they may not taste as good as homegrown, but the bright red tomato wedges against the dark green lettuce will look nice for Christmas dinner.

I often ponder another line from the same song: "Only two things that money can't buy, that's true love and homegrown tomatoes." Again, so true. If you go to a farmer's market in the summer and purchase locally grown tomatoes, they might be farm fresh tomatoes but they are not technically homegrown tomatoes because you didn't grow them. Perhaps I am splitting hairs here, but that's how I feel.

Just before dinner, I called out. "Who all wants tomatoes on their salad?" One by one came the replies; No thank you. None for me. I don't like tomatoes, but thanks anyway. Not one person wanted them. I wasn't going to cut a whole tomato just for my salad - I'll save it for tacos later this week.

After dinner we gath-

ered in the living room to open Christmas presents. I handed my wife the last package; it was a gift for the two of us that would also solve a household issue; annoying shuffling of the feet. (specifically, my

Our floors are all hardwood, so we don't wear shoes in the house. The kitchen and bathroom floors are ceramic tile which can be cold in the winter. We wear house slippers to keep our keep warm. I always tell guests coming to stay with us, "This is a slippers house bring 'em if you want 'em."

I've not found the right slippers for me. The problem is they tend to have hard rubber soles that slap against the floor when I walk. As the tops of new slippers stretch a little and become loose, I find myself dragging my

soles across the floor to keep them from falling off my feet. This creates a shuffling noise that my wife finds more annoving than fingernails being dragged over a chalkboard. Ew!

When I was little, Mom would hand me a few tin cans; a coffee can and a couple of old cookie tins with metal lids. Each was filled with miscellaneous buttons. Mom never threw away a worn-out jacket or article of clothing without first removing the buttons and good, re-usable zippers. "Here, find me a few pairs of matching buttons," she would say as she sat on the couch with her legs pulled up under her and her feet tucked in between the cushions.

Below her on the floor was a wicker basket with balls of yarn in various colors. Mom would carry on a conversation as her hands moved methodically. Strands coming from the basket were wrapped through and around her fingers to feed

the tips of two long knitting needles. Sometimes she would be pulling different colors of yarn from multiple balls at the same time.

I would pour the buttons on the floor to look for matching pairs. "I need buttons with large holes this time." She would say, while knitting away and I started poking through the little plastic discs.

Mom would knit sweaters, scarves, stocking hats and mittens she could knit anything. Some things were one solid color and others were multiple colors with neat patterns and designs. When it was the right size, she'd remove the piece from her knitting needles. She'd thread the eye of a big needle with the same color yarn and start stitching the pieces together. "Hand me those two dark blue buttons." She would say, then fasten them at the front of the foot opening. "Here, try on these slippers." She handed them to me, "Can

you find another big red button like that for me?" She said, while pointing to a button in the pile with her long knitting needle. I put the slippers on my feet and started looking through the pile. Another big red button should be easy to find.

My feet always felt nice and warm in a pair of mom's homemade slippers and I don't ever recall them making any shuffling noises when I walked. If a pair had holes in the toe, Mom would stitch them up. When a pair had holes worn in the heels, we cut the buttons off and put them back in the can. Then we threw the slippers away and Mom would make a new pair.

I did some looking online and smiled when I found hand-knit slippers for sale. I bought dark blue slippers for myself and a pair for Melissa in sage green yarn.

After she opened the package, I immediately put on my new slippers and pranced around the



# 4-H Youth Explore and Learn

4-H youth from across southwest Minnesota took advantage of the variety of 4-H opportunities provided this fall from University of Minnesota Extension Educators. All series were six sessions, offered virtually, building on knowledge for youth to dive deeper into the content area of their choice. This series of programs were offered free of charge and open to all youth.

Fuel Up, Tune Up, Groove Up! was a healthy living program geared towards youth in grades K-3. Each week, the program focused its lessons around the MyPlate model of balanced eating. The program incorporated physical fitness and activity into each of the sessions, as well as learning strategies for tapping into mental well-being through mindfulness practices.

Thirty youth and their families registered for this weekly 30 minute live, engaging lesson, with an average fifteen nected with youth leadparticipants each week.

Youth shared that "because of the \*Vigorous Veggies\* lesson, our family learned to try new things. We would never have tried spinach but in a green smoothie it was good!" Parents of the participants are also raving about the sessions, sharing that because of this program, their children are excited about trying new foods, even if they are hesitant about them at first. Youth are also gaining confidence and knowledge in the kitchen - "Because of the\*Protein Power\* lesson, our family had supper prepared by Ivy. Our family enjoyed the wraps most from the \*Protein Power\* because it was something new and healthy for supper."

