

Closing is simpler when you purchase with cash so vou can sometimes close as soon as two weeks. Buying with cash is always the fastest and simplest way to buy real estate because there aren't as many steps to buy as compared to financing your purchase. When buying with cash, you'll need to provide the seller a letter from the bank stating you have proficient funds to purchase with cash. Sometimes you can provide a current bank statement but make sure you white out your account number before submitting it to the seller.

Typically, closing a sale with financing will take 45-60 days. The date of closing is always a moving target when purchasing a house with financing. As a buyer, if you opted for an inspection contingency, you will be responsible for hiring an inspector to inspect the property. You will then have to decide a few things: 1) whether to go forward to the purchase of the house or cancel the purchase, 2) whether you want to pay for the red flagged items or negotiate to have the seller pay for the repairs/replacements. The lender/loan officer secures the loan and orders the appraisal of the property. They will guide you through the entire loan process. Once the appraisal comes back and is satisfactory to the lender, the lender will complete the rest of the paperwork required to secure your loan. The lender will give

The closing-title company will make sure all the documents related to the ownership of a property are ready for the closing. The closing-title company will also update the abstract and make sure the title is free and clear of any issues (example: liens on the property). The closing-title company will assign a closing agent to take you through all the paperwork on the day of closing.

On closing day, you will arrive at the closingtitle company where you may see several attendees, which can vary depending on the property. Often, you will have yourself as the buyer, your real estate agent, your loan officer (if you financed your purchase), the seller, the seller's real estate agent, and the closing agent. Typically, the seller's paperwork is discussed first, followed by the buyer's paperwork.

Once the sellers and buyers have all signed the paperwork, you will finally receive what you've been waiting for all along...the keys! Congratulations on the purchase of your new home!

Garlic and Herb Tomatoes:

- 2 tablespoons extra virgin olive oil
- 3 garlic cloves, thinly sliced
- 5 fresh thyme sprigs
- 1 pound small red, yellow, and/or orange cherry
- 1 tablespoon coarsely chopped fresh tarragon 1/2 tsp. sea salt
- Freshly ground pepper to taste

In a large skillet, heat olive oil, garlic and thyme over medium-high heat until hot. Add the tomatoes and toss to coat in the olive oil. Cook until the tomatoes' skin splits but they have not burst, 5-6 minutes. Sprinkle the tarragon and salt over the tomatoes. Remove the pan from the heat, crack pepper over the top and serve.

Mayo offers tips to help public go 'hands-free' behind the wheel

With the hands-free law occurs when the hands are driving: going into effect Thursday, taken off the wheel. August 1st, Mayo Clinic Clinic Ambulance Service are reminding the public of the importance of staying focused behind the wheel.

"The term 'distracted driving' includes texting, but it can also mean many other distractions, such as putting on makeup, playing with the radio or even using a navigation system," says Peggy Sue Garber, registered nurse and trauma and injury prevention coordinator at Mayo Clinic Health System in Fairmont. "Still, cellphones remain the biggest problem while driving, and especially texting. Texting combines all three types of distraction: visual, manual and cognitive."

Visual distraction occurs when drivers take for five seconds (at 55 mph, that's the length of a foot-

Cognitive act of driving, and Mayo Clinic researchers found texting does more than just create a lapse in attention; it actually changes a person's brain waves. The brain waves of 129 patients were monitored over a period of 16 months through electroencephalograms combined with video footage, and a unique "texting rhythm" was found in approximately 1 in 5 patients who were using their smartphone to text message while having their brain waves monitored.

"Drivers simply cannot drive safely while texting," says Garber. "We want people to be safe, and we hope the hands-free law will lead to a decrease in their eyes off the road to injuries and deaths related text, which on average lasts to distracted-driving incidents."

Ask A Trooper: **Alcohol consumption**

Question: a person have an road. alcoholic beverage while operating a boat motorized vehicles are on a lake? How about exempt from Minnesota's if you are a passenger in the back of a motor home?

Answer: It is against the law for any person to consume alcohol in any vehicle while on a public road. Public highways are any road, paved or not, that are open to the public for vehicular traffic.

The law also applies to open alcohol containers limousine service that are accessible to the driver and passengers. To transport open alcohol containers legally, it must be kept in the trunk or an area that is not readily accessible to occupants of the vehicle.

The driver of a motor vehicle can be cited for allowing an open bottle, even if they are not in possession themselves.

The same law applies in a motor home. No person may legally consume alcoholic beverages whether they are the driver or passenger, regardless of where they are in the motor home, while on a public road.

All occupants must use good judgement when in a motor vehicle. An open alcohol container is a clue we look for when Rochester MN 55901investigating a possible DWI. An operator of Troy. Boat operators are exempt from this law as they are not being operated on a public road; however, if you are consuming alcohol on the water the best practice is to have a sober driver because alcohol impairs judgement. There have been many tragic stories on our lakes and rivers where an impaired boat operator has caused a fatal or serious crash. It is important to note that boat operators can be cited for operating under the influence.

One concern that has developed as a result of the excessive rainfall levels was the loss or lack of available nitrogen for the growing corn. Soil nitrogen losses increase substantially during heavy rainfall events, such as have occurred in 2019. 




