Nature by the yard

Robins, while not noted for being seed eaters, were eating sunflower hearts that had fallen to the ground. They were worm replacers.

I enjoy seeing a song sparrow, a lovely presentation of a bird. Every garden has one. A garden gets two for the price of one, both the song sparrow and its song. They breed in all of Minnesota and Iowa, and are found in every state except Hawaii.

The song sparrows and fox sparrows sang in every kind of weather my yard challenged them with. The thaw/snowstorm cycle didn't slow them much. Fox sparrows breed in remote areas that don't include Minnesota or Iowa. Fox sparrows appear stockier and generally have a brighter coloration than song sparrows. A fox sparrow's breast has rusty brown, blurry streaks and a song sparrow's breast has coarse brown streaks that converge into a central spot.

Red means to stop and look when it's at an intersection or on a cardinal. Both the male and female redbirds are a picture of sartorial perfection.

Missing meadowlarks

Every week, I hear several people mention that they miss seeing meadowlarks.

I recall the days when the world paused while we all gathered and watched "The Wizard of Oz" on TV. One of my parents' favorite publications was "Capper's Weekly" published in Topeka, Kansas.

In March, I birded at Perry Lake, not far from Topeka, and along the Kansas River. Natural lakes are rare in Kansas and are smaller than the state's reservoirs. Its largest natural lake is Lake Inman in central Kansas, covering about 160 acres of private property. In comparison, the largest reservoir, Milford covers 15,709 acres. It is one of 24 public reservoirs built by the U.S. Army Corps of Engineers and the U.S. Bureau of Reclamation to be used for flood control, mu-

nicipal and industrial water supplies, irrigation, and recreation. More than 120,000 lakes and ponds in Kansas are impoundments—created with artificial barriers, such as dams and dikes. Most are small, private farm ponds less than an acre in size.

I saw meadowlarks there. Western meadowlarks are found in Kansas year-round.

The decline in the population of this lovely prairie crooner is likely due to the conversion of grassland habitat to other uses, pesticide use, habitat degradation due to invasive plants, and fire suppression.

Q-and-A

"How long can a wren live?" House wrens can live as long as nine years. It has one of the largest ranges of any songbird in the New World. It breeds from Canada southward to the southernmost point of South America. A house wren weighs about the same as two quarters.

"Do mink climb trees?" They are capable of climbing trees and occasionally do so, but they aren't normally arboreal.

Grove asked if any hawks other than northern harriers nest on the ground. I'm excluding nests on cliffs in this answer. There have been reports of Swainson's hawks nesting on the ground, but that is rare. Some other ground-nesting birds have eggs that are pear-shaped and pointed, so they roll in a circle rather than away when bumped.

"When do hummingbirds return to Minnesota?" I figure on early May for their return. Ruby-throated hummingbird males arrive first. Hummingbird migration follows the flowering of key plants. Recent studies have shown that hummers follow the migration of the yellow-bellied sapsuckers. The sapsuckers drill holes in the trees and the

hummingbirds lick the sap and eat insects trapped in it. Only the adult male has the full, red gorget that gives the ruby-throated hummingbird its name. The gorget derives from the name for a piece of armor protecting the throat or an ornamental collar.

Who was Lenny Burton?

Lenny Burton, one of the more colorful characters in local history, was of the impression he led a futile life. He arrived by traveling many miles from a castle on the Rhine to a log cabin in Martin County. Once known as Lionel V. Archer-Burton, descendant of an ancient British family and a black sheep of his other relatives, he would eventually become Register of Deeds in Martin County and a prominent citizen of this area.

His parents were British aristocrats that lived in Germany. His father was a high sheriff of Hampshire in 1847, and his Uncle James was killed in the charge of the Light Brigade, made famous

by Tennyson. His lineage also traces back to Robert Bruce, King of Scotland, and Robert South, a famous English theologian who served as chaplain to King Charles II.

He spent his infancy in Coblenz on the Rhine while his older brothers and sisters were living in England in the family home there. His childhood home was Castle Lehnneck on the Rhine.

At age twelve, he was sent by his parents to Baden-Baden to attend a school where cadets for the German Army were trained. While there, he was a schoolmate of William Hohenzollern, later to be known as Kaiser Wilhelm of Germany.

Lenny found school difficult, and consequently as a result of his lack of success he decided to join the Navy. However, upon returning to England for a visit, he became so seasick aboard ship that then

decided the Navy was no longer a viable option for him.

