Of course, you know about all the problems that fill the newspaper pages and cable television shows. But you probably don't believe the prognosis and share the pessimism. In fact, you probably don't heed the warnings and preachings of the pessimists. I'll bet you don't, because I didn't when I was in your posi-

Critics worry about your work ethic, but you have worked your way through school. They worry about all the time you spend on vour mobile devices and that you're becoming anti-social, but look at all the friends you've made. They complain about how

Allow me to set the faulty the education system is, and you answer them by excelling in academic subjects that did not even exist when they went to school.

Your parents and ancestors gave you life, but you give life energy. With your exuberant optimism nomic recession. People and hopefulness you give us what we often cannot give ourselves. And so you deserve not a message of But the time that I am warning from your comgratitude for inspiring us with your optimism and hope for the future.

> Many people say that you are facing a future of little hope. But your very lives refute that. You, the students, are yourselves symbols of hope. As we proudly watch you graduate, the whole community is filled with the hope of a fresh start, that the world infused with your vitality and energy really will become a better place.

> When I graduated from Fairmont High School, in 1941, in the wake of the Great Depression and on the eve of a horrible world war, my classmates did not believe that the world was doomed to poverty and totalitarianism.

When my first child graduated from this same school in the 1970s, her classmates likewise did not believe that America

would be destroyed by rock music, anti-war protests and urban riots. And when my last child graduated in the 1980s, she and her friends did not believe that imminent nuclear war rendered all hopes and dreams futile.

You don't have all the experience that we, your elders, have, but you do have something that we don't have -- you have your exuberance for life and your hope for the future.

An so instead of commanding you to live up to the expectations of those who have helped you through your school years, instead of challenging you to fix the world for us - all good messages indeed -- I pass along to you a graduation message of

In contemplating your accomplishments, I have remembered a truth that had gradually become hidden from me. My past is so much longer than

yours, and I increasingly tend to view things in terms of that past. The future, to me, has come to mean the tomorrow of today. But to you, the future is not just a temporal extension of the past -- it is a spiritual eagerness to begin, an optimism about newness and change.

No one can say how the world will affect you as you go out into it, but we can say how you have already affected the world, with the glowing example of your energy and optimism. You may, in fact, be the most optimistic thing in this country.

So please remember, when your critics try to convince you that the world is going to the dogs, that the future does not lie in their mind, it lies in your energy. The future does not belong to those who approach it with pessimism.

What's Cookin

with Kathy Lloyd

Found it!

For years I have been looking for a good Mexican rice recipe. It's been difficult because Pa Lloyd doesn't like "pieces" of tomato in anything, although he likes fresh tomatoes. If I am cooking with tomatoes, I have to throw them in the blender, otherwise he picks out the little pieces of tomato and puts them on the edge of his plate - go figure. If we have tacos it seems more like a meal if I make Mexican rice as a side dish. I have made the boxed mixes but sometimes they can be too spicy, so low and behold in my new cookbook there is a recipe for Mexican rice that is perfect. My better half likes it too.

When it says to wash the rice, put the rice into a fine mesh strainer and run water over it, swishing it with your hand until the water runs clear. I do that with oriental dishes too, then the rice isn't gummy or sticky.

Mexican Rice:

3 tablespoons of vegetable oil

1 1/2 cups long-rain rice, rinsed

1 tsp. ground cumin

1 medium white onion, chopped

In a large saucepan, heat oil over medium heat. Add rice and saute, stirring until lightly browned, about 10 minutes. Stir in cumin and cook for 30 seconds. Add the onion and garlic and cook, stirring often, until softened, about 5 minutes. Pour tomato sauce into a 4-cup glass measuring cup, add enough chicken broth to make 3 1/4 cup liquid and stir into rice. Add salt and pepper. Bring to boil, stir once, reduce the heat. cover and simmer for 15-20 minutes. Remove the pan from the heat without uncovering it. Let stand, covered for 10 minutes. Fluff rice with fork, sprinkle with cilantro or parsley if using and serve. For some reason I usually manage to burn the bottom of the rice, so I peek after 15 minutes. When you simmer, turn the heat to very low so hopefully it won't scorch the bottom. Makes 4-6 servings.

However, you'll also when taking out a 401(k) loan, particularly concerning taxes. If you had not borrowed from your 401(k), the money you took out could have been growing on a tax-deferred basis, assuming you used pre-tax dollars to fund your plan, and your withdrawals will only be taxed once. But when you borrow from your plan, you will have to repay it, along with interest, with money vou've earned - and been you withdraw it later, you'll pay taxes on it again.

Furthermore, if leave your employer before fully repaying your loan, the outstanding balance likely will be taxable, although you may have a grace period in which to pay it off and avoid taxes.

And perhaps even more important, taking money from your 401(k), even if you repay it later, will almost certainly slow the growth potential of your account - which, in plain terms, means you may

have less money available for retirement.

Of course, if you encounter an emergency, and you have nowhere else to turn, you may need to borrow from your 401(k). And some plans allow hardship withdrawals for medical expenses and other needs, although you'll still be taxed on the amount you withdraw.

But you'd probably be better off if you can prepare, well in advance, for situations in which you need immediate access to a sizable sum. One way of doing this is to build an emergency fund containing six months' to a year's worth of living expenses, with the money kept in a liquid, low-risk account. You also might find some resources in the part of your investment portfolio held outside your 401(k). 
