A. L. Ward's Account of Early Martin County

Albert L. Ward was perhaps one of the most influential people in Martin County's history in terms of his contributions to the development of both Fairmont and Martin County. Ward spent 67 years in Martin County, during which time he was a farmer, a banker, a lawyer, and a businessman, as well as serving in a number of public offices. He was obviously an entrepreneur well ahead of his time. The following is a synopsis



of his account of pioneer days in Martin County from the August 6, 1926 issue of the Martin County Independent and why he chose to leave New York State to come to Fairmont.

Ward characterized Fairmont in the early 1860s as being on the frontier with a line of forts, called stockades, from the north at Fort Ridgely running south to Fort Dodge, Iowa. Fairmont was the central point between them. These forts were generally made of logs and sod with a detachment of cavalry and infantry being stationed at each.

When Ward was a patient at the Soldier's Hospi-

tal in Elmira, New York, he became acquainted with some soldiers, including his Army Surgeon, that had been stationed along the frontier near Fairmont. The surgeon told him of Fairmont's beautiful location on the lakes, its healthful climate, and invigorating air. The surgeon also told Ward that he wouldn't live another year if he chose to stay in the New York climate.

Consequently, in 1863 Ward was given a furlough with permission to come to Minnesota and report to the commanding officer at Fort Snelling. Upon reaching St. Paul he was given a physical examination and told that he had better return to New York. However, after further discussion he was given a virtual release from the Army and allowed to continue as he had previously planned.

Ward made his way by boat from St. Paul to Red Wing. He then went on to Zumbrota, Faribault, Owatonna, and Albert Lea by stage. Next, he made his way from Albert Lea to Winnebago by taking a ride with a United States mail driver. This was the early spring and not a mile of railroad was in operation in the entire state of Minnesota.

While staying at Winnebago, he met a genuine frontiersman named "Trapper Johnson." Johnson provided Ward with the name of a person, Mr. Hayworth, that lived in Fairmont that was soon leaving Winnebago to go

home. Taking the opportunity to accompany Hayworth and his oxen team, they left Winnebago heading for Fairmont. Ward described Fairmont at that time as being little more than a log fort with a few settlers scattered around the lakes living in log and sod houses. The south part of North Avenue, now Downtown Plaza, was mostly a slough. Ward went to the "Budd Hotel," located at the top of what is now the intersection of Albion Avenue and Woodland Avenue, on April 28, 1864.

Ward's experience in staying the night at the "Budd Hotel" was quite interesting. His description of the area was that the trees were budding into full leaf and the setting sun's reflection on the lake was beautiful. He enjoyed a hearty supper of fried pork, eggs, and corn mush along with coffee. He was told that if he wanted a bed he had better take one shortly as other travelers may soon be arriving. He was shown a chamber serving as sleeping quarters that was accessible by a ladder. It was a full size room measuring fourteen by sixteen feet. He was told to pick out the bed of his choice. He only saw one, as the room was covered with quilts, which he took and went to bed early as he was tired from the twenty-four mile oxen team ride that day.

When he awoke the next morning he was surprised to see that the en-

tire floor was covered with people that came in during the night and had gone to bed without waking him. He had the problem as to how to get dressed and how to get to the ladder without stepping on the people sleeping. However, they soon awakened and moved around so that he could dress and go to breakfast.

Ward then spent some time inspecting the local area looking for a place to stake a claim. He decided to homestead in the west half of section 9 in Fairmont Township.

According to Ward, the only building in the Fairmont town site at that time was Fort Fairmount. It was a log fort about fifty feet from the court house. Inside was a wooden building that, according to Ward, had been started for a courthouse but then occupied by the officers. It only had a roof, siding and floor. The horses had an enclosure along the west and the cook house and mess room was a little log

building about twelve feet by twelve feet. Weather permitting, they ate and slept outdoors. In bad weather, they slept inside the wooden building.

