
Fairmont Math League results



Dine-in bars, eateries, etc. closed till March 27

Minnesota Governor Tim Walz announces the closure of Minnesota restaurants and bars to dine-in customers as well as other places of public accommodation and amusement until March 27 at 5:00 p.m.

The major items that will be announced include:

Restaurants, food courts, cafes, coffeehouses, and other places offering food or beverage for onpremises consumption. This excludes institutional and inhouse food cafeterias for businesses, hospitals, and long-term care facilities;

Bars, taverns, brew pubs, breweries, microbreweries, distilleries, wineries, tasting rooms, clubs, other places offer alcoholic beverages for onpremises consumption;

iii. Hookah bars, cigar bars, and vaping lounges offering their products for onpremises consumption;

iv. Theaters, cinemas, museums, and indoor and outdoor performance venues;

Gymnasiums, fitness centers, recreation centers, indoors sports facilities, indoor exercise facilities, exercise studios, and spas;

Places public amusement, including amusement parks, arcades, bingo halls, bowling alleys, climbing indoor skating facilities, rinks, trampoline parks, and other similar recreational or entertainment facilities;

vii. Facilities country clubs, golf clubs, boating or yacht clubs, sports or athletic clubs, and dining clubs.

Mayo offers drive-through screening

Mayo Clinic Health System in Fairmont now offers a drive-through screening process for patients who meet criteria for COVID-19 testing. Transmissions of COV-ID-19 are increasing statewide and across the nation and other institutions have successfully used the drive-through approach.

As a first step, patients must call their Mayo Clinic Health System primary care clinic. A provider or nurse will determine if patients meet criteria and will schedule a drivethrough test. Tests will not be offered to people who have not been prescreened over the phone. The virus spreads rapidly and this process will help minimize potential exposure to other patients and staff.

Patients experiencing symptoms should take the following steps:

•First, call their primary care clinic/provider for a phone screening.

•If they meet the criteria for testing, patients will be directed to the nearest drive-through testing location.

•At the drive-through location, Mayo Clinic Health System staff will collect the specimens using appropriate precautions.

•The specimens will then be sent to Mayo Clinic in Rochester for analy-

•Patients will be advised of next steps.

Mayo Clinic Health System patients who are scheduled for an appointment, hospital procedure or surgery can be assured our facilities are safe. We continue to coordinate with local and regional partners to take the necessary precautions for the safety of patients, staff and our communities. They also went out annually to change batteries for people who needed assistance doing

I suggested holding an ice cream social in the garage at the central fire station. Surely people

would they're come; always curious about firetrucks and what's inside the fire house. A second meeting was held with the fire chief who loved the idea. Another person from the media suggested a name for the event, and just like that, the first annual "Fire and Ice," was underway.



What's Cooking

with Kathy Lloyd

A Frightening time!

When we were looking into my genealogy we discovered that I had two great aunts (my Grandfather Taylor's sisters) and one uncle who passed away in 1917 and 1918 as young adults. My uncle was in France serving in the first world war. I think it was referred to as the Spanish flu then. According to the records it turned into a respiratory /pneumonia complication, and back then they didn't have antibiotics and we didn't have the access to media where we could be given instructions on how to best protect us and our loved ones.

I am guessing many homes didn't even have running water and certainly not hand sanitizer! I hope everyone heeds the warnings and does their best to follow the instructions of our health professionals! Most people my age have underlying conditions and we always worry about my sweet little great grand daughter, Nora. Soon it will be spring and at least we can go out to our yards to get out of our homes. We are going to be very careful and stay close to home for awhile!

We eat a lot of carrots at our house. I am sharing a different way to prepare them with you!

Honey Garlic Butter Roasted Carrots

- 2 # carrots, washed and peeled
- 1/3 cup butter
- 1/3 cup honey
- 4 garlic cloves, minced
- 1/2 tsp. salt
- dash of black pepper
- 2 Tablespoons of fresh chopped parsley or dill

Preheat oven to 425 degrees, lightly grease a large baking sheet with cooking oil spray.

