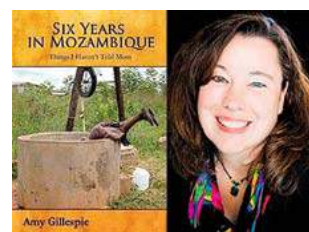

WFS Foundation Gives to Local Backpack Food Programs

WFS is making a concerted effort to help fight child hunger in local communities by contributing \$20,000 to area backpack food programs. The communities include: Blue Earth Area School District, United South Central School District, NRHEG School District, GHEC School District, St. James Area School District, Madelia School District, Butterfield-Odin School District, Truman School District, Fairmont Area School District, Maple River School District, and MCW School District.

Merlyn Kruger, WFS Vice President of Feed and the driving force behind this contribution said, "Right now there are children living in households that struggle to meet their food needs; food is fuel - healthy kids equal a healthy community."

These Backpack Programs are part of an initiative by community members, teachers and businesses to ensure that less fortunate children have the balanced, nutritious food they need to learn and grow. The concept is simple: children at risk of weekend hunger receive a bag of food that is child-friendly, nutritious, nonperishable, and easy to prepare. Each Backpack

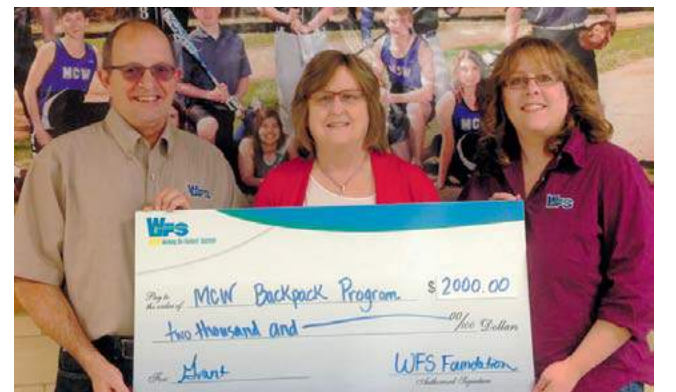
offers enough food that children can easily assemble into six healthy meals over the weekend.

"School breakfast and lunch programs can only meet the needs of children five days a week. The Backpack Program provides food for the weekend to help meet children's nutritional needs when these other programs are not available," Kruger commented.

WFS first learned about the child hunger issue in our area this past summer when WFS partnered with Nutra Blend and Elanco Animal Health to put on a "Drive to Feed Kids" event in an effort to raise money to support local Backpack programs. The event was successful, but more funding was needed.

"The Drive to Feed Kids event was positive, but didn't meet our expectations or the needs of the local Backpack programs," Kruger said. "We're hoping our \$20,000 contribution, along with the money raised at the event, will help even more in preserving these programs."

The Backpacks are distributed to children in need through the school system—discreetly—each Friday afternoon or before a long holiday weekend.

National Sheep Show Comes to Fairmont

Last week at the Martin County Fairgrounds in Fairmont the livestock barns were filled... with sheep. For the first time, Fairmont hosted the National Columbia Sheep Show and Sale. This show happens only once a year and this year, it was decided that it would take place in Minnesota for only the second time in its history. People from all over the country flocked to the National show to hopefully bid on the perfect sheep to complete their herd.



This year included show-ers and sellers from Ohio to California.



Fairmont was chosen to host the show this year for a combination of reasons. The Columbia Sheep Breeders Association of America decided it was time to return to this area and the location on the I-90 corridor made it an ideal stop.



“There is a cooperative sale board here who was and has been great to work with,” says Leland Thiesen, sheep showman and member of the working board. Thiesen is from Win-

dom and has been in the sheep business for many years. His family is also in-

involved including his seven grandchildren. “It’s a family thing,” he says smiling. “For some families this is the most important event of the year.”

This show takes precedence because it isn’t an average sheep show. This is when all the best

Columbian sheep in the United States come together to show and sell. “These are considered a dual purpose breed. They have good wool quality and fast growing market



lambs,” Thiesen says.

The sheep are between four months to eighteen months old according to Thiesen. Their handlers have a greater age range being anywhere from six years to eighty years. Those contenders under 21 years of age compete in the Junior Show. The Junior Show took place last Thursday and had around

70 head of sheep this year. Those above 21 years vie in the National Show. This year it took place on Friday and had around 200 head of sheep registered.

Both the Junior and National Show have eight different classes in which to show sheep. Classes are separated by the gender of the sheep and then the age. Winners are selected

from each class and then an over-all grand champion ewe and grand champion ram are named.

Champions receive trophies and then receive the privilege of being the first put up for sale. The National Columbia Sale took place on Saturday after the shows were finished. According to Thiesen, you are “competing to sell in the sales.” You want to sell in the beginning as it shows you have the best sheep.

While the public was able to watch free of charge, sellers paid a fee of \$10 per ewe and \$20 per ram. The honor of winning the acclaimed trophy, however, is well worth the minimal entrance fee and long drive through many states.

Next stop for the National Columbia Sheep Show and Sale - Ohio.

Summer Macaroni Salad

Family Reunion time!

Thank you to all of you readers that kept my daughter in law Missy in your prayers, she had successful surgery for removal of a brain tumor and is now home recovering.

Summer is always time for those family reunion potluck picnics. I tried a new side dish recipe for a macaroni salad from one of the latest issues from Taste of Home. I liked it so well I have made it twice, I think it's a nice alternative to potato salad and faster to make too, something a little different to take to a potluck picnic. I hope that you will enjoy it too!

