Was that what made us appreciate it more? Something learned early was that the large bell-shaped collection end had to be reattached to the pump. The water would then flow to the cooler once again. Wasting the valuable cool water was a serious matter to the people of the prairie.

A pipe on the opposite side of the cooler allowed the water to flow into the large wooden stock tank. This was the 'tank of importance" at that time. All the farm animals drank from this tank in some way. It was a place of dominance as the more powerful cows, horses, sheep, or hogs drank first. The weaker had to wait!

Yet, in these times of change, there are those who cherish the past and take pleasure in preserving what is precious in history. Some of these same people live within our community. They care for things of the past!

Those who were raised on a farm with a windmill will remember the SOUND OF THE WINDMILL'S SONG. It was a song with one note, continuous rhythm, and a sound that carried far.

Time for Dessert??

Actually today's recipe was in the dessert section of the cookbook but I can see it used for a brunch too. My little Great Grand daughter Lydia loves blueberries so I am always on the look out for a recipe using blueberries. I found a great one, even Pa Lloyd said that I can make that one again! The recipe says to serve warm but we liked it the next day at room temperature too. We liked it with whipped topping on top, ice cream would be good too.

Buttermilk Blueberry Puff:

1 1/2 sticks butter, room temperature

12 cups cubed croissants (I used a pkg. of 6 small ones not 12 cups)

3 cups blueberries

1 cup granulated sugar

6 large eggs, room temperature

2 cups heavy cream

1 cup buttermilk

2 tablespoons pure vanilla extract

1 tsp. salt

1 tablespoon coarse raw sugar (turbinado), op-

Preheat oven to 375 degrees, butter a 9x13 inch deep baking dish with 1 tablespoon butter

Spread cubed croissant cubes evenly in baking dish, top with the berries.

In a stand mixer (or in a large bowl with a hand mixer) beat the butter with the granulated sugar on medium speed until creamy, beat in eggs, one at time, beating well after each addition. Beat in the cream and buttermilk, vanilla and salt, the mixture will look curdled.

Pour over the croissants and berries, sprinkle with coarse sugar if using. Bake until a knife inserted near the center comes out clean, 35-40 minutes. Makes 12 servings. Enjoy our summer weather and have a great week!







Install soft, non-glaring path fixtures about 14 inches high that direct most of the light downward. Define the edges of the path by placing lights about one foot from one or both sides of the walkway, staggering the placement slightly to create a natural flow.

For steps, install lights

directly into the risers. This soft light provides just enough brightness to mark each tread and prevent glare.

Finally, add accent and decorative lighting that accentuates your home's architectural features. For entertaining areas, select wall-mounted fixtures such as sconces or lanterns, or overhead lighting that focuses task light on work surfaces. 
