Why "net metering" re-

form is needed:

Minnesota electric cooperatives and municipal utilities are owned, managed and operated by the customers they serve. That means we aren't focused on stock prices or far away shareholders. We exist to provide reliable, affordable, safe and environmentally sensitive electric service to all our customers. Because we are consumer-owned, we are also responsive to the unique needs of our communities. Consumer-owned utilities have developed innovative and industry leading renewable energy projects. These projects allow our customers to invest in our renewable energy future in a fair and equitable manner.

This legislative session, consumer-owned utilities are advocating for reform to a law we believe is inherently unfair to the majority of our customers. Small scale wind and solar producers, known as distributed generators, currently sell their excess generation back to the utility at retail rates (the price the consumer-owned utility sells electric power to our customers). When a distributed generator produces as much energy as they use, they don't pay anything for the cost of operating the electric grid that they rely on when their wind or solar installation is not producing energy. These costs are built into the electric rates paid by utility customers; if a distributed generator is compensated at the full retail rate, the generating customer is not making any contribution toward the cost of operating the grid

and those costs are then shifted onto the rest of our customers.

We believe this is unfair and that distributed generators should pay their share to maintain the grid that they need in order to sell their excess generation and keep their lights on when the sun isn't shining or the wind isn't blowing. The reform we are advocating doesn't do away with net metering but allows consumer-owned utilities to collect the actual cost to serve distributed generators. This additional fee

isn't arbitrary or punitive but tied to the true cost to maintain the grid.

We aren't asking to end net metering and will continue to support distributed generators with the technical know-how and technology needed for their systems to operate with the electric grid. However, we believe this reform is fair and needed to ensure that costs don't continue to shift from distributed generators to the rest of our customers.

## Others First, Self Last

Why are some people remembered? Is it because of their accomplishments, offices they've held, their notoriety, their prominence, or perhaps for something else? There are obviously a number of good reasons, including some of those previously mentioned, as to why people are remembered and in some instances commemorated.

One notable individual instrumental in the betterment of her community and county was Pauline Welcome. Her motto, "Others First, Self Last," seems to epitomize her legacy, and to provide a valid reason for remembering her, particularly in terms of the positive and lasting influence she had on Martin County.

Pauline H. Luegge was born in Rutland Township, Martin County, in 1896. Her father died when she was fourteen, leaving her mother with eleven children. Because her mother was unable to care for all of them, some of her children went to live with friends and relatives. Pauline was taken in by Mrs. S. H. Merrill, a music teacher. Mrs. Merrill had health problems, consequently, although Pauline attended Fairmont High School several hours daily, she spent the remainder of each day helping with housework

and cooking for Mrs. Merrill during her ten year stay at her home.

Following graduation



from Fairmont High School, she worked at Fairmont Railway Motors for one summer. However, she was urged by friends to become a rural school teacher as it paid \$50.00 a month, an inviting sum of money at that time. As a result, she made the decision to attend Normal School for two years. Following graduation from Normal School, she taught in Martin County schools for six years. Then, in 1928, she married Earl M. Welcome. He owned and operated several farms in Martin County and the town of Welcome was named in honor of his father.

Following her husband's death in 1951, Mrs. Welcome moved into the

town of Welcome. During the years that followed, her life exemplified her motto, "Others First, Self Last." She was active in the Martin County Public Health Nursing Service and its auxiliary and she was a charter member of the planning committee for the Lakeview United Methodist Home. In addition, she authored a number of books commemorating local history including "The History of Welcome, Minnesota," "Manyaska Township," "Welcome Methodist Church," and "The Welcome Village Cemetery." Having a keen interest in the Martin County Historical Society, she generously furnished a complete room with displays of artifacts from her home in Welcome and her historical family heirlooms. That room in the Pioneer Museum is aptly named "The Welcome Room," in honor of her family. Her civic mindedness also included being a member of Martin County Farm Bureau, the Fairmont Community Hospital Auxiliary, and other organizations in addition to her considerable financial contributions to numerous charitable organizations in Martin County.

In March of 1973, Mrs. Welcome was honored by being named "Philan-

thropist of the Year" by the National Board of Health. The following year, 1974, she was named "Martin County's Outstanding Senior Citizen." She moved to the Lakeview Methodist Home in 1976 and passed away in 1978. She is buried in the Welcome City Cemetery.

