The definition of "Slow No Wake" means operation of watercraft at the slowest possible speed necessary to maintain steerage, but in no case greater than 5 MPH.  
The Sheriff's Office will be monitoring and reevaluating this daily. The Slow No Wake will be lifted as soon as possible.

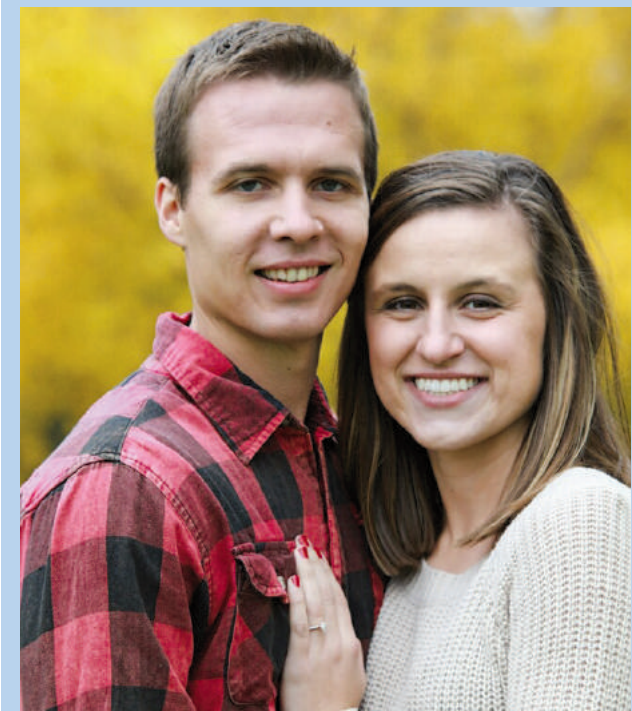

### Youth Triathlon at Fairmont Aquatic Park

We are excited to announce that this year's youth triathlon has been moved to the Fairmont Aquatic Park, and will be the focus on Friday evening before our annual Triathlon, Duathlon and 5k.

Friday, June 14th at 5:15 p.m., the Fairmont Triathlon committee will host a youth triathlon, using the aquatic park for the race location. The youth triathlon is for kids ages 6-15.

Athletes will be swimming in the aquatic park lap pool, biking along South Prairie, and running on the bike/walking trail. The kids will compete in three age group; 6-8, 9-11, and 12-15. With three age groups, we can challenge the racers with three different course distances. Racers in the 6-8 age group will swim 25 meters in the pool (one time across the lap pool, with or without floatation devices). They will then bike on east side of South Prairie for a 1 mile ride. Racers will finish the race with a ¼ mile run along the bike path. Kids who are 9-11 will also

swim 25 meters in the pool (floatation devices also allowed), followed by a 1.8 mile bike and finish with a ½ mile run. Finally, our age 12-15 athletes will be challenged with a 50 meter pool swim (one lap), a 3.5 mile bike and top it off with a 1mile run. The cost to participate in the youth triathlon is \$25, and racers will need a swim suit, their own bike, bike helmet and shoes to run with.

Parents can register their kids for the triathlon by visiting our website at FairmontTriathlon.org. Race day registration will also be available starting at 4:00 p.m. on Friday, June 14th.

By moving the youth triathlon to the pool and making the event our sole focus, we are hoping to begin to grow the race now and in the future. We would also love to have a great turnout from the community to support the youth in their efforts.

# The Most Important Garden

By now your garden is lookin' good. You've planted, fertilized, watered, and weeded. You may have even talked to a few of your plants! (My son Parker would often say, "It's only crazy if it doesn't work.") The results of all your labor? A beautiful garden, fresh gorgeous flowers, or amazing tasty vegetables. The fruits of your labors made manifest in front of you!

I remember my childhood growing up in Belle Plaine and putting in lots

of time in the garden. It was work, but it was also fun. And there was nothing better than fresh tomatoes or strawberries that you had a hand in growing. My father would remind us that God supplied the seed, and we supplied the labor - a good partnership.