Trim ends of carrots and cut in thirds.

Melt butter in a skillet, pour in honey over medium heat, cook while stirring until completely melted through the butter. Add garlic and cook for 30 seconds until fragrant while stirring. Add carrots and allow the sauce to thicken for a further minute, while tossing the carrots through the sauce, season with salt and pepper.

Transfer carrots to baking sheet in a single layer so they cook evenly, toss to coat. Roast for 20 minutes, or until carrots are fork tender. Broil on high for 2-3 minutes to crisp the edges. Garnish with parsley or dill. Stay safe and have a great week!

Ask A Trooper: Turn on your lights!

by Sgt. Troy Christianson, **MN State Patrol**

Question: I have noseen in the day when they fail to turn on their lights when it is snowing, rainplease explain how dangerous it can be and what the law is that covers this?

Answer: Minnesota law states that every vehicle on a roadway shall display lighted headlamps, lighted tail lamps, and illuminating devices from sunset to sunrise. The law also applies when it's raining, snowing, sleeting, or hailing and at any time when visibility is impaired by weather or insufficient light, at a distance of 500 feet ahead.

event, I noticed many vehicles without their lights on during the heavy snowfall. This can create a very dangerous situation, especially

when visibility is reduced. ticed cars that can't be Being seen can help reduce your chances of being involved in a crash.

Basic automatic heading or foggy. Can you lights work through sensors which detect the amount of light outside. These sensors are located on the dash of the vehicle. The headlights turn on when the sensors detect a certain level of darkness or the level of ambient light.

The problem can be the limitations to automatic headlights. Sometimes they do not turn on during heavy rain, snow or fog, as the light sensor still detects light.





Are young children kept out of the work site while parents work?

Do adults know to never take young children on machinery (tractors, skid steers, ATVs, etc.), including not giving them rides in buckets, instructional seats on laps. This means NO EXTRA RIDERS.

Are keys removed from all equipment when not in use, hydraulics disengaged/de-energized, and all equipment stored in lowest position?

all equipment, especially those with sharp edges (plows, hay mowers, etc.), stored in locked storage areas not accessible to children?

Are large objects that could fall and harm children stored safely and put in areas not accessible to young children (e.g. tires or gates not left leaning against walls)?

Do young children Child/Youth have a designated safe play area, separated from the farm worksite by a barrier (e.g. fence)?

Does an adult/older youth supervise young, non-working children?

Ideally, non-working children should physically separated from the occupational environmental and hazards associated with agricultural worksites. Safe play areas are an alternative to bringing children into the worksite, especially when off-farm childcare is not available.

The National Children's Center for Rural and Agricultural Health and Safety (NCCRAHS) has created a website with tips and resources for creating safe play areas, including training materials and downloadable booklets.

Feedlot permit changes

Public meetings on feedlot permit changes to be online March 31, April 2

Minnesota

permit will be scheduled a.m.-noon Tuesday, March 31, and Thursday, April 2. Logon information and updates



Pollution Control Agency (MPCA) is revising the general operating permit for about 1,200 large feedlots covering Feb. 1, 2021 through Jan. 31, 2026.

Virtual information meetings about the will be posted on the MPCA feedlot permit webpage. Meetings that had been scheduled March 17 at Rochester and March 19 at Mankato have been cancelled.

the Following Minnesota Department

of Health's guidance COVD-19, regarding the MPCA will not be conducting in-person public meetings until after April 30. A formal 30-day public comment

period for the permit will be announced in late early spring or summer.

The permit combines Minnesota rules and statutes with federal regulations of the National Pollutant Discharge Elimination System. It's designed to

protect water quality, primarily from the storage and land application of manure. general permit covers facilities whose operations are similar. About 1,200 large feedlots in Minnesota operate under the current general

permit.

