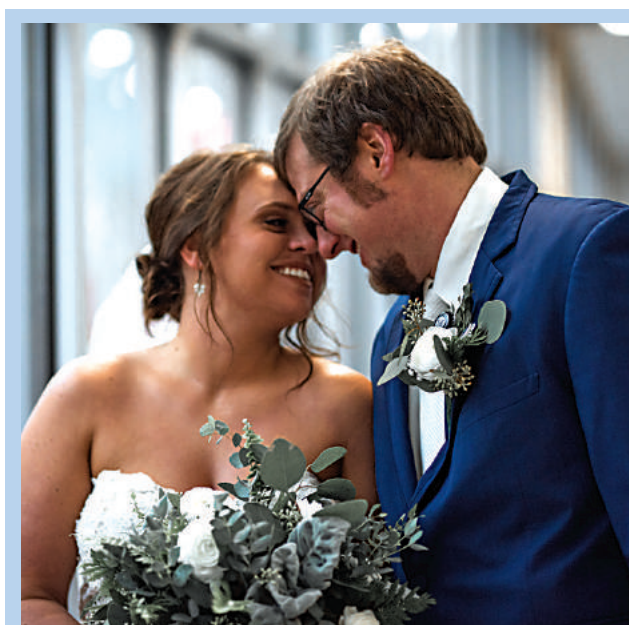
## MLHS to host Children's Winter Carnival

The Fairmont Eagles Club is having a benefit for the South Central Volunteer Dive Team on Thursday, January 23rd. They will be serving beef and Turkey commercials from 5:00 to 7:00 p.m. with take outs available. A bake sale will be provided as well with plenty of goodies.

The Dive Team is a non-profit, 501c3 all volunteer underwater search and rescue team, providing emergency underwater search, rescue and recovery service to Martin and surrounding counties. They provide mutual aid to other agencies outside their area when their service is requested.

The members of the team are not compensated in any way for their volunteer service. They provide much of

their equipment and operating funds themselves.

The team members respond from Fairmont, Sherburne, Trimont and Welcome. These volunteers are trained to be divers, boat operators, tenders, sonar operators and shore support. They are on call 24/7 through the Martin County Law Enforcement Center.

The Team was estab-



lished in 2003 to provide underwater services. They are dependent on Human kind-

ness to raise funding for their equipment and operating expense. They are currently raising funds to purchase a used suburban to pull one of their boats to the emergency scene when called. They currently have two boats and a pontoon which all need to respond to the accident scene but they only have two vehicles to tow the boats. It would be a great asset to them to be able to take all three boats and not have to decide which two they will need the most. A suburban is also needed because of the size it would be able to transport members to the emergency scene. They are also in need of more radios.

## Just the winter blues or something more?

The colder, drearier months can have a negative effect on many people's moods and energy levels. But for some, those negative effects can run deeper.

Seasonal affective disorder (SAD) is a cyclic, seasonal condition, meaning signs and symptoms are present only during a particular season of the year and then go away. Most of the time, signs and symptoms of seasonal affective disorder typically appear during the winter and recede in the spring and summer.

"Those who have seasonal affective disorder can experience feelings of depression, and they may withdraw socially, sleep a lot, overeat and gain weight," says Sharon Dexheimer, licensed clinical social worker, Mayo Clinic Health System. "Other symptoms may include headaches, irritability and difficulty concentrating."

What causes seasonal affective disorder is unclear, but heredity, age and your body's chemical makeup all seem to play a role. So can the availability of sunlight. Researchers suspect that reduced sunlight may disrupt circadian rhythms that regulate

your body's internal clock, which lets you know when it's time to sleep and when it's time to wake up. This disruption may cause depression or exacerbate a preexisting depressive condition.

"There is no cure for seasonal affective disorder, but light therapy can be a very helpful treatment option for winter depression," says Dexheimer. "By simply sitting near a special light box, exposing you to bright light, you may feel more energized and happier, among other benefits. Your primary care provider can recommend what equipment is appropriate for your needs."

