Pomerenkes recognized as a 2020 "U of M Farm Family"

The Pomerenke family of Fairmont has been named Martin County's "2020 Farm Family of the Year" by the University of Minnesota.

Fair View Farm began in 1975 with the purchase of two half-blood Simmental heifers while Steve was attending South Dakota State University. In 1985, Steve and Lori purchased the home farm south of Fairmont, where they raised their family. The family raises registered Simmental, Angus and SimAngus cattle. 60 cows are calved each year from breeding stock merchandised in annual heifer and bull sales each fall. The cattle that aren't sold are marketed to consumers as locally raised,

hormone-free beef.

In 2001, the Pomerenkes purchased additional land for hay production. Their son Tyler and his wife, Kendra, built a home there and are raising their family that includes kids Adler and Viera.

In 2004, Fair View Farm expanded when Steve and Lori, along with their son Grant bought some

additional pastureland. Grant and his wife, Kristie, make their home on this property with their children, Fitzgerald and Ilsa.

The Pomerenkes' oldest son, Jared, and his wife, Tanya, purchased acreage south of Fairmont in 2013 where they built a facility for show cattle and are raising their three boys: Carson, Merritt, and Archer.

Steve and Lori's daughter, Vanessa, is a former Minnesota Angus Queen and was involved in 4-H beef projects. Vanessa lives in Fairmont.

Steve has been a financial officer with Compeer Financial for 39 years. He is a member of the Martin County Fair Board, Martin County 4-H Livestock Committee and serves on the board of directors of the Fairmont Chamber of Commerce. Steve is a member of the Minnesota and American Simmental Associations and the Minnesota and American Angus Associations. Lori is a former Martin County 4-H Coordinator and serves as a Guardian Ad Litem for the State of Minnesota serving children in Martin County. Steve and Lori are members of St. Paul Lutheran Church in Fairmont where Steve sings in the choir and Lori volunteers with Operation Shoe Box.

Though COVID-19 has forced cancellation of the annual Minnesota Farmfest, where the awards are presented each August, this year's honorees were celebrat-

ed in an online video tribute. The recognition, lead by University of Minnesota President Joan Gabel, is available at mnfarmfamilies. cfans.umn.edu.

Honored families are chosen, one per county, by local University of Minnesota Extension committees based on their demonstrated commitment to their communities and to enhancing and supporting agriculture.







Sheriff Marquart announces LE scholarships

Martin County Sheriff Jeff Markquart announced the commencement of the Law Enforcement Scholarship Program for 2020. Sheriff Markquart proudly announced that the MŠA Board of Directors has established a scholarship fund for the awarding of up to 15-\$600 scholarships for this year. These scholarships are due to the coordinated efforts of the 87 Sheriffs of the State of Minnesota.

The Members of MSA gives special recognition to the financial needs

of students attending the peace officer skills course, or one of the two or four year law enforcement degree colleges. "The Board of Directors feel peace officers in our democratic society have complex duties to perform" said Sheriff Markquart. MSA recognizes the importance of preentry training for people considering law enforcement as their career choice. MSA recognizes some students need outside help in meeting the costs of such training, even though they excel academically.

The Scholarship Committee, in making its selection of awards, intends on achieving representation from all geographical areas of the state. Scholarship awards will be announced by December 28th of the same year.

Application forms and a statement of procedures are available at the Martin County Sheriff's Office. Scholarships are only available to students currently enrolled in one of the following three categories:

Mandated POST 1. Skills Program

In their second year of a two year law enforcement program.

In their third or fourth year of a four year college criminal justice program.

In order to qualify, students must have completed at least one year of the two year program or two years of a four year program. Students meeting these criteria are invited to obtain a scholarship application form from their local sheriff's office or online at www.mnsheriffs.org.

I dreamed of chickadees.

My favorite bird is the chickadee. There are things that turn frowns upside down. A chickadee does that for

It's not a state law that we all must have a favorite bird, but it's a good Idea. You never know when it'll come in handy or be included in a pop quiz. It goes without saying that it'd look good on a resume.

