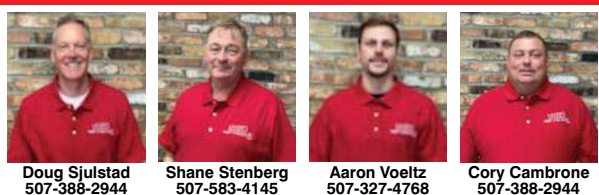

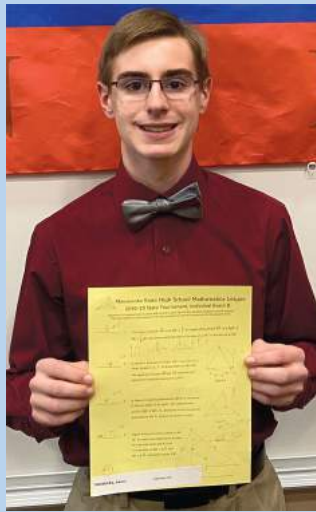
## Fairmont Math League results

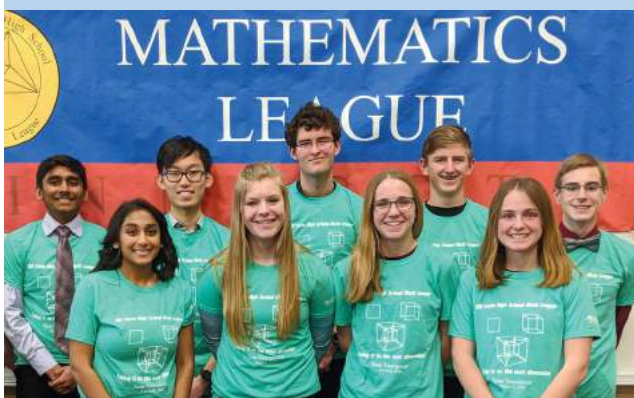

## Dine-in bars, eateries, etc. closed till March 27

Minnesota Governor Tim Walz announces the closure of Minnesota restaurants and bars to dine-in customers as well as other places of public accommodation and amusement until March 27 at 5:00 p.m.

The major items that will be announced include:

- i. Restaurants, food courts, cafes, coffeehouses, and other places offering food or beverage for on-premises consumption. This excludes institutional and in-house food cafeterias for businesses, hospitals, and long-term care facilities;
- ii. Bars, taverns, brew pubs, breweries, micro breweries, distilleries, wineries, tasting rooms, clubs, and other places that offer alcoholic beverages for on-premises consumption;

- iii. Hookah bars, cigar bars, and vaping lounges offering their products for on-premises consumption;
- iv. Theaters, cinemas, museums, and indoor and outdoor performance venues;
- v. Gymnasiums, fitness centers, recreation centers, indoors sports facilities, indoor exercise facilities, exercise studios, and spas;
- vi. Places of public amusement, including amusement parks, arcades, bingo halls, bowling alleys, indoor climbing facilities, skating rinks, trampoline parks, and other similar recreational or entertainment facilities;
- vii. Facilities of country clubs, golf clubs, boating or yacht clubs, sports or athletic clubs, and dining clubs.

## Mayo offers drive-through screening

Mayo Clinic Health System in Fairmont now offers a drive-through screening process for patients who meet criteria for COVID-19 testing. Transmissions of COVID-19 are increasing statewide and across the nation and other institutions have successfully used the drive-through approach.

As a first step, patients must call their Mayo Clinic Health System primary care clinic. A provider or nurse will determine if patients meet criteria and will schedule a drive-through test. Tests will not be offered to people who have not been pre-screened over the phone. The virus spreads rapidly and this process will help minimize potential exposure to other patients and staff.

Patients experiencing symptoms should take the following steps:

- First, call their primary care clinic/provider for a phone screening.

- If they meet the criteria for testing, patients will be directed to the nearest drive-through testing location.

- At the drive-through location, Mayo Clinic Health System staff will collect the specimens using appropriate precautions.

- The specimens will then be sent to Mayo Clinic in Rochester for analysis.

- Patients will be advised of next steps.