Dexheimer recommends some things that you can do on your own to cope with seasonal depression:

- Increase the amount of light in your home.
- Get outside.
- Exercise regularly.
- Find ways to relax.
- Take a trip to a sunny, warm location, but stay on the same sleep schedule if the trip is under seven days long.
- Avoid nighttime use of computer, tablet or phone, especially when in bed.

# The Guy From Just Around the Corner

My neighbor Crandall stops by. "How are you doing?" I ask.

"Everything is nearly copacetic. I can't tell if it's late last night or early tomorrow morning. In my dream, I wanted to become a glassblower, but I blew my chance and became a snowplow driver in the freezer of a supermarket instead. Despite the troubled sleep, I was ready for the recent storm of the century when it hit. I'd fashioned a crude ice scraper out of a spear."

**Naturally**  
It was as if I were walking in a snow globe. The snow fell all friendly and benign. The days before were windy and had given the yard its first snowbank of the year — in front of the garage. I mumbled "amain." Herman Melville in "Moby Dick," wrote, "The wind now rising amain, he in vain strove." Emerson wrote, "The soul strives amain to live and

work." Merriam-Webster dictionary defines the word as: With all one's strength, at full speed or with great haste. With that as inspiration, I recalled another word from the cobwebs of my mind and walked widdershins, meaning in a counterclockwise direction.

A bald eagle flew over the yard just as the sun was in the right position to create a shadow flapping across the snow. Talk about casting a giant shadow.

The sun became scarce and a true winter storm hit. It brought more snow. Snowbanks became abundant. The Old Farmer's Almanac said this about that. "Now is the time of the deep snows and thrice blessed is the neighbor who will plow you out."

A skunk had awakened long enough to make a few trips in and out of a culvert, its trail showing it had plowed snow in the process. A group of skunks is a surfeit. I prefer scurry as a collective noun for squirrels, although I call them a surfeit when there

are too many.

I watched a snowplow go by. It's always a welcome addition to winter.

**Q&A**  
"When do great horned owls nest?" In Minnesota, courtship and territory formation begin in December and early January with eggs laid at the end of January through February. The owls have thick feathers, even their legs and feet are feathered, to handle the cold. The young hatch with fluffy down to keep them warm. The owls are able to incubate eggs successfully at -27° and eggs have been recorded to withstand a mother's absence for 20 minutes at -13°. The incubation period is 30-37 days and the nestling period lasts about 42 days. Early nesting might give the young time to learn hunting skills before the next winter.

"Why is a species of tree named the hackberry?" It's an unfortunate name for a tree. It makes it sound as if the tree is about to cough up a ball of berries or has done some criminal things to

your computer. Colonists called this canopy tree a hagberry, probably because they found it similar to the wild cherry species by that name in Scotland. Eventually the name morphed into hackberry. Its bark resembles warts on young trees and changes into deeply furrowed,

The venom found in the majority of spiders isn't strong enough to injure a human, but I wouldn't recommend eating any of them.

"Is the cedar tree really a cedar?" The eastern redcedar is a juniper and is sometimes called a pencil-cedar because, prior to 1940, pencils were made almost entirely from cedar. Pencils are now made from other woods or synthetic materials. The tree's berries are an important food source for birds and mammals.

Have you made your New Year's resolutions for 2020? When many of us make these promises, we focus on ways we can improve some form of our health. ## Brrr its cold outside!

This year I gave myself a Christmas gift, I spent the money to have our fireplace converted to gas! The man of our home could no longer climb up on our roof to clean our chimney so we didn't feel it was safe to burn wood so I could have my ambiance. Anyway I love my new gas flame, it looks like the real thing and makes our living room so warm and cozy. There is a remote control where I can regulate the size of the flame, the fan and temperature. I decided at my age if I was going to enjoy it for a few years I best do

it now, I'm so glad I did especially with the cold snap we are now experiencing!

I know one can buy flavored olive oil to use for dipping, but I recently found this recipe to make as you need it. Plumping the herbs in water before stirring into the olive oil enhances the flavor. I hope that you will enjoy it too. This recipe comes from the Taste of Home magazine.

### Olive Oil Dip:

Makes 3 batches, 1/2 cup per batch.

