Glucosamine and Chondroitin

You went to your doctor because of that nagging pain in your (fill in the blank, keep it clean). It has been there since you injured it working or playing softball or trying the Electric Slide at age 50. It just wasn't getting any better so you went to get it checked out. Your doctor told you it is just arthritis, learn to live with it. They may have even advised you to take some anti-inflammatories to make it feel better. But it is still there, and you know that long term use of anti-inflammatories can be dangerous for your liver and kidneys so you are looking for something else. A friend mentioned glucosamine and/or chondroitin and you asked them to please speak English.

Just what are these two words, and do they really help arthritis? Glucosamine and chondroitin are two supplements that have been shown in repeated studies to be very beneficial in arthritis, and not just for pain relief. 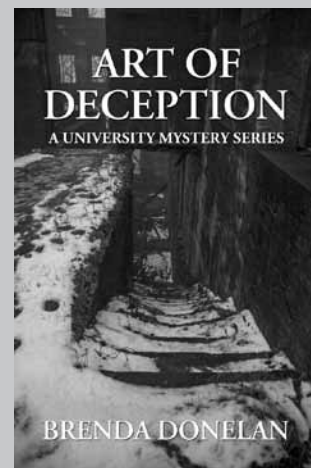

Zucchini Bacon Quiche

Prolific garden produce

This is the time of year many of us are trying new ways to fix zucchini, that summer veggie that just can't stop producing. After all, we can only bake so many loaves of zucchini bread! We generally think of quiche as a breakfast dish but I can eat it either as a side dish or main dish.

I've had this recipe in my file for a long time and don't remember where I got it. I may have copied it from a magazine. I prefer using small size zucchini for this recipe and I don't peel them.

Zucchini Bacon Quiche:

- 1 tube refrigerator crescent rolls
- 2 tsp prepared mustard
- 6 strips bacon, diced
- 3 cups thinly sliced zucchini
- 1 medium onion chopped
- 2 eggs beaten
- 1 cup cream or half and half
- 2 cups shredded mozzarella cheese (8 oz. or cheese of your choice. I like Swiss)
- 2 Tbsp dried parsley
- 1/2 tsp pepper
- 1/4 tsp garlic powder
- 1/4 tsp oregano
- 1/4 tsp dried basil

Separate crescent dough into 8 triangles; place in a greased 10 inch pie pan with points toward center. Press perforations together and spread with the prepared mustard.

Fry bacon until crisp, drain on paper towels, discard all but 2 tablespoons of the bacon grease, sauté zucchini and onion in remaining grease until tender.

Sprinkle cheese over crust then top with the zucchini, onion and bacon. Beat eggs and cream, stir in seasonings and pour over zucchini. Top with chopped parsley.

Bake at 375 degrees for 25-30 minutes or until knife inserted in center comes out clean. Cover edge of crust loosely with foil if brown too quickly. Let set for 5 minutes before cutting in wedges.

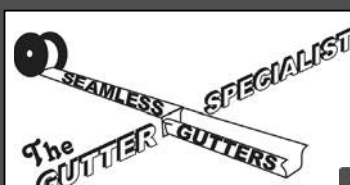

Nature by the yard

It was a cloudy, early morning. I listened to the sounds of snowy tree crickets finishing their nightly concert. Nathaniel Hawthorne described their calls as audible stillness and declared, "If moonlight could be heard, it would sound just like that."

Dew forms when a cool, clear night follows a warm, clear day. Folklore says, "When dew is on the grass, rain will never come to pass." Dew on the grass usually means that the sky is clear. Clear skies welcome a sunny day without rain.

There was little dew, but I looked for webs resembling tiny trampolines on the lawn. After a dew, lawn and groundcovers are magically covered with shiny webs. It's not the work of the web fairy, but the funnel weaver spider, also known as grass spider or funnel-web weaver, a brownish or grayish spider as long as an inch with hairy legs and body. Unlike many spider webs, this one doesn't have a sticky surface. The spider relies on vibrations to indicate trespassing and rushes from its hiding place to capture prey. It's a beneficial spider that helps control insect pests. Its webbed mosaics are lovely.

Q-and-A

Arlene Hobbiebrunken of Albert Lea asked why a cardinal fights with a window. The window acts as a mirror. Cardinals are territorial and instinctively attack any other cardinal in its breeding territory. The cardinal makes an enemy of its own image.