Mayo Clinic Health System patients who are scheduled for an appointment, hospital procedure or surgery can be assured our facilities are safe. We continue to coordinate with local and regional partners to take the necessary precautions for the safety of patients, staff and our communities. ## Fairmont school is testing ground for new fund-raising pilot program

Fairmont Elementary is piloting an innovative new fund-raising program this spring that brings the local business community together to help consumers discover what types of great products are offered here.

A catalog, called SUPPORT LOCAL, is a collaboration between AdMfg, Liz Wheeler, and Fairmont Elementary. It is filled with items made in southern

Minnesota and will be shopped around for the last two weeks of March by FES students in grades three through six. Items in the catalog come from busi-

nesses and artisans in Fairmont, Welcome, and Winnebago, and almost all are exclusive to the catalog. "Of each dollar spent in our community, 67 cents stays in the community," said Wheeler. "So it makes sense to want to keep as much of the fundraising dollars in Fairmont as we can." More than 90 percent of the funds brought in by the fundraiser will stay in the area.

"Vendors have agreed to donate 50 percent of the listed catalog price of their items to the school and to selling incentives for the students," Wheeler said. "Most of the prizes for students are also coming from local companies, many of which donated the

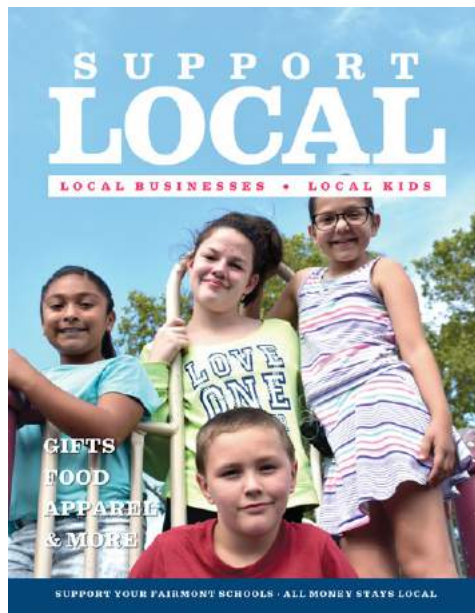
prizes."

The American Red Cross strongly urges healthy, eligible individuals who are feeling well to give blood to help maintain a sufficient blood supply and prevent shortages as concerns about the outbreak of coronavirus disease 2019, or COVID-19, rise in the U.S.

Cold and flu season has already impacted the nation's ability to maintain its blood supply. As the number of coronavirus cases grows in the U.S., the number of people eligible to give blood for patients in need could decrease further.

Please make an appointment to donate blood now by using the Red Cross Blood Donor App, visiting [RedCrossBlood.org](http://RedCrossBlood.org), calling 1-800-RED CROSS (1-800-733-2767) or enabling the

Blood Donor Skill on any Alexa Echo device. Blood donors with type O blood and platelet donors are especially needed right now.

Donating blood is a safe process and people should not hesitate to give or receive blood. There are no data or evidence that this coronavirus can be transmissible by blood transfusion, and there have been no reported cases worldwide of transmissions for any respiratory virus, including this coronavirus, from a transfusion.

The Red Cross only collects blood from individuals who are healthy and feeling well at the time of donation - and who meet other eligibility requirements, available at [RedCrossBlood.org](http://RedCrossBlood.org). At each blood drive and donation center, Red Cross employees follow thorough safety protocols including wearing gloves, routinely wiping down donor-touched areas, using sterile collection sets for every donation, and preparing the arm for donation with an aseptic scrub.

### An Ice Cream Social

"What's an ice cream social?" I asked my mom, who was busy getting all the kids ready to go. She explained that people just get together for ice cream. They talk and sometimes play games and such; it's a social event. Ice cream? That was all I needed to hear.

I attended my first ice cream social a long time ago. Mom took us to a fundraiser sponsored by

the St. Joseph's Hospital Ladies Auxiliary Club. It was held on the lawn by the circle driveway at the front entrance of the building in Ottumwa, Iowa.

The ladies brought their own ice cream machines. A few had old fashioned hand churns. Most had electric motors that turned paddles in stainless steel tubs. All of the tubs were immersed

in wooden buckets of ice. The homemade vanilla ice cream was still soft and creamy, being served right out of the ice cream makers. They had Hershey's chocolate syrup in a can, if you wanted it. There were games for the kids to play while adults sat at little round tables on the front lawn, socializing. I remember it was a lot of fun and I've been to many such events since then - I even helped plan one.

