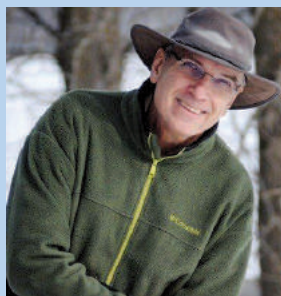

# Dr. Google Kills Another Patient

Before you ask, I will tell you – yes, this headline is “fake news”. Then again, it is very real. The scary thing is you know this doctor. Chances are you are even a patient of his. You seek him out because his knowledge is free. He is available 24/7. He literally has all of the answers.

And he is responsible for the deaths and illnesses of thousands, if not millions of people. And you could be his next victim.

Every time you “look something up” on the internet you are consulting Doctor Google. When you try and find a good supplement that will help you with your latest ailment, when you seek help diagnosing that weird skin rash, or when you go on whatever online store you like to find the best price on the latest miracle supplement, he is there to help. The problem is this: his help and wisdom are

only as good as the questions you ask.

So let’s use an example of “researching” a health condition and see how Dr. Google does. Let’s say your aunt has dementia. It could be Alzheimer’s, it could be something else. So you ask Dr. Google how to treat Alzheimer’s. Remember, you’re not sure if it is Alzheimer’s dementia, dementia of Parkinson’s, Lewy Body dementia, or just normal aging. So neither is Dr. Google. All he knows is that you asked about Alzheimer’s.

So he tells you about a drug called Aricept. It is one of the most commonly prescribed, it tends to help temporarily slow things down, but it is temporary at best and typically doesn’t do much. For it to work, Auntie has to have some problem with a neurotransmitter called acetylcholine, which isn’t very common. By the way,

there is a natural version called huperzine which does the same thing as Aricept without the side effects. Unfortunately, like Aricept, it only offers short-term relief.

So you decide to ask Dr. Google for any natural supplements that may help your aunt. In about .65 seconds he will give you over 3,500,000 results to comb through. Good luck!! You see a few sponsored ads, quite a few websites touting their version of what to do, and a whole lot of confusion. Who do you listen to? Where do you turn?

Herein lies the problem. Dr. Google only knows what you tell him. He does not ask you further questions to help you find out what you really need. This is what I see day in and day out in my functional medicine practice when patients come in with questions about

a supplement (usually one they already bought). Without feedback and some expertise, the information you get online is only as good as your questions. And without the training, experience, and expertise, you rarely know what to ask. So you waste time and money, all the while your answers are right here in Fairmont.

If someone came to me to ask about natural supplements for Alzheimer’s (I have received certification in the only protocol to have shown reversal of dementia), I would have a number of questions to ask first. What kind of dementia do they really have? Do their blood tests show inflammation? What about dysglycemia, toxicity, neurohormonal aberrations, vascular degeneration? I would insist on a blood test to help us focus in on what’s really going on. Most people with dementia have two or more causes, so you really can’t guess. Why not just try something like ginkgo biloba? Ginkgo only helps if the problem is only vascular. How about curcumin? Which

kind? Some work better in the brain, some won’t even get to the brain, some work better in the GI.

Another big challenge with Dr. Google is his supplier. Let’s say you find out that curcumin is a really good supplement to help with your aunt’s dementia. The right kind can sure help with certain kinds of dementia. So you find a company that sells one with piperine in it to enhance absorption. (Dr. Google would call that “bioavailability”. This time he would be right.) You go to your favorite online store and find a supplier with the best price, maybe even free shipping. You click, and in a few days it is in your mailbox. You open the bottle; you swallow a few pills, and then wait for the miracle. While you are waiting consider this: many online sellers sell expired product. Check your bottle for this. Many sell pirated product. Some have been found to make fake bottles and put in fake pills. Then you buy them and wonder why they aren’t working. Did Dr. Google tell you that one?

My suggestion? Take advantage of local experts in these fields. Unlike many other small towns, you have more than one choice right here in Martin County. Rather than wasting hours looking up one supplement we can usually tell you in five seconds if it is right for you. We can make sure what you get is high quality, and not just the cheap stuff that may or may not even have actual supplement in it. And we’ll be there to follow up to help you take the next step. I have spent thousands of hours obtaining my Master’s Degree in Clinical Nutrition, and researching and constantly learning since then. I am currently completing my Certification as a Functional Medicine Practitioner. And at Burtis Chiropractic we only carry pharmaceutical grade supplements.

So keep using Google when you want to check in on the weather, or vacations, or the Kardashians. But leave your health care to the real doctors. That’s a healthy choice. You don’t believe me? Google it!!

## Ask A Trooper: Motorcycle Trailer

**Question: I am planning on taking a motorcycle trip across the country. Does a trailer pulled behind a motorcycle need to be registered?**

**Answer:** If you are pulling a trailer, it must be registered according to its weight. If the trailer is lightweight it may be permanently registered as a utility trailer or as an RV under 1,500 pounds. The trailer registration is separate from the motorcycle’s registration. You can avoid a ticket —

and a crash — if you simply buckle up, drive at safe speeds, pay attention and always drive sober. Help us drive Minnesota Toward Zero Deaths.