Lenny had a tendency to spend time playing with the "ragamuffins" in the streets of Coblenz. That, coupled with his failures in school, led his parents to send him off to the new world at the age of fifteen to join his two brothers that had gone before him. Even at that young age, he made the journey alone.

Burton sailed from Liverpool about the same time a British sea captain, Frederick Wherland, left with his young daughter and six sons. Wherland and his family would also settle in Martin County.

When Lenny arrived in Fairmont, he described it as a tiny town of fewer than 100 inhabitants. He portrayed it as a few old shacks, three feet of mud and billions of flies and mosquitoes. But, the first thing he heard about was

the arrival of the sea captain with the most beautiful daughter any of the settlers had seen. Ironically, Lenny and the Captain's daughter would eventually marry.

Upon his arrival in the 1870s, and in spite of the grasshopper plague, he joined his brothers and began buying land. As a result, at the young age of sixteen, he was a big landowner in spite of knowing virtually nothing about farming or livestock. Eventually, of the 400 Englishmen that had originally settled in the area since 1873, nearly all had left, including his brothers. However, Lenny remained, partly as a result of his marriage to Sally Wherland, the daughter of the English sea captain, Frederick Wherland.

Lenny Burton and Sally Wherland began their

a somewhat scary proposition for both Lenny and Sally.

The Burtons went on to farming together and rode horse back to town as they had no wagon. At the outset, Lenny felt very positive about his situation and was truly in love with his beautiful bride.

However, being young and inexperienced, they were frequently taken advantage of by more experienced settlers. Lenny started out with three farms and ended up going broke, owning no land, and having five children to support. He went on to try horse trading and fur trapping, but only acquired

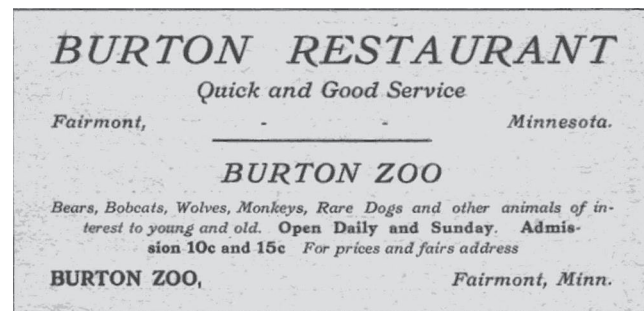
the reputation of being a good loser.

The Burtons returned to England in 1883, but the call of the west still burned within him. Consequently, he returned to Minnesota again at the age of twenty-three. However, the money he inherited from his family was quickly gone causing him to work at anything available. This included showing animals at the fair, raising chickens, and keeping a zoo known as The Burton Zoo located on the west bank of George Lake.

In 1909 he filed for the office of Register of Deeds for the first time. Although never conducting any actual campaigning, he continually sought the office for eighteen years. He was finally elected in 1927 by a large majority of the voters and was probably best known in his later years for this position.

Upon his death in 1937 at the age of 76, Burton was remembered as being a valued, beloved, and respected citizen of Martin County. Yet, on Lenny Burton's letterhead is inscribed the following: "A Life Wasted."

I recently made these bars for the Lakeview Methodist home coffee shop. A new recipe that I hadn't tried before. When I was there recently, one of the employees approached to tell me that she like them better than the routine lemon bars that have powdered sugar sprinkled on top, so I am sharing the recipe for you so you can try them too!

Lemon Curd Bars
1 cup butter
1 cup sugar
2 cups flour
1/2 tsp. Baking powder
1 10-12 oz. jar lemon curd
2/3 cup flaked coconut
1/2 cup sliced or slivered almonds

Beat butter 30 seconds. Add sugar and beat until combined. Add flour and baking powder. Beat until just combined and it resembles coarse crumbs. Reserve 2/3 cup crumbs. Press remaining crumbs into the bottom of a greased 9x13 inch pan. Bake at 375 degrees 5-8 inches until golden. Spread curd over crust to within 1/2 inch of edges. Mix reserved crumbs with coconut and almonds. Sprinkle over lemon curd. Bake 18-20 minutes until golden and topping light browned. Store in refrigerator. If you haven't bought lemon curd before, you can find it by the jam and jelly in the store.

Ask A Trooper: Rolling stops

Question: I do a lot of local driving for work, and every day I see an abundance of vehicles that roll through stops. This happens most frequently in a "right on red" situation. I have seen many near misses by vehicles rolling through a "right on red". I was just wondering what our State law requires of us to do at stop signs/red lights.

