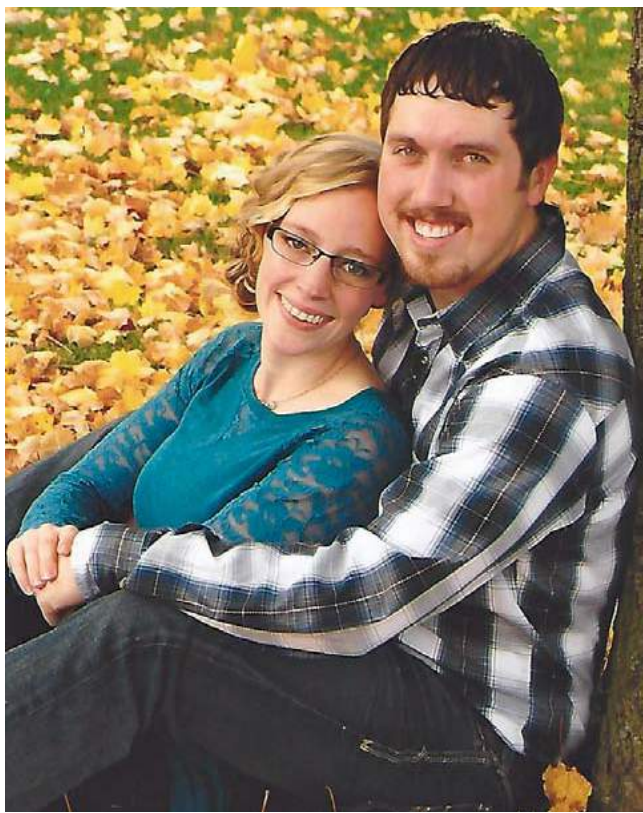

# Calcium, For Bones and a Whole Lot More

For being a basic and easily overlooked everyday mineral, calcium has received a great deal of attention lately. Along with being a vital part of bone health, it has also received press for its impact on weight loss, cramp control, heart health, and hormonal balance issues. One recent study even indicates it can help women live longer! (More on that later.)

Most of us grew up hearing that we should drink our milk so that we grow strong bones. While this is certainly true, there are more health benefits of calcium. Even if we drink milk each day, many Americans are still not getting adequate amounts of calcium. University of Rochester Medical Center discusses the important role of calcium in the human body, "To ensure you consume enough calcium each day, start with food and drink. Calcium in food is better absorbed by the body than calcium in a supplement.

The additional compounds in dairy products act with calcium to promote its benefits. Strive to consume at least three calcium-rich foods daily such as low-fat or nonfat yogurt, 1 percent or skim milk, low-fat ice cream, calcium-fortified orange or grapefruit juice, low-fat cheese and low-fat cottage cheese. Also, look for foods with added calcium such as rice and some breakfast cereals." Additionally, if you are lactose intolerant or are looking for vegetable sources of calcium, consider adding collard greens, kale, spinach, okra, soy beans and white beans to your diet.

The health benefits of calcium cannot be ignored and we should all take extra effort to ensure

we are building adequate stores of calcium in our bodies. The first health benefit of calcium is also the most widely known, bone health. Calcium supports healthy bones as the bones build up calcium stores over time. Additionally, calcium plays an important role in the prevention of osteoporosis. Medscape.com discusses why calcium is important for the prevention of osteoporosis, "Virtually all people should take steps to prevent the development of osteoporosis. It is the most frequently occurring bone disease in the United States, affecting 55% of those ages 50 and older. The morbidity it causes is devastating for elderly patients. The U.S. will experience an epidemic of osteoporosis in coming decades as baby

toms that were helped in these studies were fatigue, depression, mood swings, tension and anxiety, bloating and breast tenderness, and cramping and generalized aches and pains.

