



Asparagus Wrapped in Ham

Another Spring treat!

We can now purchase fresh asparagus anytime of the year, but there is nothing like fresh picked asparagus in the spring! The weather wasn't the greatest last week for our grandchildren Hunter and Taylor's visit, but we had a good time anyway. It doesn't seem like kids let cool rainy weather interfere with their fun. Hunter organized card playing tournaments for us, complete with charts to fill in. I won't tell you who the winner was, but it certainly wasn't me!! A beloved member of our family, our daughter in law Melissa (mother to Hunter and Taylor) need your prayers. She will be undergoing surgery on June 9th to remove a brain tumor at St Cloud. I do believe in the power of prayer!

Asparagus wrapped in ham over rice:

1 cup long grain white rice, cooked in 2 1/2 cups water or chicken broth, bring liquid to boil add rice, cover, lower heat and simmer for 15-20 min until liquid gone, set aside.

- 4 Tbsp butter
- 4 Tbsp flour
- 2 cups milk
- salt and pepper to taste in milk
- 1 cup shredded Swiss cheese
- 24 stalks asparagus

6 slices cooked ham, like boiled ham, or deli ham but sliced thicker than shaved. You need to be able to roll it.

Melt butter, add flour and cook 2 minutes, add milk bring to boil until thick, blend gently adding cheese until melted. Add salt and pepper to taste you can also add chopped parsley or dill.

Preheat oven to 350 degrees. Blend 1/2 cup of sauce into rice, spread in shallow baking dish. Roll 4 asparagus stalks in slice of ham, put on top of rice, cover with sauce. Bake for 25-30 minutes until brown on top and bubbly. You can top with buttered ritz cracker crumbs, if you wish, or parsley.







Q-and-A

Dave Bair of Fairmont wrote, "Al, I can live with two or three grackles, but when a dozen dominate the feeders and chase off all other birds but starlings, I get mad. What can be done? I've taken away all the seeds and jelly so they will maybe get out of the habit of coming here. Will they come back when I put out feed again?"

Removing the feeders for a time might lessen the numbers. Uninvited dinner guests are the bane of even the most gracious of hosts. There are ways to curb the onslaught of ravenous grackles other than hiring a crack team of common grackle scarers. Feed nyjer or suet and stop feeding seed mixes. Mixes are right up a grackle's proverbial alley. Feed safflower seeds instead of sunflower seeds. Grackles find safflower the less desirable of the two.

Ask A Trooper: Ticket **Quotas? Farm Trailers?**

by Sgt. Troy Christianson, MN State Patrol

Question: I was talking with a friend the other day and the topic of "quotas" came up. He told me that cops have to write a each month otherwise they get in trouble. He also said this is why you see so many more out on the streets and highways at the end of the month trying to get their numbers in. Is this true?

Answer: No, traffic citation quotas are prohibited in Minnesota. State Statute 169.985 says, "A law enforcement agency may not order, mandate, require, or suggest to a peace officer a quota for the issuance of traffic citations, including administrative citations

authorized under section 169.999, on a daily, weekly, monthly, quarterly, or yearly basis.

Through education and certain amount of tickets enforcement, the Minnesota State Patrol strives to reduce fatalities and injuries on our roads. Illegal or unsafe speed is a leading contributing factor in Minnesota's fatal crashes — accounting for at least 80 deaths annually. Twothirds of those deaths occur on rural, two-lane roads in Minnesota; young adults are the most common offenders and greatest at risk.

> Speeding is not an innocent crime — it puts every motorist at risk on the road:

•Greater potential for 10,000-pound limit when loss of vehicle control

 Increased stopping distance

•Slower response time to avoid crashes

 Increased crash severity — the faster the speed, the more violent the crash

To keep you and your loved ones safe: Drive the speed limit, buckle up, pay attention, and never drink and drive.

Question: What is the law with small farm from registration? I

being pulled by a regular motor vehicle (not a farm tractor), but I want to know the facts. A neighbor-friend of mine got ticketed for no Minnesota registration for hauling a lot less weight than that on his farm trailer being pulled with a pickup truck, but he thought he was exempt. He was helping me haul some large, old household items to the dump with it, so I kind of feel partially responsible. Thanks for information whatever you can provide.

Answer: Many types of trailers are exempt from registration, but I am sure that what you are referring to is found in M.S.S. 168.012, Subdivision 2a: "Farm trailers with a gross trailers being exempt weight of less than 10,000 pounds, drawn by a pas**heard something about a** senger automobile or farm

for transporting agricultural products from farm lated to the trailer as well. to farm and to and from the usual marketplace of the owner, shall not be taxed as motor vehicles using the public streets and highways and shall be exempt from the provisions of this chapter.

The reason your neighbor was cited for not having registration is because of the part of the law that says: "...and used exclusively for transporting agricultural products from farm to farm and to and from the usual marketplace of the owner..." Because he was hauling something other than that, he was no longer exempt and had to comply with normal trailer requirements, including registration.