## The rhubarb is ready!

It seems like my rhubarb was just coming up and suddenly its more than ready to use! The next couple of weeks I will be sharing a couple of my favorite rhubarb recipes, It always hits the spot this time of year! Today's recipe comes from the Taste of Home magazine, I hope that you enjoy it.

**Rhubarb Sour cream Coffee Cake**  
3/4 cup butter, softened  
1 1/2 cups sugar  
3 large eggs, room temperature  
1 1/2 tsp. vanilla  
3 cups all purpose flour  
2 tsp. baking powder  
1 tsp. baking soda  
1/4 tsp. salt  
1 cup sour cream  
3 cups chopped fresh rhubarb

**Topping**  
1/2 cup packed brown sugar  
1/4 cup all-purpose flour  
1 tsp. ground cinnamon  
1/4 cup cold butter

Cream butter and sugar until fluffy, add eggs, one at a time beating after each addition, add vanilla, mix. In another bowl, whisk together flour, baking powder, baking soda and salt. Add to creamed mixture alternately with sour cream. Fold in rhubarb, spread in greased 9x13 inch baking pan. For topping, combine brown sugar, flour and cinnamon. Cut in butter until mixture resembles coarse crumbs, sprinkle over batter. Bake at 350 degrees until a toothpick inserted in center comes out clean 45-50 minutes, cool.

The heat from last week helped make the planted items in the ground really pop out quickly this year. It was amazing to see the neighbor's corn that was just planted a week before come up and be tall



enough to row it in a short time. A lot of crop got planted in our neighborhood late last week and over the weekend. Only a few potholes remain unplanted in our neck of the woods now. Our own garden that Karis and I planted a couple weeks ago is finally starting to look like it is supposed to with vines growing and onions about a foot tall already. Of course, along with the

growth of the seeds we planted are the many varieties of weeds that are growing in our garden plots. We plant our garden European-style, with small plots (about 4 feet wide and 8 feet long) and grass in between each plot. We have found that it is much easier to tend the garden this way, plus it helps a lot on weed control. Another advantage with the

heat and moisture is the many lawn clippings we have been able to place around our planted items in the garden to aid in weed control. So, how is your garden growing?

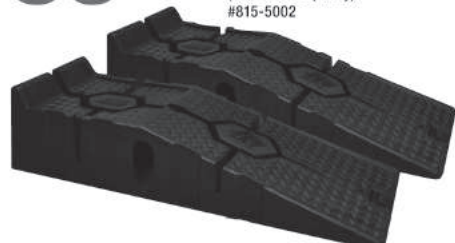

## Cancer survivor Joe McAleavy's story

Joe McAleavy is a proud Marine and works at 3M. He is celebrating 5 years of remission. This is Joe's story:

"I had a deep chest cough all summer. I had been trying to lose some weight but seemed to be losing more than I was trying to. In the fall I was going to Montana when the cough flared up again.

I thought I would go to the Walmart Clinic and get some antibiotics and take care of it. The nurse thought it could be my heart so she sent me out to Mayo Clinic Health Systems-Fairmont. They were waiting for me and did a chest x-ray. Sarah the PA said the x-ray showed a big blob in the chest. She recommended that I not go to Montana but she was from Colorado so she knew I was going anyway. They gave me

antibiotics and told me to come in as soon as I got



back. When I went in she told me I had Lymphoma they didn't want to ruin my vacation by telling me before I left. I said that's cancer right, she said yes Lymphoma, she did not want to use the word cancer. They did a CT scan and set up appointments in Rochester.

I went to a pulmonary

doctor but he said it is not the lungs and sent me to a hematologist. I had a month of tests, scans and a biopsy. It was determined that it was Hodgkin's Lymphoma. The PET scan showed hot spots all over my chest. The mass was pushing on my lungs and I had cancer throughout my chest. I wasn't scared about the diagnosis but thinking about my family. This diagnosis was the second time in my life I thought about mortality.

The first time was when I was a young 20 year old Marine and seeing my buddies not come home makes you think

that could be you too. I was thinking about the future but felt peaceful about it. I had been around the world two times during my time in the Marines so I had seen many things in my past. They said it could be stage 2 or 4. It turned out to be Stage 2. I was scheduled for 4 months of chemo. Two months into the chemo we discussed radiation. They were going to do it through my heart and lungs. Knowing what can happen 15 to 20 years down the road after doing radiation I didn't want it. Two months of chemo were added to replace the radiation. I ended up doing six months of chemo. The chemo was tough and the steroids kicked my butt. It really took me down. I couldn't even walk around the block without stopping. After the chemo was done it was really hard to get my body back in shape so I

could function correctly. I had to work really hard at it and just kept pushing on.