Finally, a just published study of women who take calcium supplements regularly have a 22 per cent lower risk of dying over a 10-year period compared with women who are not taking supplements regularly. The study is likely to reassure many who take supplements either prescribed by their doctor for osteoporosis - thinning bones - or bought over the counter as 'bone insurance'. Previously there have been fears that high-dose supplements could raise the risk of dying from heart disease. But Canadian researchers behind the latest study are unequivocal in recommending extra calcium for women with low intakes. Lead author David Goltzman, of McGill University in Montreal, said 'Our study found daily use of



boomers reach the ages of highest risk."

Next, calcium plays an important role in heart and muscle health. Calcium supports nerve transmission and muscle function and can help maintain heart rhythm. Another benefit of calcium is that it has been shown in scientific studies to prevent certain forms of cancer, such as breast cancer and ovarian cancer. And another interesting benefit of calcium is the treatment of PMS symptoms. DoctorOZ.com discusses how calcium can be used to treat PMS symptoms, "Calcium supplements, on the other hand, have been the subject of several studies for PMS symptoms, and with very good results." The premenstrual symp-

tom was associated with a lower risk of death among women." Now THAT should be enough to convince you!!

## Asparagus Wrapped in Ham

### Another Spring treat!

We can now purchase fresh asparagus anytime of the year, but there is nothing like fresh picked asparagus in the spring! The weather wasn't the greatest last week for our grandchildren Hunter and Taylor's visit, but we had a good time anyway. It doesn't seem like kids let cool rainy weather interfere with their fun. Hunter organized card playing tournaments for us, complete with charts to fill in. I won't tell you who the winner was, but it certainly wasn't me!! A beloved member of our family, our daughter in law Melissa (mother to Hunter and Taylor) need your prayers. She will be undergoing surgery on June 9th to remove a brain tumor at St Cloud. I do believe in the power of prayer!

### Asparagus wrapped in ham over rice:

1 cup long grain white rice, cooked in 2 1/2 cups water or chicken broth, bring liquid to boil add rice, cover, lower heat and simmer for 15-20 min until liquid gone, set aside.

4 Tbsp butter  
4 Tbsp flour  
2 cups milk  
salt and pepper to taste in milk  
1 cup shredded Swiss cheese  
24 stalks asparagus

6 slices cooked ham, like boiled ham, or deli ham but sliced thicker than shaved. You need to be able to roll it.

Melt butter, add flour and cook 2 minutes, add milk bring to boil until thick, blend gently adding cheese until melted. Add salt and pepper to taste - you can also add chopped parsley or dill.

Preheat oven to 350 degrees. Blend 1/2 cup of sauce into rice, spread in shallow baking dish. Roll 4 asparagus stalks in slice of ham, put on top of rice, cover with sauce. Bake for 25-30 minutes until brown on top and bubbly. You can top with buttered ritz cracker crumbs, if you wish, or parsley.

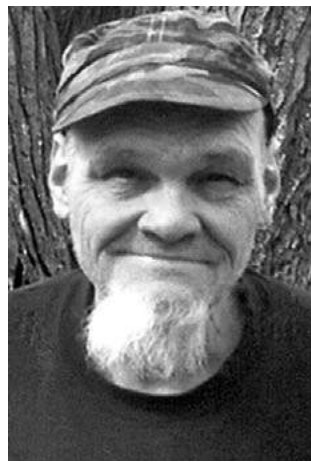

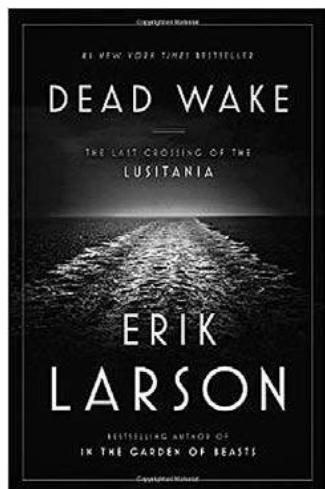
## BOOK+REVIEW

### The Heir by Keira Cass

This book, the fourth in The Selection series, discovers what happens after happily-ever-after and should prove to be very popular with young adult readers. This romantic novel traces Illéa's royal family's entrance into a new Selection—the process of choosing a spouse for the young royal. It's been twenty years since America Singer won the heart of Prince Maxon. The time has now come for Princess Eadlyn to follow suit and hold a Selection of her own. Eadlyn

doesn't expect her Selection to be a fairy-tale story. She has grown up



hearing never-ending stories about the romance between her parents. Eadlyn would prefer to put off marriage for as long as possible, but royal duty calls and she must proceed with the Selection process. However, as the competition begins, she discovers that finding her own happily-ever-after may not be impossible after all. With sweet romance and memorable characters, this novel is sure to captivate readers.