Myself and a few

colleagues from the local media met with Connie, a friend who worked at Evans Middle School. Her students were looking for ideas for a community service project. They wanted to raise money for the local fire department to purchase batteries and smoke detectors. The firemen provided and installed detectors for elderly people and anyone who needed them. They also went out annually to change batteries for people who needed assistance doing so.

I suggested holding an ice cream social in the garage at the central fire station. Surely people

would come; they're always curious about firetrucks and what's inside the fire house. A second meeting was held with the fire chief who loved the idea. Another person from the media suggested a name for the event, and just like that, the first annual "Fire and Ice," was underway.

The kids worked with Hy-Vee, a local grocery store, and several sponsors who provided the product. They took in donations from people who came for the ice cream and played games. Everyone was offered a tour of the fire station and a lot of kids (adult kids too) had their photos taken

sitting in the driver's seat of a shiny red firetruck. I couldn't even guess how many people came sliding down the brass fire pole. It was a real fun time and the students raised a good amount of money for their cause.

Fire and Ice was a successful event for several years to follow, but coming back to the day at hand, ice cream was the furthest thing from mind...

...strangers in the night...we had to rush... my face was frozen...my fingers were going numb...

## A Frightening time!

According to the records it turned into a respiratory /pneumonia complication, and back then they didn't have antibiotics and we didn't have the access to media where we could be given instructions on how to best protect us and our loved ones.

I am guessing many homes didn't even have running water and certainly not hand sanitizer! I hope everyone heeds the warnings and does their best to follow the instructions of our health professionals! Most people my age have underlying conditions and we always worry about my sweet little great grand daughter, Nora. Soon it will be spring and at least we can go out to our yards to get out of our homes. We are going to be very careful and stay close to home for awhile!

We eat a lot of carrots at our house. I am sharing a different way to prepare them with you!

### Honey Garlic Butter Roasted Carrots

2 # carrots, washed and peeled  
1/3 cup butter  
1/3 cup honey  
4 garlic cloves, minced  
1/2 tsp. salt  
dash of black pepper  
2 Tablespoons of fresh chopped parsley or dill

Preheat oven to 425 degrees, lightly grease a large baking sheet with cooking oil spray.

Trim ends of carrots and cut in thirds.

Melt butter in a skillet, pour in honey over medium heat, cook while stirring until completely melted through the butter. Add garlic and cook for 30 seconds until fragrant while stirring. Add carrots and allow the sauce to thicken for a further minute, while tossing the carrots through the sauce, season with salt and pepper.

Transfer carrots to baking sheet in a single layer so they cook evenly, toss to coat. Roast for 20 minutes, or until carrots are fork tender. Broil on high for 2-3 minutes to crisp the edges. Garnish with parsley or dill. Stay safe and have a great week!



## Ask A Trooper: Turn on your lights!

**Question: I have noticed cars that can't be seen in the day when they fail to turn on their lights when it is snowing, raining or foggy. Can you please explain how dangerous it can be and what the law is that covers this?**

**Answer:** Minnesota law states that every vehicle on a roadway shall display lighted headlamps, lighted tail lamps, and illuminating devices from sunset to sunrise. The law also applies when it's raining, snowing, sleeting, or hailing and at any time when visibility is impaired by weather or insufficient light, at a distance of 500 feet ahead.

During the recent snow event, I noticed many vehicles without their lights on during the heavy snowfall. This can create a very dangerous situation, especially

when visibility is reduced. Being seen can help reduce your chances of being involved in a crash.

Basic automatic headlights work through sensors which detect the amount of light outside. These sensors are located on the dash of the vehicle. The headlights turn on when the sensors detect a certain level of darkness or the level of ambient light.

The problem can be the limitations to automatic headlights. Sometimes they do not turn on during heavy rain, snow or fog, as the light sensor still detects light.