It would seem that Pauline Welcome's motto, "Others First, Self Last," inspired her to leave a substantial and significant legacy that proved instrumental and virtually immeasurable consider-

ing the lasting effect it has had on Martin County and its citizens. It's a motto that could certainly be worthy of consideration in today's society. When considering her start in life, one of eleven children sent to live with someone outside of her immediate family, her accomplishments are truly remarkable. She didn't ask for anything, she apparently didn't feel "entitled," yet she was very generous and more than willing to give of herself, her time, and her resources in an effort

to contribute to the continued development and evolution of a better Martin County. Those individuals that have positively affected our lives as a result of what they've done, whether we realize it or not, must be remembered and recognized. Their accomplishments have been instrumental in shaping our local society into what it has become today.

# What's Cooking

## Rhubarb Cake

### It's rhubarb time!

We just planted rhubarb last year but my plant has really taken off! In fact some of it got too big for me to use so I hope it comes back soon so I can try a couple of new recipes I have found! Fresh rhubarb is a sure sign that spring is truly here. The recipe I am going to share with you today is one my mother used to make. It's an old standby that's always good. I like to serve it with a little whipped topping. Hope that you enjoy it too!

### Rhubarb Cake:

1 1/2 cups brown sugar  
1/2 cup butter  
1 egg  
1 cup buttermilk  
1 tsp soda  
1/2 tsp salt  
1 1/2 cups chopped rhubarb

### Topping:

1/2 cup sugar  
1 tsp cinnamon  
1/2 cup chopped nuts (optional)

Mix ingredients in order given except the rhubarb. Put small amount of batter in bottom of greased 9x13 pan, then spread the rhubarb evenly over the batter, pour remaining batter over the rhubarb. (The rhubarb will not settle to bottom of the pan this way). Sprinkle with topping. Bake at 350 degrees, 40-45 minutes.

98% of my flowers are planted! It seems so early but I wanted them planted before the rain that was predicted came! I still have some seeds to plant. I love the old fashioned flowers from seed too! Have a great week!

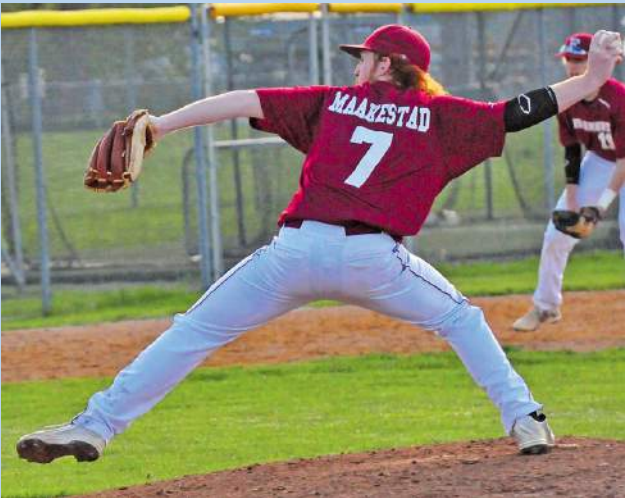

Notice to Farmers Martin County

The Martin County Highway Department will soon begin spot spraying for noxious weeds in county road ditches. The weed spray the County uses is non-toxic to livestock. It is recommended to wait 14 days after spraying to allow the chemicals to work. Anyone wishing to maintain road ditches for hay crop must pick up small signs at the County Highway Department Shop in Fairmont or indicate on our County road map areas not to be sprayed. **Please notify us each year of these areas.** "No Spray" areas are the individual's responsibility for keeping the ditches free of noxious weeds and **should be mowed before thistles go to seed.**

If you plan to harvest ditch hay to feed to livestock, it is your responsibility to either mark those ditches as "no spray" or to keep track of where you spread the manure from the livestock that is fed with that ditch hay. The chemical that the county uses to spray thistles can have a residual effect on soybean crops in manure from an animal fed with sprayed ditch hay, even after the chemical passes through the livestock's digestive track. Anyone wishing to view the chemical's product label should contact the Highway Department.

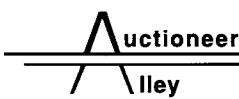

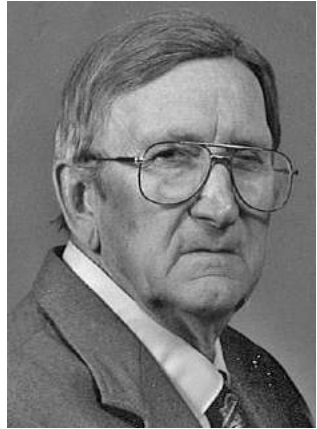
