




Mix all dip ingredients and refrigerate until served, serve with tortilla chips.

That statement is certainly true in many portions of Southern Minnesota and Northern Iowa as it relates to the 2018 growing season, in comparison to the previous vear. The 2017 crop year featured almost ideal growing conditions across the region, which resulted in record corn and soybean yields in many locations in Southern Minnesota and Northern Iowa. The first half of the 2018 growing season has been much different, with some areas dealing with very late planting, while other portions of the region experiencing continual excessive rainfall and poor growing conditions.