Most vehicles retained the conventional headlight switches, which allow drivers to turn lights on or off to

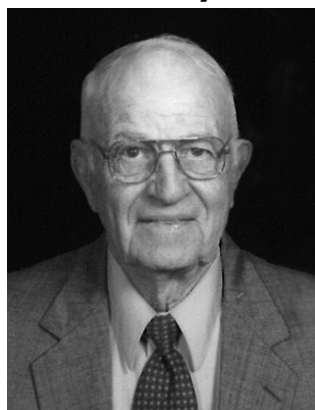



## Youth tractor and farm safety certification

The youth tractor and farm safety certification program is designed to provide youth 14 years and older the opportunity to learn about safe equipment operation and general farm safety. Students who participate in the program will:

Work hands-on with full sized tractors and implements

Receive training in farm related basic first aid

Learn about farm safety from a range of experienced community members

Students who

complete this program will receive a US Department of Labor certificate of training.



This certificate is required for 14- and 15-year-olds who wish to work with equipment with over 20 horsepower off of their family farm or homestead.

This course combines online and in-person training

The youth tractor and farm safety certification program is a two-part program, including both an online learning experience and two days of in-person hands-on training in the summer. The

online course is a self-paced one- to two-week program. Once you have registered for

the in-person program, details about accessing the online course will be provided to you.

## Inspecting farm buildings damage after wind storm

Wind damage to buildings is not always readily apparent. For this reason, examine all farm buildings for hidden damage after a severe windstorm or tornado. Undetected damage could weaken a structure, creating possible hazards. Prompt repair is usually less expensive in the long run.

### ROOF

Damaged or missing shingles. Check asphalt shingles for cracks at the butt end, where they may have been weakened from flexing. Make sure individual shingles have not blown off. Thoroughly inspect shingles on the ridge, gable ends and eaves.

Loose nails on metal roofing. Inspect the entire roof, with particular attention to gable ends, eaves and ridge cap. If nails have worked loose, re-nail them as soon as possible. If the nails don't hold when hammered back in, use #12

or #14 metal screws to fill old nail holes. (Use aluminum screws on aluminum and steel screws on steel.) In addition to screws, re-nail 3 to 4 inches away with ring or screw-type nails.

Potential leaks. On a sunny day, check the roof carefully from inside with the building doors closed. While looking for holes in the roof, inspect the ridge, gable ends and eaves for possible structural separation.

### FOUNDATION

Inspect the foundation. The plate should not be separated from the studding where the foundation meets the walls. On block foundations, inspect mortar joints to make sure the block with the plate bolt in it hasn't separated from the wall. On stone or concrete foundations, check to see that the plate bolts have not worked loose.

### SILLO

Make sure the silo is still plumb. Look for loose hoops. Inspect the roof to be sure it remains fastened to the silo. Inspect the base of metal silos inside and outside for hairline cracks. If there is rust around the base, remove it with a wire brush. Then check for cracks and apply a rust preventive paint. Look for new cracks in the plaster of empty concrete stave silos.

### INTERIOR

Inspect the interior of buildings for structural damage. Using a good light, check the framing. Look for ridge separation, loose knee braces and loose rafters where the rafters join the walls.

Every three days, a child dies in an agricultural related incident, and each day, 33 children are injured.

This is according to the 2019 Childhood Agricultural Injuries Fact Sheet compiled by the National Children's Center

areas not accessible to young children?

Are children kept away from grain wagons, grain bins, silos, manure pits and other confined spaces or flowing grain hazards?

Are all chemicals, pesticides and hazardous substances stored in

farm. Keep the completed forms for follow-up, future reference and inspections.

### Safe Play

Childhood farm injuries and fatalities most often occur while children are playing in an agricultural worksite, or are bystanders to agricultural work. Children younger than 10 years old experience



for Rural and Agricultural Health and Safety.

A priority for farmers and workers is to keep children safe on the farm. Take time to talk about the dangers and take steps now to ensure your kids, their friends or other young visitors are safe. Here are a few active steps to help you create a safe farm.

Adapted with permission from the NCCRAHS Child/Youth Agricultural Safety Checklist.

### SAFETY CHECKLIST

Are young children kept out of the work site while parents work?

Do adults know to never take young children on machinery (tractors, skid steers, ATVs, etc.), including not giving them rides in buckets, instructional seats or on laps. This means NO EXTRA RIDERS.

Are keys removed from all equipment when not in use, hydraulics disengaged/de-energized, and all equipment stored in lowest position?

Is all equipment, especially those with sharp edges (plows, hay mowers, etc.), stored in

locked storage areas not accessible to children?