Summer Macaroni Salad:

- 1 pkg. (16 oz.) elbow macaroni (I used tri color rotini)
- 1 cup Spin Blend salad dressing
- 2 Tbsp milk
- 2 Tbsp red wine vinegar
- 1 Tbsp sugar
- 1 1/2 tsp salt
- 1/4 tsp garlic powder
- 1/4 tsp pepper
- 1 medium sweet yellow, orange or red pepper, finely chopped
- 1 medium onion, finely chopped
- 2 Roma tomatoes, chopped
- 1 stalk celery, finely chopped
- 2 Tbsp fresh parsley, chopped

Cook the pasta according to package directions, drain, rinse with cold water and drain again. In small bowl, mix the salad dressing, milk, vinegar, sugar and seasonings until blended. In a large bowl combine the pasta, peppers, onion and celery. Add the dressing and toss gently to coat. Refrigerate covered for at least two hours or longer until cold, Sprinkle with parsley before serving.

Ask A Trooper: How Fast Can I Drive?

by Sgt. Troy Christianson, MN State Patrol

Question: How fast can I drive before getting stopped? Is there a tolerance?

Answer: The short answer is the speed limit and there is no tolerance. The reality is that there is no set allowance for speed by officers except the speed limit or to the conditions. This is a common question. State Patrol policy does not allow for any speeds in excess of the posted limit.

Officers have to go by their departmental policy, the totality of circumstances, all other conditions (road, weather, lighting and traffic), and common sense. Speeding and driving too fast for the conditions is discouraged by law enforcement everywhere.

Each year, illegal or unsafe speed is a leading contributing factor in Minnesota's fatal crashes accounting for at least 130 deaths annually, of which 70 percent occur on rural, two-lane roads in Minnesota. Young adult motorists are the most common offenders and those at greatest risk.

Speeding is not an innocent crime — it puts every motorist at risk on the road:

- Greater potential for loss of vehicle control.
- Increased stopping distance.
- Less time available for driver response for crash avoidance.
- Increased crash severity — the faster the speed, the more violent the crash.

Remember too, that fines double when going 20 or more over the limit and if you are going over 100 mph, you can lose your license for up to six months.

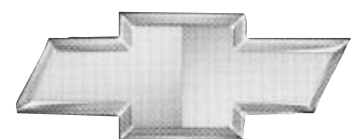

Nature by the yard

Bittersweet nightshade flowered in the brambles of what passes as our yard. The aggressive growth of this beautiful, nonnative plant bothered me, so I decided that I'd pull it. I did. When I yanked it out by the roots, I accidentally dumped three robins from a well-hidden nest. The nestlings would have likely left their home the next day, but I felt guilty subjecting them to an extra day of peril. I herded the three back into the brambles, raspberry canes mostly. Once young robins are big enough to leave a nest, there is no reason to put them back. They won't stay.



The next day, I checked on them. I found two of the fledglings in trees and decided not to search for the third as the parents

had become agitated in my presence.

I looked at the robins a little longer than I might have done normally because I'd just read about a study by Microsoft Corporation that claimed the average human attention span had dropped from 12 seconds in 2002 to only 8 seconds in 2013. That's a second shorter than the attention span of a goldfish.

Scientists have discovered a new species of glass frog in Costa Rica that bears a striking resemblance to Kermit the Frog. On a day of mourning doves and all-day mosquitoes, I hoped that Kermit had an appetite for skeeters.

A robin flew by. I saw the white rear corners of its tail. They were well worth noticing.

Q-and-A

Toni Perschbacher of Albert Lea asked how to discourage crows. Crows are intelligent birds. They

do what comes naturally and that gets them into trouble at times. Owl replicas, recorded distress or alarm calls, pyrotechnics or starting a neighborhood petition asking the crows to move are all equally ineffective in causing crows to vacate. There is a hunting season on crows, even though none of us enjoys eating crow, in areas where allowed. It

helps to keep crows out of food sources. Secure trash. Cover compost or omit food scraps. Feed pets indoors or remove food promptly after they've eaten outdoors. Use feeders that exclude large birds. If crows are problems in the garden, netting might help. Crows are so smart. I've never found a way to discourage their presence. I'm still trying to outsmart just one squirrel. If that should ever happen, I'll move on to trying to outsmart a crow.

"How can I attract robins to my yard?" Provide water and plant berry-producing trees and shrubs.

"Do you have a good photography tip?" Make sure you remove the lens cap on your camera before taking a photo.

"What's biting me on the ankle?" There are so many possibilities. It could be your husband. You know how he is. It could be the neighbor's dachshund. It's hated you since you ran your lawn mower over its favorite squeak toy.

It could be stable flies. They resemble house flies, are about 1/4-inch long and are sometimes called "biting house flies." They inflict a painful bite, feeding on the blood of warm-blooded animals including humans.

Stable flies particularly attack the ankles and are on their worst behavior in early morning and late afternoon. They are strong fliers, capable of flying long distances for a blood meal. They lay their eggs in decaying organic matter such as animal bedding or grass clippings.

"How many eggs does a purple martin have in a clutch?" Clutch size is typically three to six eggs, but Rick Mammel of Albert Lea showed me a nest with seven eggs.

Cherie Daniel of Minnesota Lake saw three adult Canada geese with 25 goslings in their care. She wondered what the story was. Canada geese parents sometimes bring their goslings together in flocks known as "creches" or "gang broods." All the adults look after the goslings. The adults share the babysitting duties. The geese do this brood amalgamation because the goslings are safer with more adults looking out for danger.