At that time, according to Ward's account, the mail came once weekly, there wasn't a mile of established road between Fairmont and Winnebago, there were no bridges or culverts, no fences, no pastures, only one house between Fairmont and the Blue Earth River, and the cattle had bells and were trained to come home at night. He went on to say that the hospitality of the people on the prairie was exceptional. No one was ever refused lodging wherever they stopped for the night. Churches were the only places of amusement. The missionary societies supported three ministers in the county and people would travel a long distance to attend their meetings, not necessarily specifically for church attendance, but rather to have the opportunity to

see and visit with their neighbors.

In summary, Albert L. Ward arrived in Fairmont in 1864 at the age of twenty-two. He was in poor health, he weighed less than 100 pounds, and he had no measurable wealth. However, he recognized the opportunity and potential of this area. He was a natural leader holding numerous public offices in the area including county attorney, county auditor, register of deeds, superintendent of schools, postmaster, state senator, and he served as a member of the 1892 World's Fair Commission. Described as "a bundle of tireless energy," he was also a farmer, an attorney, a banker who founded the Martin County National Bank, and a newspaper man. He was obviously goal oriented, driven, and made his mark on the rich and colorful history of Martin County.

Cream of Asparagus Soup

Soup in the summer?

I usually think of soup as being a fall and winter dish, but in the last few years, I have seen recipes for cold fruit soups. These soups use fresh fruit, yogurt and juice of some sort and they're served for a brunch or dessert. Then there are vegetable soups served cold using fresh veggies with a tomato juice base and spices. Today I am sharing a recipe that can be served either cold or hot - your choice. It's equally good served either way. I hope that you agree!

Cream of Asparagus Soup:

2 lbs asparagus, trimmed, cut off tips (set aside) and cut stalks into 2 inch chunks
6 Tbsp butter
1 cup coarsely chopped onion
6 Tbsp flour
2 cans chicken broth
2 cups half and half
1 Tbsp dill weed
salt and pepper to taste

Steam asparagus tips in small amount of water for 1 minute; cool in ice water, drain and set aside. Melt butter. Add chopped asparagus stalks and onion; cook for 8-10 minutes until onion and asparagus tender, add flour, cook 2-3 minutes, then add broth and cook for 10 minutes. Puree in small batches in blender, then add half and half, return to soup pot, add dill weed, salt and pepper, reheat gently, add cooked asparagus tips. Serve hot or cold.

Ask A Trooper: Kneeboarding legal?

Question: With all the recent rain the ditches are full of water. The other day, I noticed some people driving down the road pulling a person hanging onto a rope and knee boarding in the water in the ditch. Is this legal?

Answer: This is illegal and unsafe. Here is what Minnesota State Statute 169.46 says about hitching behind vehicles - "No person shall hitch a toboggan, hand sled, bicycle, or other similar device onto any motor vehicle or street-car while being used on a

highway." In other words, keep it behind the boat. I would encourage some common sense to go along with Summer almost here!

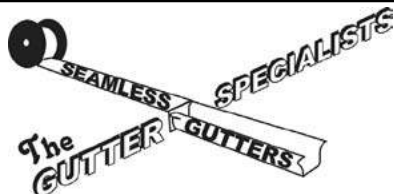

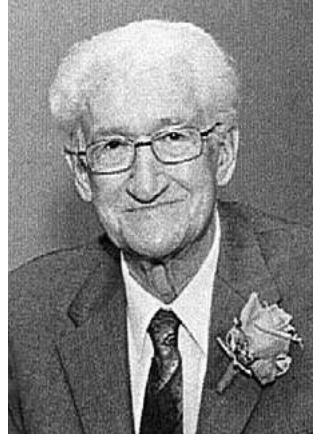

The morning chorus was at full throttle. A catbird sang an endless loop of what sounded improvised.

I looked at an oak tree that I'd planted. It had grown tall, evidence of time's passage.

A house wren chased a chipmunk. The chipmunk, cheek pouches bulging with sunflower seeds, was 6 inches long and weighed 3 ounces, while the wren was 4 1/2 inches long and weighed .4 ounces. Size didn't matter. The chipmunk made a high-pitched "cheep" alarm sound before beating a hasty retreat.

Young starlings, gray and noisy, made harsh demands for food. The raspy voices of the fledglings filled the yard as they shadowed their parents.