Under proposed changes, waters will more protected from nitrogen leaching and runoff from land application of manure, while feedlot owners will benefit from improved forms and services.

Though substantially similar to the current permit, the general proposed permit includes: Measures to limit nitrates leaching from manure landapplication, and streamlining recordkeeping, permit format, and application process.

Minimize the risk

Produce is grown in the soil and under the sky, and there will always be some risk of contamination. Farmers cannot totally eliminate this risk, but they can minimize it by using best practices to ensure the safety of consumers.

Most farmers are very committed to on-farm food safety, and farmers should not be offended if you ask about their

done in a conversational way, most farmers will be happy to talk about their practices. You need to be comfortable with their answers and, if you're not, find out if they are willing to make some changes or consider not buying from the farmer at that time.

Visiting the farm is a great way to get to know the farmer and their operation. By visiting the farm, you can get a good idea of staff on our food safety the farmer's food safety practices, in combination with a conversation using the following questions as a guide.



TO: ALL PERSONS WITH A LEGAL INTEREST IN THE PARCELS OF REAL PROPERTY DESCRIBED IN THE FOLLOWING DELINQUENT TAX LIST

A list of real property in Martin County on which delinquent real property taxes ad penalties are due has been filed with the district court administrator of Martin County. The list is published to inform all persons that the listed property is subject to forfeiture because of delinquent taxes.

The property owner, taxpayer, or other interested persons must either pay the tax and penalty plus interest and costs or fie a written objection with the district court administrator. The objection must be filed by March 30, 2020 stating the reason(s) why the tax or penalty is not due on the property. If no objection is filed, a court judgement will be entered against the property for the unpaid tax, penalty, interest and costs.

For property under court judgement, the period of redemption begins on May 11, 2020. The period of redemption means the time within which taxes must be paid to avoid losing the property through forfeiture. The period of redemption is three years, with a handful of exceptions. The redemption period is one year for most properties located in a targeted neighborhood, as defined in the Minnesota laws, and for municipal solid waste disposal facilities. The redemption period is five weeks for certain abandoned or vacant properties.

You may also enter into a confession of judgement as an alternative method to paying off the delinquent tax amount and avoiding forfeiture. This allows you to pay the delinquent balance in equal annual installments, with a down payment due at the time you enter into the confession. The length of the installment plan varies: five years for commercial industrial/public utility property; 10 years for all other properties.

If you have homesteaded property, you may be eligible for a Senior Citizen's Property Tax Deferral, which enables seniors to pay just three percent of their total household income and allow remaining amounts to become a lien on the property that may be deferred for later payment. (perhaps upon eventual sale of property).

It should also be noted by property homesteaders that you are ineligible to receive the Property Tax Refund while you own delinquents property tax.

Local governments hold COVID-19 informational meetings

At two special meetings held Monday in Fairmont, concerning COVID-19 pandemic, all officials urged the public not to over-react, but to be alert to changes in policies, schedules.

At the second meeting held at City Hall, Abigail Nesbitt, Martin Emergency County Management Director,

that "It's better to do something, even nothing happens."

In attendance were Fairmont Mayor Debbie Foster, Police Chief Mike Hunter, Ned Koppen, Chamber Director, Mark Sievert, interim city administrator, and Joe Brown, Fairmont Area Schools Superintendent.

Each reported on how their organizations were reacting to the emergency.

bypass the sensors. Many drivers fail to physically turn on their headlights, which will also activate the rear taillights and

marker lights. Drivers might assume the sensors will activate all of the vehicle's lights in reduced visibilities, but that is not always the case.

If your wipers need to

be on, you should also turn on your headlights, taillights and marker lights. When lights are required, manually turn on your headlights to know that all your lights will be on. Also,

make it a habit to check your lights often to ensure they are properly working.

You can avoid a ticket and a crash — if you simply buckle up, drive at safe speeds, pay attention
