

Harbitz stated his perspective regarding the use and value of helicopters during the Vietnam War:

"Helicopters were the infantryman's connection to where we had come from. In the "boonies." we were clearly isolated from anything but the unknown double and triple canopy jungle surrounding us both day and night. Our enemy lie waiting for our incursions, dugin and seeking to pick us off; the friendly call of our re-supply helicopters bringing in new FNG's (replacements), c-rations, and water; sometimes, a hot meal. Of the greatest respect for the Medevac choppers, whose crews always answered our call of needful desperation;



Harbitz had many experiences with helicopters and how they were utilized during his tour of duty while being in the infantry. The account of several of his experiences are as fol-

lows: On May 11th, 1969, Harbitz was on a UH-1 resupply chopper going to join his new unit in the jungle. The pilot decided to give them a "grand entry" into the landing zone

by coming in at a high speed, pulling his nose up into a vertical lift, then into a stall, flipping 180 degrees, and finally softly dropping onto the landing zone experiencing what was called a "hammerhead" turn.

On June 17th, 1969, a new point man was hit by an NVA sniper

smashing the right side of his mouth and jaw. A medevac chopper (UH-1) was called in, but due to the heavy tree canopy was unable to get down to the troops. The medics devised a plan to float the injured soldier out to the middle of the river on an air mattress. Then the Medevac chopper hovered





the rear rotor erupted in flames as it fell from the sky tragically ending the lives of its crew of five.

The preceding represents but a few of the many experiences Harbitz encountered while serving in Vietnam. He completed his service in the Army in 1970 returning to Worthington Junior College before transferring to Mankato State University where he earned his BS Degree. Ironically, his experience in Vietnam influenced him in choosing his career as a teacher and administrator as a result of encountering the many innocent children who were the innocent victims of the war that would trade bananas for the soldiers C-Rations.

Harbitz is very appreciative of the Martin County Veterans Memorial Site and the addition of the Cobra helicopter. In addition, he keeps in contact with the men he served with as they have reunions annually.

A New Recipe!

I must be getting bored with this winter weather, I tried a new recipe for lunch yesterday! Pa Lloyd suggested I share this one with you and even said he would eat the leftovers! That is rare for him, he generally doesn't like leftovers and he's a little leary of new recipes! I used regular bacon because that is what I had, and it worked just fine. I hope that you will enjoy it too!

Baked Chicken with bacon bottom and wild rice:

One 12-oz. package thick-cut peppered bacon 1 medium white onion, sliced thin

6 Tablespoons butter

3 - 6.2 oz. boxes Uncle Ben's long grain & wild rice, cook according to directions on box

One 10 oz. can condensed cream of mushroom soup

1 cup sour cream

1 cup chicken broth

1 tsp. garlic powder

salt and pepper to taste

2 # chicken tenders

1/2 cup fresh chives or parsley to sprinkle on top

Preheat oven to 375 degrees

Lay bacon side by side to cover bottom of a deep 9x13 inch baking pan, use remaining slices along the sides of the pan. Place the onion slices on top of the bacon, overlapping if necessary to cover the bottom. Cut 4 tablespoons of the butter into cubes and sprinkle them evenly over the onion. In a large bowl combine the cooked wild rice blend with the soup, sour cream, broth, garlic powder, salt and pepper. Smooth the rice mixture over the butter. Then melt the remaining butter and brush over the chicken strips, nestle the chicken tenders into the rice, pressing them down slightly. Cover pan tightly with foil and bake for 55 minutes, uncover and bake until the chicken is cooked through, about 20 minutes. Sprinkle the chives or parsley over the top and serve. Makes 10-12 servings. Have a great week!



The jays cried "Here, here, here" and nuthatches traveled briskly up and down the trunk of a tree. I found enchantment in a pair of cardinals. Their name comes from the red plumage resembling the robes of the cardinals of the Roman

Barred owls swallow small prey whole and large prey in pieces, typically eating the head first and then the body. They occasionally store prey temporarily in a nest, on a branch, or on a snag to eat later.

I walked past an old Toyota Tercel in town. A tiercel or tercel is the male of any of the raptors used in falconry. It caused me to think of other old cars carrying bird names. Ford Inunderbird, Ford Falcon, AMC Eagle, Buick Skylark, Pontiac Firebird, and Plymouth Roadrunner. Dorothy Nielsen of Albert Lea spotted seven trumpeter swans in February. Swans nested not far from Dorothy's home. Swans were once hunted for their meat, skins and feathers. By the 1880s, trumpeter swans disappeared from Minnesota and by the 1930s, only 69 trumpeter swans remained in the lower 48 states (in Montana). The DNR Nongame Wildlife Program released 21 swans in 1987 near the Tamarac National Wildlife Refuge in

Becker County. One of the most beautiful sights I've seen in Alaska, a place filled with beautiful sights, was a pair of swans flying soundlessly through a mist over the Chilkat River. The white plumage in the haze and against the blurred mountains was breathtaking. Q&A

A barn owl was seen at the Bog this year, where there are 30 to 40 days a year of below zero temperatures.

Corn WASDE Summary:

Based on the February WASDE and USDA crop production report, total U.S. corn production for 2019 is estimated at nearly 13.7 billion bushels, which is well below the total production levels of 14.3 billion bushels in 2018 and 14.6 billion bushels in 2017. The record U.S. corn production of 15.1 billion bushels occurred in 2016. The 81.5 million U.S. harvested corn acres in 2019 compares 81.3 million acres in 2018 and 82.7 million acres in 2017.

The 2019-20 corn ending stocks are projected to show a moderate decline from ending stock levels in the previous two years. The 2019-20 ending stocks are estimated at 1.89 billion bushels, which compares to 2.22 billion bushels in 2018-19 and 2.14 billion bushels in 2017-18. USDA expects total corn usage for 2019-20 to decline slightly from a year earlier, with a fairly large reduction in the level of corn exports; however, this is somewhat offset by projections for small inUSDA is estimating the

According to the latest WASDE report, total U.S. soybean production for 2019 is estimated at nearly 3.56 billion bushels, the January estimate. This compares to production levels of 4.43 billion bush-The total harvested U.S. soybean acreage in 2019 was estimated at 75 million acres, which far below the 87.6 million acres years prior to the initiation in 2018, the record level of 89.5 million acres in 2017, and 82.7 million harvest-

ed acres in 2016. USDA is projecting 2019-20 soybean ending stocks to be 425 million bushels, which is a decline of 50 million bushels from the January estimate. The 2019-20 estimate is less than half of the final 2018-19 soybean ending stocks of 909 million bushels; however, it but is comparable to the 438 million bushel ending stocks in 2017-18. The 2019 MYA prices for wheat and other small grains are calculated June 1st, 2019 through May 31st, 2020. • Corn --- At an estimated MYA price of \$3.85 per bushel, final 2019 county average corn vields will need to be about 18 percent below the county benchmark yield in order to earn any 2019 farm program payments through the ARC-CO farm program choice. 




