



ward family, thank you to on the history and the transfer of ownership of KSUM and KFMC. With the May 31st sale, Woodward Broadcasting ended a 56-year family legacy in Fairmont.

In October of 1962, Charlie and Elizabeth Woodward moved to Fairmont and formed Woodward Broadcasting with the official purchase of KSUM AM in November. (KFMC FM went on the air in August 1978). They immediately became involved with Fairmont and the surrounding communities. They were active with the Fairmont Opera House, The Civic Summer Theatre and many organizations such as The Salvation Army, Kiwanis and Rotary. Charlie was on the air with a call-in talk show called Vocal Point, Elizabeth worked on the air with a show called Lines and Angles. There were lots of on-air personalities who had a major following: Frank Endersbe (newscaster), Dick Mahar (sportscaster and newsman), the incomparable Annabel Webb (talk show) Marv Carlson (farm broadcaster), and Rod Halvorson (disc jockey and sports). It is difficult mentioning names because you will inadvertently leave some important ones out. Many older people

On behalf of the Wood- will remember Mrs. John Larson who had a Sunday af-Lenny Tvedten for his article ternoon show of Swedish folk songs. She later remarried and broadcast under the name of Mrs. Clarence Froslan. Despite the fact that it was radio, she always dressed in native costume. Some behind-thescenes people were Clint Knapp and Lee Bremer (engineers), Ken Evans (salesman), Marilyn Sweet Borchardt (office manager) and many others. I was a disc jockey and

newscaster for many years. I vividly remember broadcasting live from the Martin County Fair booth in the Industrial Building. Charlie died in 1974 and Elizabeth in 1982. My brother Woody Wood-

ward went to work for Woodward Broadcasting in 1974 and became general manager in 1980. He continued the stations' tradition of community service started by my parents. He was inducted into the Minnesota Broadcasting Hall of Fame in 2011. After 44 years in broadcasting, he retired and sold the stations. Woodward Broadcasting will forever be a part of Fairmont's history. Again, thank you to Lenny Tvedten for his article.

British Broiled Tomatoes

1 clove garlic, crushed or minced

1/2 cup grated cheese

2 Tablespoons butter

1/4 cup fresh parsley

Wash tomato. Cut in half, drain on paper towels cut side down for 20 minutes. Place tomato halves cut side up in baking dish. Season with salt and pepper and garlic. Sprinkle with cheese, dot with butter and top with parsley. Place under broiler until cheese is bubbly about 3 minutes, watch closely. Serves two.
