



Over the past six months, the COVID-19 pandemic has affected almost every aspect of people's lives, and unfortunately, the same will be true for many this holi-


People thrive on connections with one another, and COVID-19 has required physically distancing in ways that make it hard to connect socially. The holiday season makes this reality especially difficult.

"It's natural for people to want to gather together on holidays. But unfortunately, it's almost impossible to stay socially distanced during these types of gatherings, says Madhan Prabhakaran, M.D., family medicine physician, Mayo Clinic Health System in Fairmont.

For your safety and that of others, consider the following when making decisions about how to connect with others and help one another find ways to foster those connections safely:

- 1. People are most contagious for COVID-19 just prior to symptom onset. So people who look and act completely healthy could actually be contagious for COVID-19.
- 2. Whenever food and drink are served, people cannot be masked, and this increases the risk of transmission.
- 3. When people need to speak loudly, because of physical distance or background noise, droplets travel farther than usual.
- 4. Alcohol relaxes inhibitions and contributes to louder talking and lapses in distancing.
- 5. Transmission occurs outdoors as well as indoors.





# **MORNING SHOW**

Our four bird feeders have been placed so that we can watch the MORN-ING SHOW when eating our winter breakfast. The first bird to arrive is usually the red cardinal. It stands on the snow and selects from the wasted seeds that are under the glass fronted, six-sided feeder that my wife's uncle made for us many years ago. It is a feeder used only for sunflower seeds. The second kind of bird that usually appears is a large jay. It lands confidently on the surrounding edge of the sunflower feeder, selects a seed, and then flies up into the nearby oak. We watch as it pounds the chosen

morsel against the branch on which it is standing. It tries again and again. It finally lifts its head to swallow the precious middle of the seed. It is as though a downy woodpecker has been watching. It flies to the same ledge of the sunflower feeder and hangs onto its side. It waits as though it is thinking. It is as though it wants to be selective, much like a child would be choosing a kind of candy. However, it seems to know it must hurry before the powerful jay returns. It selects its seed and flies away. Nature has equipped it with a feeder memory. It will be back!

A suet feeder acts as

the main attraction. It draws all kinds of birds, including woodpeckers, chickadees, and finches. All hang on to this hanging wire basket and reach



through for its morsel. Some seem surprised when they break off a piece of the white and frozen delicacy. They fly to an outreaching limb of the oak and savor their surprise. The what was to be a supposed to be a squirrel proof seed feeder, which is attached directly to the trunk of the oak, stands ready to welcome all. However, the other feeders seem to be preferred by the birds of the morning. The glass front shows that it is emptying slowly. However, it seems

to be a favorite for the late morning common sparrows.

Many of the birds select from all the different feeders. Nuthatches walk down the side of the oak to get to the seed feeder and ground. They put on a MORN-ING SHOW that is truly acrobatic. They move down the trunk so easily, as though they were walking on level ground. The cylinder tube feeder, filled with thistle seeds, seems to draw the birds of finesse. They arrive with the grace of a ballet dancer. It is the feeder of the chickadee. They seldom come as individuals. A group suddenly appears with each its own position on an outreaching perch and eating hole. They eat as though they are watching their manners. Their



dark bodies of winter are in contrast to what they are like in the spring. They then dress in the formal colors of yellow and black as though "the show must go on."

We wait for the MORN-ING SHOW each winter morning. The birds are predictable as to when they will show up, how they will act, and how they trust us to keep the feeders full.