Are large objects that could fall and harm children stored safely and put in areas not accessible to young children (e.g. tires or gates not left leaning against walls)?

Are drowning hazards addressed (fences around ponds/manure pits, wells covered, ditches filled in, etc.)?

Do young children have a designated safe play area, separated from the farm worksite by a barrier (e.g. fence)?

Does an adult/older youth supervise young, non-working children?

one of the highest rates of pediatric farm-related injury, according to a study by the National Institute for Occupational Safety and Health.

Ideally, non-working children should be physically separated from the occupational and environmental hazards associated with agricultural worksites. Safe play areas are an alternative to bringing children into the worksite, especially when off-farm childcare is not available.

The National Children's Center for Rural and Agricultural Health and Safety (NCCRAHS) has created a website with tips and resources for creating safe play areas, including training materials and downloadable booklets.

## Why is Farm Safety Important?

Thousands of farmers, family members, and farm workers are injured and hundreds die in farming accidents every year in the United States. Agriculture is considered the most hazardous industry to work in. A farmer is 800 percent more likely to die while working than people in other jobs. The leading cause of death is tractor rollovers. Learn more about the Minnesota Department of Agriculture's (MDA's) Rollover Protective Structures (ROPS) Rebate Program.

The Rollover Protective Structures (ROPS) Rebate Program was established to make tractor safety equipment affordable and simple to order. Roll bars and seat belts are 99 percent effective in preventing death and serious injury in the event of a rollover.

Minnesota's ROPS Rebate Program is a public-private partnership. Private ROPS funds have been contributed by ADM, AgCountry, AgriBank, Cargill, CHS Inc., Compeer Financial, and Land O'Lakes.

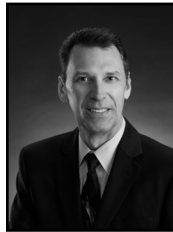

silos on your farm?

### SAFETY CHECKLIST

The checklist below lists a few common



flat storage structures unless they are empty, proper lock-out/tag-out and other safety procedures are followed, and the youth is at least 16 years old.

Have you taken the proper steps to ensure the safety of grain bins/

hazards you can look for and fix to keep your workers and family safe.

Has equipment been powered off at main disconnect and locked and tagged?

If there is potential for combustible gas,

vapors or toxic agents, has the oxygen level been tested with a gas monitor?

Is a rope and harness available for anyone entering a grain bin?

If a worker enters, is an observer present and in communication?

Is the observer trained and able to initiate rescue?

Is rescue equipment provided and specifically suited for entry?

Are there NIOSH approved masks or respirators available?

Are grain and feed bins clearly labeled to warn of the hazards of flowing grain or feed?

Do all bins have permanent ladders inside and outside?

Are hearing protectors available for wearing around noisy equipment?

Are equipment guards and shields in place and in good condition?

## Feedlot permit changes

Public meetings on feedlot permit changes to be online March 31, April 2  
The Minnesota

permit will be scheduled 10 a.m.-noon on Tuesday, March 31, and Thursday, April 2. Logon information and updates



Pollution Control Agency (MPCA) is revising the general operating permit for about 1,200 large feedlots covering Feb. 1, 2021 through Jan. 31, 2026.

Virtual information meetings about the

will be posted on the MPCA feedlot permit webpage. Meetings that had been scheduled March 17 at Rochester and March 19 at Mankato have been cancelled.

Following the Minnesota Department

of Health's guidance regarding COVID-19, the MPCA will not be conducting in-person public meetings until after April 30. A formal 30-day public comment period for the permit will be announced in late spring or early summer.

The permit combines Minnesota rules and statutes with federal regulations of the National Pollutant Discharge Elimination System. It's designed to protect water quality, primarily from the storage and land application of manure. A general permit covers facilities whose operations are similar. About 1,200 large feedlots in Minnesota operate under the current general

permit.

Under proposed changes, waters will be more protected from nitrogen leaching and runoff from land application of manure, while feedlot owners will benefit from improved forms and online services.

Though substantially similar to the current general permit, the proposed permit includes: Measures to limit nitrates leaching from manure land application, and streamlining record-keeping, permit format, and application process.

As the permit-development process continues, learn more and find out about public-participation opportunities on the MPCA web site.