"Where are the birds?" In the dog days of summer, birds seem to disappear. The dawn chorus wanes, but the birds are still there. They keep low profiles, because molting begins

when breeding ends. Molt is the systematic replacement of feathers. All birds molt because feathers wear out. During a molt, birds are vulnerable, so they vocalize infrequently and hide in vegetation. Some birds have begun migrating and others are moving to winter territories. A feeder might be overwhelmed with birds one week and empty the next. Predators such as hawks or cats can deter

birds from bird feeders.

Lona Falencykowski of Mankato sent photos of fuzzy things on oak leaves and asked for identification. Woolly oak galls are found primarily on white oaks. They are reddish, whitish or a combination. Despite their appearance, the growths aren't a disease, but abnormal plant tissue caused by the feeding of the larvae of tiny non-stinging insects called cynipid wasps. These common galls have little or no impact on tree health, especially on vigorous, mature oaks. Gall numbers vary annually.

"How much land do honey bees need?" Conventional wisdom suggests that a colony of honey bees needs one acre of blossoming flowers, trees and shrubs. The amount varies with the habitat and quality. How big is an acre? It's a football field minus the end zones. Studies have shown that honey bees readily fly 2 miles and will travel as far

as 6 miles to visit a nectar source.

"Why do birds take dust baths?" A dust bath removes dirt and parasites (mites and lice) from feathers. It's like us rubbing our hands with sand to remove grime.

"I saw an orangish-yellow house finch. Is that rare?" Male house finches generally have red in their feathers. The amount of red the male has can vary depending on the amount of carotenoid pigments he eats during his molt. This could result in red, orange and yellow colors. Carotenoids are found in foods that are deep green, yellow, orange or red. Feather coloration is an important to females choosing mates because brighter finches usually have better foraging ability, better health, more testosterone and fewer parasites.

"How could I discourage groundhogs?" Fences around gardens should be made of heavy-grade chicken wire at least 3 feet high and 12 inches below ground. Try hot pepper spray, dried blood, talcum powder, predator urine or a commercial repellent. These things need to be reapplied after a rain or heavy dew. A friend had good luck using lavender oil to repel rabbits. Maybe it works on groundhogs. Fill burrow entrances and block any access to those holes. Live-trap woodchucks while abiding by the law. Fresh carrots, apples or lettuce work as bait. Check the traps at least once a day and release animals within 24 hours of capture. If all else fails, hire a badger.

Sheriff's Scholarship Program announced

Martin County Sheriff Jeff Markquart announced the commencement of the Law Enforcement Scholarship Program for 2016. Sheriff Markquart said that the Minnesota Sheriff's Association (MSA) Board of Directors has established a scholarship fund for the awarding of up to 15 \$600 scholarships this year. The scholarships are due to the coordinated efforts of the 87 sheriffs in the State of Minnesota.

The members of MSA gives special recognition to the financial needs of students attending the peace officer skills course, or one of the two or four year law enforcement degree colleges. The Scholarship Committee, in making its selection of awards, intends on achieving representation from all geographical areas of the state. Scholarship awards will be announced by December 30th of the same year. Application forms and a statement of procedures are available at the Martin County Sheriff's office. Scholarships are only available to students currently enrolled in one of the following three categories:

1. Mandated POST Skills Program
2. In their second year of a two-year law enforcement program
3. In their third or fourth year of a four year college criminal justice program.

In order to qualify, students must have completed at least one year of the two year program or two years of a four year program. Students meeting these criteria are invited to obtain a scholarship application form from their local sheriff's office or online at www.mnsheriffs.org.

At our office, the summer is a time to plan, train, revise materials, and to prepare etc. Committees are on hiatus. We're grateful for the opportunity to get ready for busier times. As the fall approaches, momentum picks up and we stare into a rather daunting mass of events, programs and activities. A flurry of items came to mind as I considered this month's article. Since I couldn't select one idea or even pare down to focus on a couple that could be neatly segued, this column is mishmash... a potpourri.

While reviewing long and short term member benefits. I came across this factoid that shows that Chambers of Commerce have a dramatic effect on how the consumer views businesses: A national survey of 2,000 adults reveals that being active in a local chamber of commerce is an effective business strategy because two-thirds of consumers believe that such companies use good business practices, are reputable, care about their customers, and are involved in the community.

The education committee of the Chamber, Bureau 14 meets the 2nd Wednesday of each month from September through May. The first of the season will be 6 p.m. September 14th at Interlaken Golf Club. Martin County Area Foundation will talk about their 25th anniversary and plans to fund even more projects in the future. Members will want to set aside time to attend

Bureau 14 on October 12th to be held at Holiday Inn. Attendees will hear perspectives from the city, chamber board and Project 1590 concerning the sales tax referendum. The Chamber Board of Directors voted to support the referendum. The official statement reads: "The Board of Directors of the Fairmont Area Chamber of Commerce unanimously supports a half-cent sales tax in the City of Fairmont that could fund recreational amenities, trails and a Regional Wellness Center/Fairmont Community Center. We feel that the tax will support local and potential business by assisting to create more excellent quality of life options in which to work, live and raise families." Keep in mind that this tax is applied to purchases made in the city of Fairmont and does NOT affect property taxes.

