





Tacos De Matamoros

We enjoy eating tacos and taco salad occasionally. It's an easy meal and now with fresh tomatoes they taste especially good! I have always wondered how restaurants manage to get their meat to be such a fine texture. I came upon at recipe that has the texture and flavor of authentic taco meat. It makes a large amount so I freeze some. This recipe takes time to prepare but it's well worth it. I like the seasoning so much better than the packaged taco seasoning!

Tacos De Matamoros:

- 2 pounds lean hamburger
- 2 Tbsp chili powder
- 2 Tbsp paprika
- 1 1/2 tsp cumin 1 tsp salt
- 1/2 tsp garlic powder
- 2 cloves garlic, chopped
- 1/2 medium green bell pepper, chopped
- 1/2 medium onion. chopped
- 1 large container chicken broth, 2 bay leaves
- 12 (6 inch) corn tortillas, warmed
- 12 oz. queso asadero cheese, crumbled
- (or use shredded cheese of your choice)
- sour cream 1 large tomato, diced

shredded lettuce

Put hamburger in a large skillet and stir in chili powder, paprika, cumin, garlic powder, garlic, onion and green pepper. Pour enough chicken broth (you can use water) to cover beef; add bay leaves then bring to boil. Reduce heat to low and simmer $1\ 1/2$ hours. Add more water as necessary to keep meat covered as it cooks; stir and break up meat frequently until it's very fine. Drain, reserving juice. Skim fat off of juice and mix 5 Tbsp of the juice back into the meat, return meat mixture to stove and heat until warm again. Warm tortillas: wrap in paper towels and heat in mircrowave or wrap in foil and warm in oven until they are heated through. Serve beef on the tortillas, garnish with the cheese, sour cream, tomato and lettuce.





HOBO PARK & HOBO TRAIL

If you enjoy the parks in the Fairmont area, we invite you to visit the "Hobo Park" and the "Hobo Trail." To get there, go west on Lake Street until you get to the Heritage Acres driveway and turn right after you leave Lake Street. You will see, just on the Sisseton Lake side of the "Prairie Dog" exhibit provided by the Fairmont Exchange Club, a sign with a map on it of the Hobo Park and Hobo Trail.

The Trail winds under Lake Street towards a floating bridge, which includes an outset fishing area, past a replica of a "hobo camp" and onto a graveled pathway. The Trail will lead you in a circular path through a nature area and come back to a bench on which to rest before you return under the bridge and back to the parking lot.

The camp was conveniently located on a major Westbound Rail Line and may have sheltered over ten thousand persons who "rode the rails" looking for work during the 1920's, 1930's and on into the 1950's, according to the information posted on the sign at the entrance of the Hobo Trail.

The whole trail project was greatly promoted by former Early Riser member Donald Milbrandt and another sign posted reflects the degree to which he was able to gain both political and economic support for the project.

Hobo Park is also one of the parks in Fairmont which are a part of the Early Riser Kiwanis "Adopt-A-Park project. You are invited to take the walk and enjoy one of the many amenities offered in Fairmont!


Shorty Schmidtke Memorial Premier Showmanship Award