When I was first diagnosed I bought a journal. Towards the end of everything I was sitting in the lobby waiting for an appointment and writing my bucket list in my journal. An elderly couple sat down by me. The husband was 3 years in remission and there for a checkup. He asked me what I was doing and I told him. He told me to get rid of the bucket list and do what you want every day. Don't put things off because you don't have time, the means or for some other excuse. Go ahead and do those things every day. Live life, work, have some fun. Stop saying no. I thought about it all day and on the way home. How many times do you let life take control? I took that mentality and lived it. Stop

with the excuses. We are given one life and we need to enjoy what is put in front of you and not say "I can't now" or some other excuse.

To celebrate my 5 years of remission I am doing something I have always wanted to do - skydiving and after that I will drive 5 hours to my best friend's daughter's graduation. Before I made the decision not to put things off I wouldn't have done both these things in one day. I hope reading about my journey and the outlook I have on life will inspire interest in people to come out to Relay for Life to celebrate the Survivors and remember those that have lost their fight."

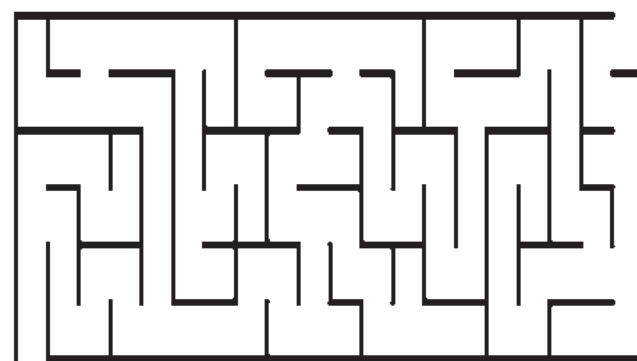

## Cancer survivor Zac Gerhardt's story

Zac Gerhardt is owner operator of Zac's Sales and Service in Sherburn. He's married to Lia and has two children: Landon 4 and Kollyns 3. This is Zac's story:

"I was diagnosed with an extremely rare form of Hodgkin's Lymphoma in February of 2015. I was not ready for the diagnosis.

The first thing I thought of was my daughter who was only one month old. I wanted her to know who her Dad was and I wanted financial stability for my wife and kids if something

should happen to me. The doctors figured that I had it for 5 years. It was technically Stage 4 as it was affecting the bone marrow.

As bad as it sounds, we were told the cure rate was 90% and for my age and health they saw no reason the treatment wouldn't be successful. Chemo was every three weeks until July and then re-evaluate.

This cancer was supposed to stay in one place and then I could have radiation but it didn't. It popped up in more places so radiation wouldn't

work. I did not have the right cancer markers for a lot of the chemo treatments and I had medical issues with some of the chemo we tried. In July I tried a different type of chemo that seemed to be working. With the chemo shrinking the cancer I was eligible for an Autologous ("Auto")

Stem Cell Transplant. That means I used my own stem cells.

On December 7th, 2015 I started the process of the



stem cell transplant in Rochester that takes six to eight weeks. Stem cells were removed from my

blood through very powerful chemo to prepare to receive my new stem cells. I had some complications but my new stem cells

were finally transplanted back into my body through my port. You have to stay within 15 minutes of the hospital in case of complications which can be extreme. This procedure can produce remission of the cancer which we were hoping would be the case. The next PET scan looked good.

I continue to go to Rochester for checkups and scans. Right now I have a small spot that shows up but it is growing very slowly so it will be a watch and wait time. We will decide if it starts to grow faster what to do

then the issue will be if we can find something that will work to treat it. I have accepted the fact that there may not be anything to stop it when and if it starts to grow and I am good with it. Now I know my family will be OK. I consider myself in remission. I feel great and nothing holds me back. I live my life and enjoy my family every day."

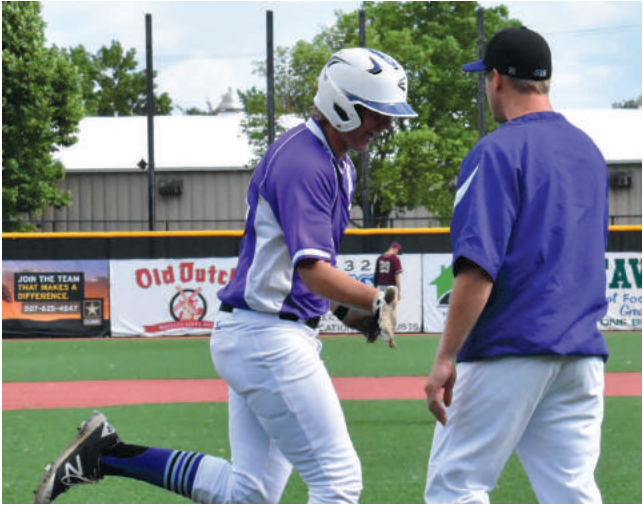