I am reminded of gardens when people ask me about their health. Quite often the advice they seek from me is the same advice they would offer others when asked about a successful, healthy gar-

den. However, many people who connect their garden's health with how they care for it do not make the same connection when it comes to their own health. They "get it" when it comes to their garden far more than when it comes to their health.

Think about a symptom like spots on your tomatoes. We all know how a ripe red tomato looks delicious. We must bite into it to really know, but we also know that a blighted or discolored tomato just

doesn't look good to eat. If I suggested that you just get some red spray paint and cover up the spots, you would think I was crazy! It may look better, but it would taste worse, be less healthy, and no one in their right mind would do that! But we treat our bodies that way, don't we?

How about if we planted our watermelons in rock-hard ground and the rain never came. Would you get a hypodermic needle and inject water into the seed? Or put a HUGE pile of fertilizer on it instead? How about we go and buy some Sevin and put it on the roots? Or let's say we clip some branches so everything else grows better?

Or..... how about we try planting in some bet-

ter soil, or give it some water, since that is what it is lacking in the first place? (That Bible parable applies to our physical health as much as our spiritual health!) The suggestions I put forth in that last paragraph border on ludicrous, and yet that is how we treat our bodies in many ways when we are sick.

We take pain pills to cover pain. We take water pills to lose weight without giving a second thought to why we are retaining water. We go on diets to lose weight instead of just focusing on eating healthy. The very fact that some 5-hour energy drinks are so popular proves that we just don't understand.

Is there a 5-hour energy drink for your garden? Of course not, no one would ever buy such a quick fix. Everyone knows that a healthy garden takes time.

Next time you are faced with a health issue, think about how you would approach the same problem in your garden (or your pet for that matter). And remember that chiropractic has always been about long-term correction, never the quick fix. We have always encouraged patients to look at the big picture and not just their immediate symptom. We have one corner of our basement that leaks even with a sump pump, requires the use of a rinse and vacuum and of course we are left with that musty odor for awhile, but I know some of you have had it much worse.

This rhubarb pudding cake recipe is easy to make using fresh or frozen rhubarb. Simple hot water poured over the cake makes a sauce while baking. I like it because it makes a 8 or 9 inch pan so a better size for just the two of us. I hope you will like it.

### Old Fashioned Rhubarb Pudding Cake:

2 cups chopped rhubarb  
1 3/4 cup sugar, divided  
3 Tablespoons butter, softened  
1 tsp. baking powder  
1/4 tsp. salt  
2/3 cup milk  
1/2 tsp. vanilla extract  
1/2 tsp. almond extract  
1 cup flour  
1 tablespoon cornstarch  
2/3 cup boiling water

Cover the bottom of an 8 or 9 inch square pan with rhubarb. Mix 3/4 cup sugar, butter, baking powder, salt, extracts, milk and flour together, pour over rhubarb. Mix together the remaining sugar and cornstarch together, sprinkle over mixture in pan. Pour boiling water over the top. Bake at 375 degrees for 45 minutes. May serve with whipped topping or ice cream.

The family requests memorials be left in Connie's name to the American Red Cross, American Diabetes Association and the American Cancer Society.