### Dead Wake: The Last Crossing of the Lusitania by Erik Larson

Larson has made a name for himself writing narrative non-fiction (which reads like fiction),

entwining the fascinating and often unknown back stories of significant historical events. Dead Wake, his latest, is no different. As World War I entered its tenth month in May 1915, a fabulously ornate luxury ocean liner sailed from New York en route to Liverpool. This ship, the Lusitania, was carrying a record number of children and infants. Despite Germany's declaration that the seas around Britain were a "war zone," the captain and its passengers placed their faith in the gentleman's warfare agreements that had traditionally kept civilian ships safe from attack. Germany, however, was ready to change the rules of the game, sending a U-boat captained by Walther Schwieger on a new mission. Meanwhile,

a top-secret British intelligence group was tracking Schwieger's U-boat, telling no one. As both the U-boat and the Lusitania made their way towards



Liverpool, an astounding array of forces collided, creating one of the greatest disasters in history. Between pride, a bit of fog, and guarded secrets,

the tragic sinking of the Lusitania was wrought. Larson tells the story that many may know, while providing detailed background: a complex cast of characters living in the height of the Progressive Era. This book fully unveils the layers behind this tragedy.

## Naturally

The rain came down in buckets without any buckets being involved.

There were ducklings, goslings and poults out and about. There is an old saw that said swallows and sparrows cannot understand the ambitions of swans. I doubt that is true. Each species wants to raise a family.



Dame's rocket lined the roadsides and wooded edges. The flowers bloomed in shades of purple, pink, and/or white. The plant is exotic and invasive. It'd be easy to mistake dame's rocket for wild phlox, but a close look at the flowers reveals that dame's rocket flowers have four petals. Phlox have five, matching the number of letters in its name.

A small bunny appeared from the grass near the flowers. Cottontail rabbit mothers nurse the babies in the nest a few minutes at dawn and dusk. If the bunny is 4 to 5 inches long and its ears stand up, it's weaned. Bunnies leave the nest when 4 to 5 weeks old.

A Baltimore oriole male chased a blue jay that had likely ventured too close to a nest. I watched a goldfinch pair fly in courtship circles. They made contact calls that sounded like "potato chip." The American goldfinch is the state bird of Iowa, New Jersey and Washington.

A crow cawed and flew away. A person might not know many birds, but the

crow is hard not to know.

It was an ordinary walk on an ordinary day. The ordinary is a beautiful thing.

I got wet, but it's a small price to pay to see a rain-bow.

### Working for peanuts

Tim and Pat Donahue of Albert Lea feed peanuts to the blue jays. Blue jays love peanuts as a moviegoer loves popcorn. If Tim is tardy in providing peanuts, the jays peer into the window as if asking for some goober peas.

### Q-and-A

Dave Bair of Fairmont wrote, "Al, I can live with two or three grackles, but when a dozen dominate the feeders and chase off all other birds but starlings, I get mad. What can be done? I've taken away all the seeds and jelly so they will maybe get out of the habit of coming here. Will they come back when I put out feed again?"

Removing the feeders for a time might lessen the numbers. Uninvited dinner guests are the bane of even the most gracious of hosts. There are ways to curb the onslaught of ravenous grackles other than hiring a crack team of common grackle scarers. Feed nyjer or suet and stop feeding seed mixes. Mixes are right up a grackle's proverbial alley. Feed safflower seeds instead of sunflower seeds. Grackles find safflower the less desirable of the two.