I first noticed chickadees when I was a dear

boy. I had a great interest in nature and a chickadee had an outsized talent to entertain me. I wasn't the only one smitten by them. His real name was either William Claude Dunkenfield or Claude William Dunkenfield. In 1908, he legally changed his name to W. C. Fields. In the 1932 movie "If I Had a Million," Joseph Mankiewicz, the screenwriter, had Fields addressing a female character as a "little bird." Fields reworded it and "My little chickadee" became a catchphrase and a term of endearment used by the comic actor. In 1940, the phrase was used as the title of a film starring Fields and Mae West.

In the film "The Bank Dick," Egbert Sousé, the character played by Fields, said, "Don't be a luddyduddy! Don't be a mooncalf! Don't be a jabbernowl!" I try not to be one.

A chickadee makes me smile without doing anything more than being. The chickadee is in my birding sweet spot. In 2017, I spent too much time in a hospital trying to determine when the machines I was hooked to were making good beeps and when they were making bad beeps, all the while hoping to avoid a plague of locusts. Freed from that confinement, I found walking difficult and birding nearly impossible. I decided to count chickadees, with 1,000 being my goal. I didn't need the math skills of Albert Einstein to do that and I didn't care if it was the same chickadee repeatedly, if I saw it, I counted it. I told no one, holding my own soft celebration upon achieving that minor goal. I counted 1,000 chickadees again this year. I went the distance as Rocky had

quickly than in 2017. Research shows chickadee's brain grows up to 30% larger when it needs to find food for caching. The brain expands to help it remember where it had stored food. In the spring, when memory is less important, the

went the distance. Chick-

adees added up more

brain shrinks to normal size. Chickadees living in harsher winters have better spatial memories and larger brains than those farther south. Neuroscientists are studying to see why there are no senior moments for chickadees.

Bob Holtz, a friend living in Roseville told me he'd decided to see how many days he could observe chickadees in 2010. He missed five days. He started over and his streak ended at 675 consecutive days. That didn't include days when he wasn't in Minnesota. Bob said, "When one does this type of thing, one sets his own rules. Those were mine. I loved it. It was surprising how many times I would look out at my bird feeders, see a chickadee come flying in and feel a big smile spread across my face. Glad I did it, but sorry to see it end. Of course, there is always tomorrow!" Bob told me he watches chickadees because it makes him happy. That's a

mighty fine reason. I don't care which chickadee I see or where I see it. There are seven species of chickadees: grayheaded (the rarest chickadee in North America), Mexican, boreal, chestnutsided, mountain, Carolina and black-capped chickadee. The black-capped is the most widespread and the one seen in my yard. Black-capped chickadees produce a short, whistled "fee-bee" song, which I've described as "Spring'shere," "Sweet-ie," or "Love-you." Chickadees are like mall security. They're the first to sound the alarm when they spot a predator. They make the call "chicka-dee-dee-dee." The more "dees" there are, the more danger they perceive. Chickadees have a heart rate of 480 beats per minute and up. That seems important to me.

The birds belong to everyone; the best things in life are free. Hidden gems are everywhere. I could be in the most unfamiliar of places, but if I saw a chickadee, that place would feel like home to me.

I'm no jabbernowl, I count chickadees each day. It softens the edges of this damndemic.

And I'm following my dream.

The Photo Press printed a plan of the proposed new Industrial Park to be about a mile west of the city limits on Highway 16. The ground had recently been purchased by a new Fairmont cor-"Fairmont poration, GO," from Harold Armstrong. The 160 acres was divided just about in half by the highway going east-west, and the Milwaukee and Northwestern railroads that ran parallel along the north edge of the plat. A subscription campaign had raised \$208,600 in pledges to pay for the land.

The "Echo", Fairmont High School periodical, received a citation in a contest sponsored by Journalism Advisors of Minnesota, in three categories, Best Use of Local Tie-In, Best Art and Best Editorial.

Officials reported that the 105th Martin County Fair was the best ever.