1 Tablespoon dried minced garlic  
1 Tablespoon dried rosemary, crushed  
1 Tablespoon dried oregano  
2 tsp. dried basil  
1 tsp. crushed red pepper flakes  
1/2 tsp. salt  
1/2 tsp. coarsely ground pepper

Additional ingredients for each batch

1 Tablespoon water  
1/2 cup extra virgin olive oil  
1 French bread baguette

In a small bowl, combine the first 7 ingredients. Store in an airtight container in a cool, dry place for up to 6 months.

To prepare dipping oil: In a small microwave-safe bowl, combine 4 tsp. herb mix with water. Microwave uncovered, on high 10-15 seconds. Drain and discard excess water. Transfer to a shallow serving plate or bowl; add 1/2 cup extra virgin olive oil and stir to combine. Serve with sliced or torn bread for dipping.

## Pass it on

How many of us question how we could have forgotten something that we heard so many times when we were growing up? We ask ourselves, "Why didn't I listen more closely? Why didn't I ask more questions?" How many of us can almost hear the words and voice of the person telling the story? We now ask ourselves as we try to PASS IT ON. Have we forgotten some of the details of the story? We now say, "If only that certain person was here, they could help me."

What makes this so important is that families are becoming scattered and the opportunity to PASS IT ON is becoming more limited. The families rarely get together anymore. If the stories are not heard, they will soon be gone-the stories about how their families happened to come to the Southern Minnesota prairie, why they

came and what were some of the early hardships. Subjects like what prompted the family to move to a certain place will become unknown. How many of us know enough to PASS IT ON to the next generation? What are the details of their important decisions? How many the family stories will be lost because no one has taken the time to PASS IT ON to the next generation? Even simple things such as heritage recipes can no longer be used because of the lack of information.

My dad's mother (my grandmother) was raised on a Martin County farm that had the three things needed by the early settlers. These were water, timber, and land. My father would sometimes tell me some of the family history. The farm had a flowing well and the Sioux Indians would come to the farm to drink of the cold and clear

water. My great-grandmother used to feed them. If only this relative were alive today. I would ask her the question of how she and her children survived during the Sioux Indian uprising. Did they stay on the farm or travel to a fort as my grandfather, Lewis F. True, was in the Civil War at the very same time?

I am one of the lucky ones as I grew up in a family of storytellers. Both sides of my family lived within a short distance of our farm and we would get together on a regular basis. I would listen to those conversations. They were always interesting as they usually related to something that I was interested in. However, I now lack the details of those conversations. I do not know enough to PASS IT ON and where do I now go to ask the questions?

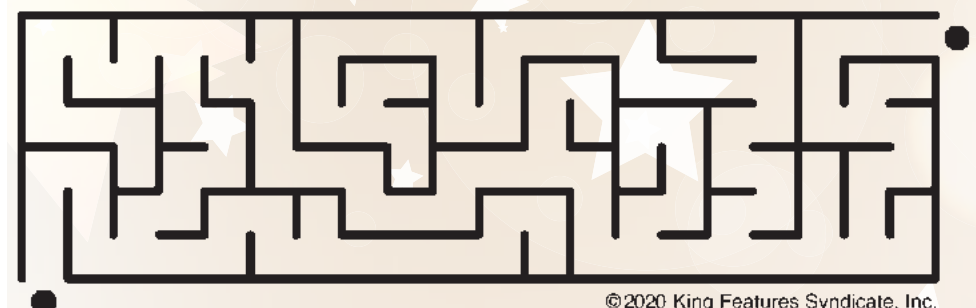

Ambulance Exemption

**Question: What allows private for-profit ambulance companies to run tax-exempt license plates on their vehicles?**

**Answer:** Vehicles owned by ambulance services specifically intended for emergency response or providing ambulance services are exempt under the Minnesota State statutes. All services must have a valid license issued by the board. The license shall specify the base of operations, the primary service area, and the type or types of ambulance service for which the licensee is licensed. The licensee shall obtain a new license if they wish to expand their primary service area, or to provide a new services.

You can avoid a ticket — and a crash — if you simply buckle up, drive at safe speeds, pay attention and always drive sober. Help us drive Minnesota Toward Zero Deaths.