Fit cages or screens around your feeders, allowing only smaller birds access to the food. This could be homemade of chicken wire or purchased commercially. There are hopper-style feeders with

weighted perches that close when larger birds or squirrels attempt to search is lacking regarding extra-pair copulations.

feed. Shorten tube feeder perches so that larger birds can't find footholds. Wait the grackles out. They don't enjoy our winters. If all else fails, become a fan of grackles. Get one of those foam, waving fingers that proclaims grackles as number one.

"Why do orioles abandon my feeders?" When hungry orioles arrive in the spring, they take advantage of jelly offered at feeders. When nesting and feeding young, their diet changes more to protein-rich insects. Baltimore orioles eat a lot of caterpillars.

Cynthia Nelson of Albert Lea asked if rose-breasted grosbeaks are monogamous. Once mated, rose-breasted grosbeaks appear to be.

A breeding pair tolerates migrant males in their territory if they are silent. Territorial males chase away other males. Breeding pairs stay together for

"How can I tell male and female mourning doves apart?" Males show more color with a bluish cap, pink chest and neck feathers, and three white outer-tail feathers. The female has an olive-gray cap, tan breast, greenish or pinkish neck feathers and one or two white outer-tail feathers. Juveniles lack iridescent feathers.

# Ask A Trooper: Ticket Quotas? Farm Trailers?

by Sgt. Troy Christianson, MN State Patrol

**Question:** I was talking with a friend the other day and the topic of "quotas" came up. He told me that cops have to write a certain amount of tickets each month otherwise they get in trouble. He also said this is why you see so many more out on the streets and highways at the end of the month trying to get their numbers in. Is this true?

**Answer:** No, traffic citation quotas are prohibited in Minnesota. State Statute 169.985 says, "A law enforcement agency may not order, mandate, require, or suggest to a peace officer a quota for the issuance of traffic citations, including administrative citations

authorized under section 169.999, on a daily, weekly, monthly, quarterly, or yearly basis."

Through education and enforcement, the Minnesota State Patrol strives to reduce fatalities and injuries on our roads. Illegal or unsafe speed is a leading contributing factor in Minnesota's fatal crashes — accounting for at least 80 deaths annually. Two-thirds of those deaths occur on rural, two-lane roads in Minnesota; young adults are the most common offenders and greatest at risk.

Speeding is not an innocent crime — it puts every motorist at risk on the road:

- Greater potential for loss of vehicle control
- Increased stopping distance
- Slower response time to avoid crashes
- Increased crash severity — the faster the speed, the more violent the crash

**Lack of seat belt use also plays a significant role in contributing to driver and passenger deaths. About half of the motorists killed in Minnesota are not buckled up.**

To keep you and your loved ones safe: Drive the speed limit, buckle up, pay attention, and never drink and drive.

**Question:** What is the law with small farm trailers being exempt from registration? I heard something about a

**10,000-pound limit when being pulled by a regular motor vehicle (not a farm tractor), but I want to know the facts. A neighbor-friend of mine got ticketed for no Minnesota registration for hauling a lot less weight than that on his farm trailer being pulled with a pickup truck, but he thought he was exempt. He was helping me haul some large, old household items to the dump with it, so I kind of feel partially responsible. Thanks for whatever information you can provide.**

**Answer:** Many types of trailers are exempt from registration, but I am sure that what you are referring to is found in M.S.S. 168.012, Subdivision 2a: "Farm trailers with a gross weight of less than 10,000 pounds, drawn by a passenger automobile or farm

truck and used exclusively for transporting agricultural products from farm to farm and to and from the usual marketplace of the owner, shall not be taxed as motor vehicles using the public streets and highways and shall be exempt from the provisions of this chapter."

The reason your neighbor was cited for not having registration is because of the part of the law that says: "...and used exclusively for transporting agricultural products from farm to farm and to and from the usual marketplace of the owner..." Because he was hauling something other than that, he was no longer exempt and had to comply with normal trailer requirements, including registration. The officer probably mentioned this to your friend, who also could

have possibly received other violation charges related to the trailer as well.

I hope this information clears it up for you. If anyone is getting cited by an officer for something and you don't understand something about the violation, just ask the officer to clarify the situation for you.
