You made me feel like a yellowbellied sapsucker singin' in a eucalyptus tree. And now

My neighbor Crandall songs - it's spring training I feel like a sap since you oh. You made me feel like a wheel like a real big deal then cut. The door to your heart slammed shot. You made me feel like you know what. Well, now I feel like a red-headed woodpecker peckin' at a cast iron tree. Just a huffin' and a peckin' and a bangin' my brains out nothin' but miserv. You made me feel like a yellow-bellied sapsucker."

I heard the sapsucker drilling holes in a tree. The stuttering cadence of its hammering sounded as if it were tapping out a Morse Code message.



The earnest money If you've been working lets the seller know you are serious about buying the house. The amount of earnest money is completely up to you. Generally, the higher the price of the house, the higher the amount of earnest money. Make sure you consult your lender to learn any restrictions to earnest money allowed by your loan program. Also remember the amount is negotiable.

One frequently asked question is, "What happens to the earnest money?" Your real estate agent will submit the earnest money to the seller's broker, who will deposit the check into the seller's broker's trust account until closing. Notice to Farmers bridal # **Martin County**

The Martin County Highway Department will soon begin spot spraying for noxious weeds in county road ditches. The weed spray the County uses is non-toxic to livestock. It is recommended to wait 14 days after spraying to allow the chemicals to work. Anyone wishing to maintain road ditches for hay crop must pick up small signs at the County Highway Department Shop in Fairmont or indicate on our County road map areas not to be sprayed. Please notify us each year of these areas. "No Spray" areas are the individual's responsibility for keeping the ditches free of noxious weeds and should be moved before thistles go to seed.

If you plan to harvest ditch hay to feed to livestock, it is your responsibility to either mark those ditches as "no spray" or to keep track of where you spread the manure from the livestock that is fed with that ditch hay. The chemical that the county uses to spray thistles can have a residual effect on soybean crops in manure from an animal fed with sprayed ditch hay, even after the chemical passes through the livestock's digestive track. Anyone wishing to view the chemical's product label should contact the Highway Department.

Is it Spring yet?

What a dirty trick old Mother nature played on us on Saturday! It was so nice on Friday that I started cleaning my glassed-in front porch for the summer. I won't be able to finish it until we have another warm day! I love my old fashioned porch. We use it a lot when its warm. Since we live in an old house the windows don't fit too tight, so it needs a good once over in the spring!

I seem to have a knack to turn a few calorie food into a dish that is high calorie! So it is with mushrooms, but we only live once, so why not indulge ourselves once in awhile. Every recipe I have made that calls for Gruyere cheese is incredibly delicious, enjoy!

Delicious Mushrooms:

- 4 Tbsp. butter
- 4 cloves garlic, minced
- 2 tsp. fresh chopped thyme or 1 tsp. dry thyme
- 1 # baby bella mushrooms, cleaned and sliced
- 1/4 cup red wine
- 1 cup heavy cream

Kosher salt

freshly ground black pepper

pinch of crushed red pepper flakes (optional)

1 1/4 cups shredded Gruyere cheese

1/4 cup grated parmesan cheese

fresh chopped parsley for serving

In a large skillet over medium heat, melt butter. Add garlic and thyme and cook until fragrant, 1 minute. Add mushrooms and cook until golden 5 minutes. Add wine and cook until reduced, 5 minutes more.

Add heavy cream and bring to a boil, reduce heat and let simmer until thickened, 8 minutes. Season with salt and pepper and red pepper flakes if using. Top with cheeses, then cover and cook until cheese is melty, 5 minutes more. Sprinkle with parsley for serving.

"Dancing at Eleven"

It was a beautiful Satur- passed through. day morning. I was doing a live remote, radio broadcast. I had just finished doing a shot on the air when my cell phone rang. It was Melissa

"Can you do me a really big favor?" She asked. "Is there any way you could fly to Houston and bring my uncle Kenny and aunt Gail back?" I told her the weather wasn't looking good, but I would do some checking and get back to her shortly.

Melissa had recently told me her grandpa Max was ill. I knew it had to be serious for her to call me with this

Between my broadcasts, I called the flight service station for a weather briefing. "Flight is not recommended for your route." The briefer told me, then went on to give me the full details. It seemed unfair. The weather in both Ottumwa, and Houston was beautiful, but everything in between was a mess of violent thunderstorm. My route was littered with tornado

I called Melissa back, "This is the kind of weather the airlines won't fly through." I explained the thunderstorms were towering to fifty and sixty thousand feet. Storms were affecting Kansas City, Minneapolis, Chicago, Denver, and Atlanta. Airline traffic was backed up all over the country. Even Houston International Airport, had been shut down for weather earlier in the day, as the storms

I really wanted to help her out, but I couldn't. "I can't fly through it, and I can't go around it. It's just too big." It broke my heart to tell her, "I can't do it."

I kept checking the weather. Later in the afternoon I called Melissa. "It looks like there's going to be a small break in the weather. I filed my flight plan, then called Ottumwa Flying Service. I was very relieved when Steve Black answered the phone, late on a Saturday afternoon. "Steve, I need a favor. Can you pull my airplane out, top the tanks, check the oil and do a preflight for me?" "Sure, what's the rush?" He asked. "I need to run to Houston and back." I told him. "Houston, Texas?" He questioned, "Have you looked the weather? It's a mess all over the country!" I told him I had, and explained there was a window opening. If I timed it just right, I could get through. "Okay, I trust you." he said, "But be careful. Tom, if you need to, land the plane and wait the storm

When I arrived at the airport, I parked the car, grabbed my flight bag, and ran to the airplane. Steve was waiting by the wing, with my door opened for me. He handed me a quart of oil, then said, "Take this with you in case you need it in Houston."

Actions Required by MN Law

to prevent the spread of aquatic invasive species:

- Clean aquatic plants, zebra mussels, and other prohibited invasive species off watercraft, trailers, and equipment before leaving the water access
- Drain water from boat, ballast tanks, portable bait container, and motor before leaving a water access – and drain bilge, livewell, and baitwell by removing drain plugs. Keep drain plugs out while transporting boats.
- Dispose of unwanted bait in the trash. It is illegal to release live bait into the water, or to dump worms on the ground.

NOTICE TO ALL LANDOWNERS/OPERATORS IN LAKE BELT TOWNSHIP

Right-of-way is maintained by the township for the purposes of snow control, drainage and field of vision. This right-of-way along township roads is 33 feet from the center of road. The township's main purpose is to keep the traveling public safe and in order to do this, the township board has to control the right-of-way.

Lake Belt Township has placed/will be placing right-of-way markers in areas of encroachment of the township right-of-way. Crop ground encroachment will be required to be corrected before the 2019 planting season.

The fine for encroaching in the right-of-way is \$500 per half mile (as voted upon by residents at the annual meeting) as well as any cost incurred by the township to correct right-of-way damage or encroachment in accordance to MN Statute 366.015.

If the landowner continues to encroach, actions will be taken by the township board to permanently correct the issue and costs will be assessed to the landowner.

If you have trees, brush, stones/rock, object/debris or any other objects addressed by the statute, you have until July 20, 2019 to remove these objects or the landowner will be assessed the \$500 fine per half mile as well as the costs incurred by the township to correct the issues.