Candidate Forums to be held in October support businesses. These dates are not yet set but we will keep you informed through local television, this publication and social media.

Lack of qualified workforce, healthcare affordability/timely accessibility and a shortage of affordable housing are top business challenges throughout the country and Martin County. Annually, board and staff come together to create strategies that align with concerns of our business community. The activities this fall are indicative those strategies. That being noted, it takes

dozens of volunteers to carry out our mission.

Four happenings to occur in the next few months address education.

The Teachers Banquet will welcome new teachers and honor those who have served for 25 years. This also addresses the need to connect new residents/employees to the community. We ask businesses to sponsor a teacher's dinner and sit with them during the event. The banquet is slated to be held at 6:00 pm October 25th at Holiday Inn.

We will give more information about the Digital Responsibility Seminars. They will be at Fairmont High School's Performing Arts Center on October 17th and 18th. Speaker Jerry Ackermann will seek to inform students, parents and community members about the consequences of your online presence and that of those in your families and workplaces. We will have more details soon.

The Chamber is the community's coordinator with Junior Achievement. The program focuses on teaching business skills to those in grades kindergarten through 6th grades. More than 35 volunteers devote 5 hours to teach in 55 classrooms each year. This would be a great volunteer opportunity for anyone who has limited hours to contribute.

Eighteen participants have enrolled in Leader-

ship Martin County, a program that highlights government, education, economic development, healthcare, safety, culture and quality of life. Professional and personal strengths are defined and then related to community themes. Participants will attend day-long classes September through May.

My very favorite part of working in the community

is that entities and organizations come together to accomplish what would otherwise be impossible. In that light, I am honored to serve on the city's Planning Commission. This position allows me to be informed about our local housing environment. The local economic environment has motivated city, schools and local business to create new housing units.

I could go on... This time of year is almost overwhelming because the next few months hold so many events. When I look at my calendar between now and December, it is easy to become overwhelmed. I remind myself and my staff of the age-old adage: "How do you eat an elephant? One bite at a time."

Ask A Trooper: Drunk Driving Law

Question: How long has there been a drunk driving law in Minnesota?

Answer: The Minnesota Legislature criminalized DWI in 1911, making "driving while in an intoxicated manner" a misdemeanor. The laws and sanctions addressing DWI have evolved in the past 104 years.

- Evidence of influence was set at .15 Blood Alcohol Concentration (BAC) in 1917.

- The first civil sanctions for DWI (Implied Consent) began in 1961.

- A per se level of .10 BAC was attached to administrative license sanctions in 1971 (MN was the first state to take such action).

- The concept of BAC changed to Alcohol Concentration (AC) in 1978.

- License plate impoundment began in 1988.

- Test refusal becomes a criminal offense in 1989.

- Child Endangerment enhancement and 'Not a Drop' law enacted in 1993.

- High AC (.20+) added as an enhancement in 1997.

- Felony level penalties established in 2001.

- Per se level lowered to .08 AC in 2004.

- Ignition Interlock

added in 2010.

- A gross misdemeanor DWI driving offense was lowered to an alcohol concentration of .16 from a .20 in 2015 for first time offenders.

Minnesota's enhanced DWI enforcement and education efforts are contributing to the reduction of alcohol-related deaths. Drunk driving-related fatalities have decreased by 25 percent in the past five years (2010 - 2014), yet with 88 deaths caused by drunk drivers in 2014, there is much more work to be done.

We are encouraged

by the continued drop in DWIs, but the 25,258 motorists arrested for DWI last year is unacceptable. Currently, more than 600,000 Minnesota residents have a DWI on record — that's one out of every seven licensed drivers in Minnesota.

The average blood alcohol concentration (BAC) for drivers with a DWI was .15, with the average BAC for a drunk driver involved in a fatal crash being .19.

The legal limit for driving impaired in Minnesota is 0.08 — but motorists can be arrested for DWI at lower levels. A typical

penalty for a first-time offender is loss of license for a minimum of 30 days up to a year and possible jail time, although the consequences will vary for each offender. DWI costs can be as high as \$20,000 when factoring court costs, legal fees and increased insurance premiums.