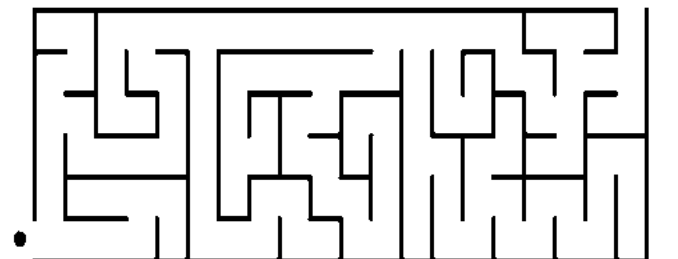

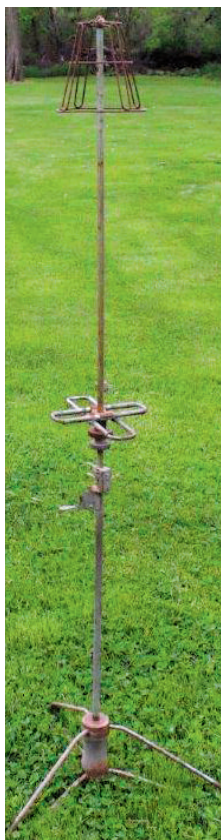

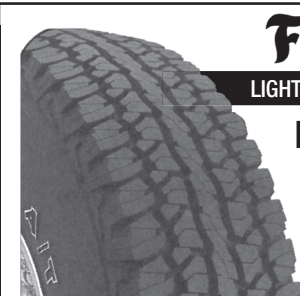

## Low Vision Affects Daily Living

Low vision, or vision loss, is sometimes thought to be part of aging in the older adult population. This is not true. It is not a normal part of aging. Low vision may be the result of an eye disease, a stroke, or a traumatic brain injury, and can occur or be identified at any age. It refers to a visual impairment that is not correctable by glasses or contact lenses, pharmaceuticals (eye drops), or surgery. It might be characterized by partial sight, blurred vision, blind spots, tunnel vision, or total blindness. In cases caused by disease, it usually involves both eyes. As our population ages, more diseases of all types are being noted, such as diabetes, heart, blood pressure, and others. To this list, we can add eye diseases that crop up in the older adult population, namely glaucoma, macular degeneration, cataracts, and diabetic retinopathy. The number of people with eye diseases is expected to increase as the baby boomers hit the golden age.

Low vision comes with its own set of challenges and emotions, impacting the quality of life of those who live with low vision. These

disorders can create an environment of isolation and contribute to mental health problems. Activities such as driving, reading, performing simple household tasks, personal care, and even walking become more difficult or impossible. According to a report by the International Federation of Aging, low vision is the leading cause of age related disability. Falls, social withdrawal and loss of quality of life lead to declared disability.

Vision is an important factor in maintaining balance and the ability to move about safely. Diseases of the eye impact visual acuity, contrast sensitivity, and depth perception. In the home, stairs, carpets, scatter rugs, cords, and toilet seats can be hazardous to those with visual impairment. Inability to discern the exact location of items may lead to falls.

Low vision can lead to social withdrawal and increase the development of depression. Going out in public brings the possibility of someone seeing you stumble or fall, having difficulty eating, or getting lost. It threatens your ability to watch the activities of your grandchildren, and go to the theater or

art exhibits. It becomes easier and less stressful to just stay home and not be embarrassed in public. Withdrawal leads to isolation from the outside world, loss of normal function, loss of mobility from limited movement, and ultimately to depression.

There are tools available to give those with low vision hope to maintain their independence. Treatments for low vision continue to advance. There is adaptive equipment available. Magnifiers, monoculars, computer programs of many types help with visualizing items. There are talking books, GPS systems for walking directions, watches, and clocks. Another help is joining a support group, such as the CREST Low Vision Support Group which will meet June 20th, 1:30 p.m. in the CREST office, 820 Winnebago Avenue in Fairmont. This is a gathering of people with the common problem of low vision, where there is discussion of problems they have encountered, help in investigating solutions, and sharing of resources. Learning how to live with low vision will lead you to a more normal, fulfilling life.

### Naturally

Two inches long when fully grown, eastern tent caterpillars feed on tree leaves during the day and remain in their tents at night and during rainy weather.

A catbird, slim and slate-gray, produced jumbled songs that mimicked other birds. I heard a robin caroling. Donald Kroodsma, in

## Heartland meets with Truman council, commission by the Minnesota Municipal Utilities Association

On May 6th management of Heartland Consumers Power District, Truman's incumbent power supplier, met with the Truman City Council and Truman Public Utilities Commission to tell Heartland's story and describe what Heartland can do for Truman going forward.