Many institutions and businesses purchase produce directly from nearby farmers. We've created a list of questions about on-farm food safety practices that food service workers can ask farmers when considering buying fresh fruits and vegetables directly from a farm.

These questions are not about food safety in your food service kitchen. They are questions about the steps that the farmer

took to minimize the risk of contamination as the food was grown, harvested and transported to your kitchen door.

There are many things you might ask a farmer about as you develop a relationship and begin to buy their food, including delivery schedule, pricing and container and pack size. Food safety can be another part of this conversation.

These questions are meant to be a guide so

days).  
Order your ROPS kit and inform NRRP of the final pricing to reserve funding.

Once installed, send proof of purchase and installation to the NRRP.

Your rebate check will arrive approximately 30 days after the NRRP receives your paperwork.

Other health and safety hazards on the farm include grain bins and silos, manure pits, toxic gases, chemicals and pesticides, livestock handling, skid loaders, and others. You can prevent or minimize the danger of accidents with training or by installing and using safety equipment.

that you can have an informed discussion with a farmer about the food safety practices that they use on their farm.

Minimize the risk

Produce is grown in the soil and under the sky, and there will always be some risk of contamination. Farmers cannot totally eliminate this risk, but they can minimize it by using best practices to ensure the safety of consumers.

Most farmers are very committed to on-farm food safety, and farmers should not be offended if you ask about their

food safety practices. If done in a conversational way, most farmers will be happy to talk about their practices. You need to be comfortable with their answers and, if you're not, find out if they are willing to make some changes or consider not buying from the farmer at that time.

Visiting the farm is a great way to get to know the farmer and their operation. By visiting the farm, you can get a good idea of the farmer's food safety practices, in combination with a conversation using the following questions as a guide.

Talking with farmers about food safety

Open by asking:

Can you tell me a lit-

tle about your food safety practices? or,

How do you address food safety on your farm?

Listen for these words or concepts

I have a written food safety plan.

I test my well water every year.

We train all of our staff on our food safety protocols including hand washing, good personal hygiene, and reporting illness or injury.

About manure:

We don't use raw manure; or,

We apply raw manure in the fall; or,

We buy composted manure.

I've passed a GAP (Good Agricultural Practices) audit, or intend to schedule an on-farm food safety audit.

GAP is similar to a HACCP plan for farmers, but very few farmers

in Minnesota are GAP audited, so do not expect the farm to have an audit certificate.

I haven't gone through a GAP audit but I've adopted the on-farm food safety practices that are relevant for my farm.

I have attended a GAP or FSMA (Food Safety Modernization Act) training.

Questions to ask about farmer food safety practices


Farm and production practices

Do you have a written food safety plan or standard operating procedures related to food safety? If not, how do you document and ensure food safety on your farm?

—If they say no to these questions or do not seem to have thought about food safety, you may consider making a farm visit or asking more about this.

Will the produce be rinsed or washed?

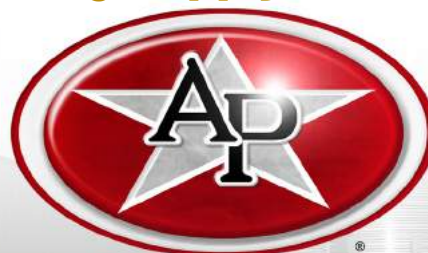

—If they rinse or wash their produce, it needs to be done with drinkable water.

How often do you have the well water tested for contaminants?

—We recommend testing well water for Generic E. coli at least once per year

How do you treat and manage your wash water?

—Some farms treat wash water with a sanitizer, but there is no requirement to do so.

—Wash water in tanks or sinks should be changed as needed to maintain cleanliness.

What do you do to keep livestock and other animals (including pets) out of growing and packing areas?

Worker health and hygiene

Do you have health and hygiene training for employees? What does it cover?

—Listen for training

on hand washing procedures, illness and injury reporting.

Are restrooms with hand washing facilities including single-use towels, soap and clean running water available to all workers?

—Note: Sanitizing gels are not a substitute for hand washing.

Are workers excluded from handling food products if they are ill or have a fever or diarrhea?

—Employees should be taught to look for signs of animal intrusion prior to harvest.

—They should not pick anything that may be contaminated with feces, nibble marks or other animal evidence.