Answer: According to the Minnesota Driver's Manual, when approaching a red light (solid or flashing) or a stop sign, motorists must come to a complete stop prior to reaching the nearest marked white line.

Minnesota law allows motorists to make a right turn on a red light after making a complete stop, unless there's a sign indicating the turn is prohibited. Drivers must use caution and follow right-of-way rules.

Motorcyclists and bicyclists can proceed with caution through a red light after making a complete stop, if:

- The signal continued to show red for an "unreasonable time".
- The signal apparently malfunctioned or failed to detect the bicycle or motorcycle.
- No vehicle or pedestrian was approaching or close enough so as to make going through the red signal dangerous.

Failing to come to a complete stop at a stop sign or a red light can result in a fine of \$300 or more.

You can avoid a ticket — and a crash — if you simply buckle up, drive at safe speeds, pay attention and always drive sober. Help us drive Minnesota Toward Zero Deaths.

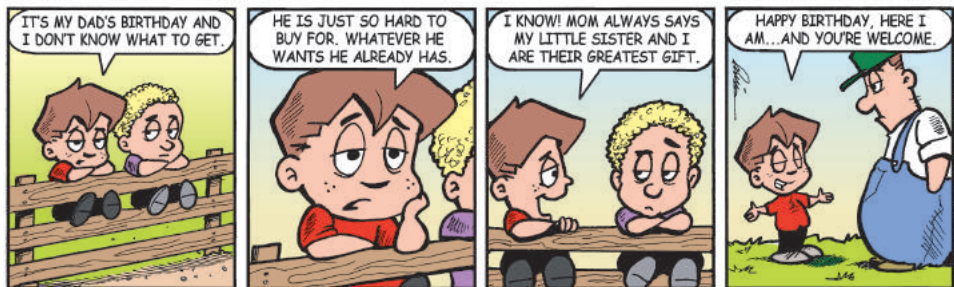

Navy and see the world. However, he got as far as Puget Sound and spent his four years (1907 - 1911) there in peacetime. **MAYNARD NELSON** (Trimont's own original 'Music Man') - served during WWII aboard a troop carrier in the Pacific. He took part in some of the landings at Iwo Jima and elsewhere. The ship was often in need of repair. Once when his ship was in Hawaii for repairs, Dr. Lowell Carlson (Trimont's dentist) was stationed there. They spent time talking about the good old days of Trimont, of course. It was rumored at the time that wherever Maynard was stationed - ship or shore - he would organize a band with

whatever instruments available and whoever wanted to play them. **DONAVAN AMMANN** served four years in the Navy - all four years aboard the USS Hancock, during the Korean War. **BERNARD SEMANKO** enlisted in the Navy - his four years were spent at Norfolk, Virginia, during the Korean War. **JOHN EKSTADT** enlisted in the Navy - his four years were spent on the USS Curtiss - based in San Diego - and was at Eniwetok for atomic and hydrogen bomb testing in 1953. **CLIFFORD JUNKER** enlisted in the Navy - he was also at Eniwetok at the same time as John Ekstadt was - he was on the same ship at that time with Dick Pope.

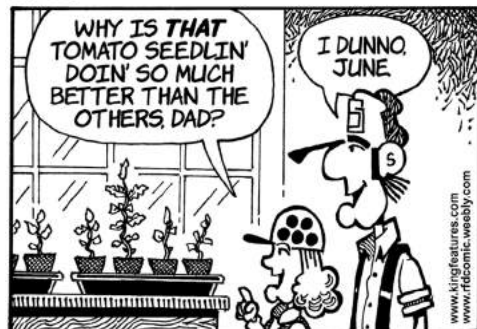

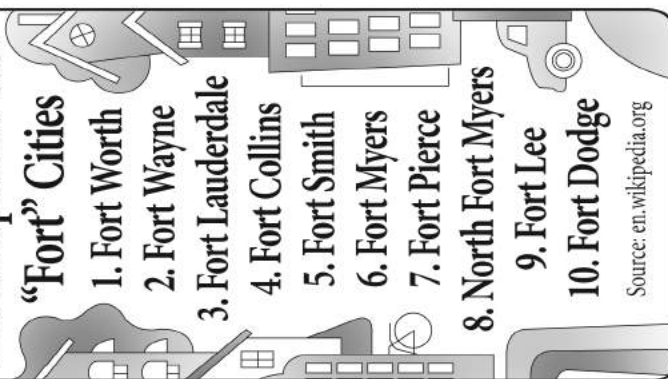