The varied charms of a yellow-billed cuckoo became evident in an open space amid the leaves. A robin sang its rain song, a softer version of its typical "Cheerily, cheer-up, cheer-up, cheerily!" song.

Dr. Leroy Titus Weeks, who I believe was once a rector at an Episcopal Church in Emmetsburg, Iowa, claimed the robin was saying, "Pillywink, pollywog, poodle, poodle. Pollywog, poodle, pillywink, pillywink. Poodle, poodle, pillywink, pollywog."

It's hard to argue with

that.

Donald Stokes defined it as, "More wet, cheer up."

My boyhood ears heard it as, "Cheer up, more rain, cheer up."

Q-and-A

"Why are grackles pooping on my sidewalk?" You've offended them. Not really. In the Rio Grande Valley of Texas, great-tailed grackles are so numerous that they darken the sky and whiten sidewalks. Their fly-by pooping is a result of a need to go. Everybody goes. At this time of the year, the common grackles aren't bombarding your sidewalk with their own droppings. It's routine nestkeeping. Baby grackles produce waste in mostly white, fecal sacks that the parents carry away from the nest, targeting a specific bombing site, which oddly enough is seldom a Target store. They sell diapers there. The next big thing will be grackle diapers. Grackles want to hide nest locations from predators. Dropping the fecal sacks into water disperses the fecal matter and reduces the smell. Sidewalks might resemble water, especially after a rain. Birdbaths, automobiles and my garage door also make attractive disposal spots. Cheer up, you could own a swimming pool.

"When are fawns born?" Most white-tailed deer are born in late May or early June. They usually weigh about 7 pounds. Twins are common. They lose their spots when 3 to 4 months old.

"What is making a clucking noise in my yard?" Do you raise chickens? If so, that's your answer. If not, it could be a chipmunk, blue jay, crow

or the diurnal clucker. No one has ever seen a diurnal clucker, which makes it a yeti.

"Will marigolds keep rabbits away from my garden?" No, but rabbits will keep marigolds away. Rabbits eat marigolds.

"Why are wood ticks in trees?" Wood ticks, also called dog ticks, aren't found in trees. I get them in the grass on my way into and out of woods.

Rick Mammel of Albert Lea asked if robins reuse nests. Robins don't reuse last year's nests, but may build a nest on top of one in a prime location. Robins have strong instincts to build new nests each year. Some use the same nest a second time during a breeding season. If a brood was successfully raised, a robin might build a new floor for the nest and raise another family in it. It's not uncommon for mourning doves to use old robin nests.

Twirl a squirrel

I had a squirrel-twirl feeder. It had three wood-

en arms connected to a center pivot. Each arm had a spike protruding from its end. An ear of corn was impaled on each. When mounted on tree or post, the feeder rotated when it felt the weight of a squirrel. The idea was that the acrobatic rodents could take only a couple of kernels at a time. That was the plan. The squirrels didn't get the memo. One squirrel pulled an arm free, carried it to the top of a tall tree and wedged it into a crook. That's where it remains.

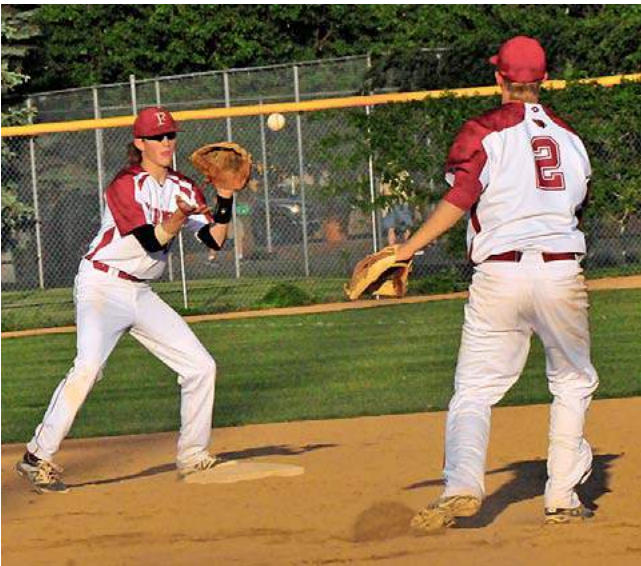



5 simple tips for safe towing

- Inspect and maintain. Towing a heavy load puts tremendous stress on any vehicle, no matter how powerful it is. Routine

maintenance is especially important in this situation. Make sure your vehicle is in good condition as towing stress can quickly make small issues larger.