Packaging and tool cleanliness

How will product be packaged?

Have boxes been used previously? If so, for what?

Boxes should appear clean and intact, like new, when the produce arrives.

Boxes that have held

meat or poultry should not be used to transport produce.

How often do you clean your harvest tools and containers?

—There is no one right answer, but they should have some kind of

cleaning schedule or routine.

The tools should be cleaned at the end of the day.

The containers should appear clean.

How is the produce kept cool and covered before and during delivery?

—Coolers and delivery vehicles should be kept clean.

# MARTIN COUNTY PUBLIC NOTICE OF DELINQUENT TAX LIST

NOTICE OF DELINQUENT TAXES

TO: ALL PERSONS WITH A LEGAL INTEREST IN THE PARCELS OF REAL PROPERTY DESCRIBED IN THE FOLLOWING DELINQUENT TAX LIST

A list of real property in Martin County on which delinquent real property taxes ad penalties are due has been filed with the district court administrator of Martin County. The list is published to inform all persons that the listed property is subject to forfeiture because of delinquent taxes.

The property owner, taxpayer, or other interested persons must either pay the tax and penalty plus interest and costs or fie a written objection with the district court administrator. The objection must be filed by March 30, 2020 stating the reason(s) why the tax or penalty is not due on the property. If no objection is filed, a court judgement will be entered against the property for the unpaid tax, penalty, interest and costs.


For property under court judgement, the period of redemption begins on May 11, 2020. The period of redemption means the time within which taxes must be paid to avoid losing the property through forfeiture. The period of redemption si three years, with a handful of exceptions. The redemption period is one year for most properties located in a targeted neighborhood, as defined in the Minnesota laws, and for municipal solid waste disposal facilities. The redemption period is five weeks for certain abandoned or vacant properties.

You may also enter into a confession of judgement as an alternative method to paying off the delinquent tax amount and avoiding forfeiture. This allows you to pay the delinquent balance in equal annual installments, with a down payment due at the time you enter into the confession. The length of the installment plan varies: five years for commercial industrial/public utility property; 10 years for all other properties.

If you have homesteaded property, you may be eligible for a Senior Citizen's Property Tax Deferral, which enables seniors to pay just three percent of their total household income and allow remaining amounts to become a lien on the property that may be deferred for later payment. (perhaps upon eventual sale of property).

It should also be noted by property homesteaders that you are ineligible to receive the Property Tax Refund while you own delinquents property tax.

## Local governments hold COVID-19 informational meetings

At two special meetings held Monday in Fairmont, concerning the COVID-19 pandemic, all officials urged the public not to over-react, but to be alert to changes in policies, schedules. At the first meeting, held at the Martin County Courthouse, officials included Dr. Marie Morris, medical director of Mayo Clinic Health Systems, who urged citizens to follow the guidelines, and to call their health care provider before coming to the offices, so their symptoms could be triaged. Also in attendance was Richard Ash, CEO of UHD in Blue Earth who was in agreement with Dr. Morris's statements. Chera Sevcik, executive director of Martin and Faribault County Human Services, reported the agency is working with the Minnesota Department of Health, as the virus reports change daily. She said as of now, there are no virus cases reported in the immediate area, but they are prepared if that should occur. At the second meeting held at City Hall, Abigail Nesbitt, Martin County Emergency Management Director, that "It's better to do something, even if nothing happens." In attendance were Fairmont Mayor Debbie Foster, Police Chief Mike Hunter, Ned Koppen, Chamber Director, Mark Sievert, interim city administrator, and Joe Brown, Fairmont Area Schools Superintendent. Each reported on how their organizations were reacting to the emergency. bypass the sensors. Many drivers fail to physically turn on their headlights, which will also activate the rear taillights and

marker lights. Drivers might assume the sensors will activate all of the vehicle's lights in reduced visibilities, but that is not always the case.

If your wipers need to

be on, you should also turn on your headlights, taillights and marker lights. When lights are required, manually turn on your headlights to know that all your lights will be on. Also,

make it a habit to check your lights often to ensure they are properly working.

You can avoid a ticket — and a crash — if you simply buckle up, drive at safe speeds, pay attention

and of course, drive sober. Help us drive Minnesota Toward Zero Deaths.