You can avoid a ticket — and a crash — if you simply buckle up, drive at safe speeds, pay attention and always drive sober. Help us drive Minnesota Toward Zero Deaths.

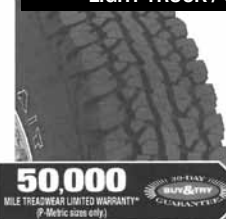

Don't Let Your Car Make Your Allergies Worse

(NAPS)—You don't have to let the joys of warm weather driving be diminished by the irritating pollen and pollutants that can be drawn inside through your car's air-conditioning and ventilation systems.

Cabin air filters clean the incoming air, removing allergens, as long as they're replaced regularly.

"A dirty or clogged cabin air filter can cause contaminants to become so concentrated in the cabin that passengers actually breathe in more fumes and particles when riding in the car than when walking down the street," explained Rich White, executive director, Car Care Council. "Replacing the cabin air filter is a simple way for you and your passengers to breathe easier while driving."

In addition to trapping pollen, bacteria, dust and exhaust gases, the cabin air filter prevents leaves, bugs and other debris from entering the

heating, ventilating and air-conditioning (HVAC) system. A restricted cabin air filter can mean musty odors in the vehicle and impair airflow in the HVAC system, possibly causing interior heating and cooling problems. Over time, the heater and air conditioner may also become damaged by corrosion.

Cabin air filters should not be cleaned and re-installed. Instead, they should be replaced every 12,000 to 15,000 miles, or per the owner's manual. Most filters are accessible through a panel in the HVAC housing, which may be under the hood or in the interior of the car. An automotive service technician can locate the cabin filter and replace it according to the vehicle's owner manual. Some filters require basic hand tools to remove and install their replacement while

others just need your hands.

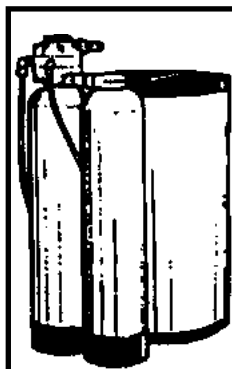

2015 corn ARC-CO payments likely in many counties

Most crop producers in the Upper Midwest are enrolled in the county yield-based Ag Risk Coverage (ARC-CO) farm program choice on their corn and soybean base acres for the 2014 to 2018 crop years. Given the current decrease in the corn and soybean market prices in the past couple of months, many farm operators and lenders are now wondering what impact that may have on potential 2015 ARC-CO payments, which are scheduled to be paid in October, 2016.

For the 2015 corn and soybean crop, producers that had very high corn and soybean yields in 2015, relative to their benchmark yields, were likely already projected to get zero or very little 2015 ARC-CO payment. Producers that had 2015 corn or soybean yields that were very near or below the 2015 benchmark yields will still likely get the maximum, or close to the maximum, 2015 ARC-CO payment. However, producers that had 2015 corn and soybean yields higher than the benchmark yields, but were still scheduled to receive a 2015 ARC-CO payment, will likely see their ARC-CO payments increased from estimates earlier this Summer.

Based on the August 1st, 2016 estimates, many counties in Southern and Western Minnesota, as well as in Northern Iowa and the Eastern Dakota's, are likely to receive an estimated 2015 corn ARC-CO payment of \$20 to \$80 per base acre. Some counties that were originally scheduled to receive a zero 2015 ARC-CO payment, as of June 1st, will now receive an estimated payment of less than \$20 per base acre. There are still several counties scattered across the Upper Midwest that will likely receive zero 2015 ARC-CO payment, due to a very high 2015 corn yield, relative to the 2015 county benchmark yield.

Only a small percentage of counties in the Upper Midwest are scheduled to receive a 2015 soybean ARC-CO payment, based on the August 1st estimates, due to the very strong actual soybean yields in 2015 in many areas. For the counties that are scheduled to receive a 2015 soybean payment, the 2015 ARC-CO payment estimates have been increased by a few dollars per base acre in most counties, due to projected decrease in the MYA price since the June 1st estimate.

The 2015 Market Year Average (MYA) prices for corn and soybeans are the U.S. average prices from September 1st, 2015 to August 31st, 2016, with the MYA prices being finalized on September 30th, 2016. As of August 1st, 2016, the estimated 2015 MYA prices are \$3.60 per bushel for corn, and \$8.95 per bushel for soybeans, which represents a decrease of \$.10 per bushel for both corn and soybeans from the MYA estimates on June 1st, 2016. This adjustment in the projected MYA prices will positively affect the estimated 2015 corn and soybean ARC-CO payments in many counties across the U.S. The lower corn MYA price also means that there could potentially be a small payment in October for producers that have their corn base acres enrolled in the "Price Loss Coverage" (PLC) farm program option for the 2014-2018 crop years.