- Exaggerate margin



for error. Driving too fast increases the sway of the trailer and makes it more difficult to stop quickly. It's important to have enough room between other vehicles, take wide turns and know the trailer's tunnel clearance.

Benjamin Franklin said that, "an ounce of prevention is worth a pound of cure." This logic certainly applies to towing. Taking common sense measures will greatly decrease the chance of towing mishaps that quickly derail the best-laid plans.

Ask A Trooper: DUI Restrictions in Canada

Question: I am planning a fishing trip to Canada and one of my friends was arrested for DUI a few months ago, is he able to get into Canada with a DUI on his record?

Answer: Driving under the influence of alcohol is a serious offense in Canada and the officer can refuse you entry into Canada if you have been convicted of this. This can be fixed via one of two methods depending on the length of time passed since the conviction.

Option 1: For DUI and convictions less than 5 years old: An application for a Temporary Resident Permit (TRP) will allow travel into Canada for business and/or pleasure.

Option 2: For DUI and Convictions over 5 years old: A rehabilitation permit may be applied for allowing permanent hassle free travel into Canada.

Regardless of the nature of any conviction whether it be a DUI, misdemeanor or felony, all alcohol related convictions are treated seriously. It is always best to tell the truth when speaking with a Canada Border Services Agency (CBSA) officer because if a lie is uncovered you may be refused entry into Canada in the future and they will also do an extensive search on your vehicle.

Trooper Troy recommends staying on the Minnesota side to keep the money within our State and you are also able to keep more than one Walleye, too.

Despite the port of entry or method of transportation used to cross into Canada, you can be denied entry for a DUI. Some examples include:

- You arrive by air at a Canadian airport
- You are not driving and only a passenger in a private or commercial vehicle
- Leaving a ship docked at a Canadian Harbor

4 tire tips for teen drivers

(BPT) - Getting a driver's license is a pivotal moment for many teens, and with the privilege of driving comes greater freedom and independence. For parents, this can be both a moment of great pride and overwhelming anxiety.

It's not surprising that teen drivers fall into a higher collision risk category given their inexperience. Additionally, teens are more likely to speed, text, drive without a seat belt and they typically maintain a closer following distance than more seasoned drivers.

"Taking the time to talk to teens about their driving practices can help prevent accidents," says Bob Abram, product planning manager for Yokohama Tire Corporation, maker of a variety of truck and car tires. "Teaching teens about proper vehicle maintenance - especially tires - is also important and often overlooked."

Underinflated tires can also increase the stopping distance of a vehicle, warns Abram. "Taking care of your tires properly can help prevent skidding, aid in emergency stops and traffic avoidance maneuvers, as well as provide more traction on wet roads."

Today's tire technology gives teen drivers an added advantage on the road, according to Abram. "We've taken compound technology from our racing products and adapted it to our everyday tires like the GEOLANDAR HT G056 and AVID Ascend to improve durability and grip, so you and your teenage driver can feel confi-

dent and safe."

Abram reiterates that parents should teach teens about tire care to optimize vehicle control and maximize safety. Here are a few of his rules of thumb concerning tire care:

* Tires must be replaced before the tread wears down below 2/32 of an inch. A quick and easy tread test involves placing a penny into the grooves of the tire. If Lincoln's head is completely visible, the tires should be replaced.

* Check tire pressure at least once a month. Con-

sult the vehicle's owner's manual or placard on driver's door to determine proper tire pressure. Tire pressure should be checked when the tires are cold.

* Alignment should be checked at least once a year or if the vehicle is pulling to one side to avoid uneven wear on tire tread. Tire balance should also be monitored.

* Regular rotation of tires promotes even wearing of tread. Tires should be rotated every 5,000 to 8,000 miles.