Youth members in grades 7+ were given the opportunity to find and nurture the leader within themselves through the Find the Leader In You 4-H leadership program. As they coners across the region,

examined leadership styles and qualities, explored community and service leadership, and spoke with local leaders. A Minnesota 4-H State Ambassador and a service-focused 4-H member shared their insight and experiences in stepping into 4-H leadership and service roles both at the local and state level. The participating youth members ended the series with the understanding that there are many ways to be a leader and an action plan to use their style of leadership in developing a service learning project in their own community.

Animal Science 101, a hands-on and interactive program was developed for youth in seventh grade and above. Youth learned about a variety of topics including reproduction, genetics, animal behavior, nutrition, health, and marketing animals. Highlights from Animal Science 101 include youth constructing their own animal keep the learning going,

participants the participating youth models and diagrams and applying their new knowledge to their own animals.

> Tracks, Scat, & All That series focused on environmental science with youth in grades 4-6. Content experts covered topics such as trees and leaves and why and how they turn colors. While connecting from their participants homes, completed a hands on science experiment using colors of fall. Youth learned more about native grasses, seed harvesting and the habitat our seeds create, animal tracks, and looking for scat of different animals.

> On Halloween, the topic was bats including space for creating bat art. Birds of winter and making our own bird feeders, and conservation efforts centered around turkeys were the next topics youth learned about. Do you know what turkey scat looks like? Did you know hen and tom turkey scat is different shapes? To

youth were encouraged to check out local parks to see what they can find and enjoy all that nature has to offer! Down on the Farm youth discovered the wonderful world of animal science through hands on-activities, educational lessons and guest speakers. Youth in grades K-3 focused primarily on sheep, goat, poultry, swine, beef, horse and dairy. Participants explored the hatching process, the differences between sheep and goats, and what food products come from dairy cows. In the image below, Katie shows off her "cow ration" mix she created at home during the beef lesson. Each trail mix ingredient represented a feed ingredient. #### Investment **Lessons from** 2020

As the year draws to a close, it's fair to say that we've all learned something about the social, political, physical and environmental forces that have affected everyone. And, in some ways, our lives will be changed, perhaps permanently. But as an investor, what lessons can you learn from 2020?

Here are some to consider:

The ahead. Here's something many investors discovered in 2020: Investment prices don't always move in the same direction as the overall economy. This might not have seemed apparent right after the COVID-19 pandemic struck in mid-February, as the overall economy and the stock market took big hits. But just about five weeks later, the markets began a rally that lasted several months. During this time, the economy also recovered

> What can explain this discrepancy between the markets and economic activity? Essentially, economic numbers, such as the unemployment rate and gross domestic product (GDP), reflect what's happening today, but the markets are always looking toward tomorrow, which means they are anticipating a stronger economic recovery and the results that come with it, such as greater corporate

earnings in 2021. No one can say for sure what the future holds, but you can usually know the market's opinion by its performance.

•Opportunities will always exist for investors. Although the coronavirus seems unprecedented, the equity markets have rebounded from many crises before it. From war to global financial meltdowns, the market has seen it all. But even at the height of these events, when the markets might be most affected, individual segments or industries can do well.

For example, in the current environment, when many people have been forced to work and shop from home, and get their entertainment online, it's probably not surprising that some parts of the technology sector have seen their economic activity grow, along with their stock prices. Here's the key point: Investment opportunities always exist, especially in times of market stress - and smart investors will find them and incorporate them into their portfolios in a way that's appropriate for their goals and risk tolerance.

•Patience and discipline can pay dividends. As mentioned above, the stock market dropped sharply in the weeks immediately following the pandemic, but then gained steadily for months afterward. Investors who tried to "cut losses" and exited the market likely did so at the wrong time and missed out on the beginning of the upturn. Unfortunately, this is not uncommon – investors who overreact to market declines often find themselves on the investment sidelines just when a new rally begins. Rather than being reactive in this way, you may be better off sticking with a long-term investment strategy, and buying and selling investments only when it makes sense for your situation, such as when you need to diversify your portfolio.

For many reasons, it's unlikely that we'll see anything exactly like 2020 again. But some of the investment lessons we learned are applicable in every year - so keep them in mind for 2021 and beyond.