Representing Heartland at the meeting were Mike Malone, Chief Financial Officer; Nate Jones, Chief Operations Officer; Casey Crabtree, Director of Economic Development & Governmental Affairs; and Kelly Dybdahl, Customer Relations Manager.

Heartland is a public corporation and political subdivision of the state of South Dakota. Heartland was formed in 1969 under South Dakota's Consumers Power District Law to provide supplemental power above WAPA allocations.

The organization currently serves 19 municipal electric systems in South Dakota, six in Minnesota, three in Iowa and one each in Nebraska and Kansas.

The Heartland Economic Development Loan Program Fund, or HELP Fund, has provided more than

\$6.5 million in loans for infrastructure improvements, regional preparations for growth, and investments in new business. In 2018 the fund made \$2.98 million in loans to 8 recipients, resulting in more than \$10 million in total investments, 175 jobs created or saved, and 3,467 in MWh in new or expanding energy in Heartland's customer communities.

Heartland also offers economic development grants to the communities they serve. More than \$1 million has been awarded in 27 Heartland communities for project financing, business startups, expansions and renovations, infrastructure and community marketing.

Casey Crabtree pointed out that Heartland to date has invested more than \$500,000 in economic development efforts in Minnesota but has not yet received an application from Truman. He stated that he hoped to work with Truman on an economic development project in the near future.

Nate Jones went on to explain Heartland's wholesale demand and energy rates and noted that Heartland pays Truman for its local generating capacity at about

\$1.81 per kilowatt-month, which is substantially higher than the market price of \$0.10 per kilowatt-month.

Jones then explained that Truman is in the ITC transmission zone in MISO, and that ITC's FERC-approved rate is substantially higher than many other MISO zones, and about 80% higher than the MISO-NSP zone.

Heartland conducted a study to determine whether Truman could save on transmission costs by interconnecting with a different facility. Connecting to SMMPA or the local co-op would not provide rate relief because their facilities are also in the ITC zone. Connecting to NSP was evaluated, but the debt service cost on the necessary 15 miles of 69 KV transmission would exceed the savings from a lower zonal transmission charge.

Jones pointed out that Heartland acts as Truman's transmission agent, provides market participant service, load forecasts, demand bids, meter data submittals, PURPA Interconnection assistance, and other services as well.

Heartland then turned to the many benefits of owning a municipal electric utility:

Local control, with local governance and open meeting laws; community ownership in which every citizen has a voice and receives face-to-face customer service; reliability with local crews in town on the job every day; donated and shared services from the utility to the community; and the utility's transfer to the general fund, which enables the city to provide other services at lower cost.

The presentation concluded with Heartland staff expressing their interest in developing a closer relationship with Truman and working with the community to succeed as their partnership continues through the term of their power supply agreement which remains in force until 2041. 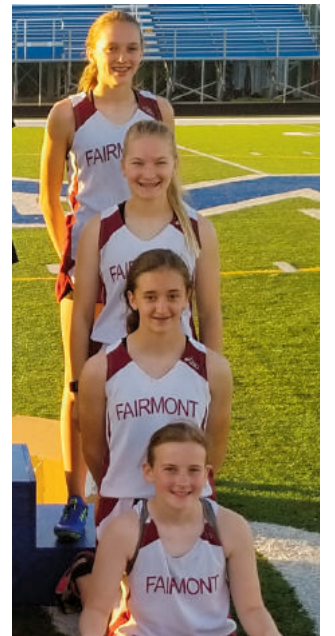

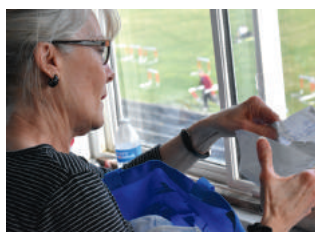