USDA updates the average MYA price estimates for a given marketing year on a monthly basis in the USDA Supply and Demand (WADSE) Report, which is usually released around the middle of each month, and provides a pretty good price estimate for potential ARC-CO payments. USDA also publishes monthly and season-average estimated market prices for various commodities, which are available on the FSA farm program web site at : <http://www.ers.usda.gov/data-products/season-average-price-forecasts.aspx>. Some Universities also update projected MYA prices on a monthly basis for selected crops. Kansas State University offers one of the best monthly updates of MYA prices for corn, soybeans, and wheat. The web site is: www.agmanager.info/crops/insurance/risk_mgt

The County benchmark (BM) revenue for a given crop is the County BM yield times the BM price for the year, which is the same BM price that is used throughout the U.S. The benchmark (BM) prices for corn and soybeans for the 2015 crop year remained the same as 2014 BM prices, which are \$5.29 per bushel for corn and \$12.27 per bushel for soybeans. The BM prices are adjusted each year, using the USDA market-year average (MYA) price for the preceding five years, then dropping the high and low MYA price, and averaging the other three MYA prices.

The 2015 benchmark (BM) County yield for a given crop was calculated by taking the average County yields for the previous five years (2010-2014), dropping the high and low yield, and the averaging the other three yields. The BM corn yields in most Minnesota counties declined in 2015, with many counties in South Central, Southwest, and Central Minnesota having declines of 8-12 bushels per acre from 2014 to 2015. The relationship between the final 2015 County yield and the 2015 County benchmark (BM) yields is extremely important in calculating potential 2015 ARC-CO payments for corn and soybeans.

The USDA National Agricultural Statistics Service (NASS) released the 2015 estimated average County yields for corn, soybeans, and other crops in late Winter, which can be used to estimate potential 2015 ARC-CO payments. The NASS yields may be adjusted slightly downward by USDA to arrive at the final 2015 BM yields and County FSA yields, which are used to calculate the 2015 ARC-CO payments. The 2015 NASS County yields are available on the NASS web site at : <http://www.nass.usda.gov/>.

There will likely be a large difference in the 2015 corn ARC-CO payments from County-to-County, depending on the final 2015 County yields. It appears that most Counties in Southern and Western Minnesota, will get a partial 2015 corn ARC-CO payment; with a few counties that will get the maximum payment. Several counties in Central Minnesota, as well as a few select-

ed Counties in other areas, will likely receive no 2015 corn ARC-CO payment. Expect for a few Counties in Southeast and Northwest Minnesota, there will be little or no 2015 soybean ARC-CO payments. Counties in many portions of Illinois, Indiana, and other States in the Eastern Corn Belt will likely receive the maximum, or close to the maximum, 2015 ARC-CO payments for corn and soybeans, due to much lower yield levels in 2015.

Remember that the 2015 corn and soybean ARC-CO payment levels are still estimates, which are based on the 2015 NASS County yields and the current MYA price estimates. The final ARC-CO payments could vary, based on any changes in the MYA price levels by August 31st, 2016, or any adjustments made by USDA in the announced NASS yields to arrive at the final 2015 FSA County yields, which will be used to calculate 2015 ARC-CO payments. There will likely be a 6.8 percent Federal sequestration reduction on all 2015 ARC-CO payments that paid in October, 2016, similar to the 2014 ARC-CO payments that were paid in 2015.

Previous county yields for corn, soybeans, and other crops, benchmark yields and revenues, 2014 FSA yields, 2014 ARC-CO payment levels, and other farm program information are available on the FSA ARC-PLC web site, which is at: www.fsa.usda.gov/arc-plc. 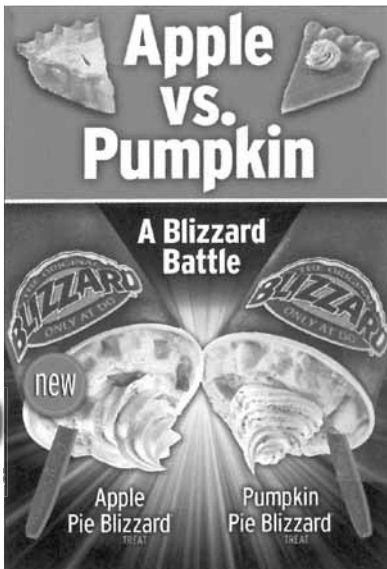
