as the hummer buzzed around me on the deck, impressing me with the flying ability of a creature weighing a dime or two. It was likely a young bird. Mature males are the first to head south, followed by the females. The immature birds are the last to migrate. An adult male ruby-throated hummingbird has a forked tail and dark tail feathers with no white tips. A young male or female has white tips on the outer three rectrices (large feathers used for steering and braking) on each side of its fanshaped tail.

A few robins found the yard's birdbath. One bathed while the others drank. Zigzag goldenrod grew on crooked stems and provided a celebration of yellow flowers.

House sparrows chirped cheerfully. I find them well worth my attention and hoped it meant they were experiencing joy. I saw some of these spatzies in a large, home improvement store. They are ingenious birds that have learned the highly specialized skill of opening automatic doors by fluttering in the right spot to activate electric-eye sensors.

Young owls remain near their parents throughout most of the summer and may beg for food into October, four to five months after leaving the nest.







A Son's visit!

I don't think children know how much a visit means to their parents! Our four children live from 1 hour to 5 hours away so we don't see them too often. Our eldest son Jason lives four hours away, he and his family came for dinner on Sunday. I call it his honey run. He is the live off the land type, has chickens, a few feeding cattle, bee hives and a huge garden. He brought me my year's supply of honey, earlier some maple syrup (he taps his trees in the spring) and some of his garden bounty but the best part was spending some time with him. One of my favorite foods is sweet potatoes. I often make them into oven fries. Today's recipe is a dressed up version.

Spiced sweet potato wedges:

- 2 tablespoons vegetable oil
- 1 1/2 teaspoons ground cinnamon
- 1 1/2 teaspoons of kosher salt, divided
- 1/2 teaspoon ground cumin
- 1/8 teaspoon ground red pepper 4 sweet potatoes, scrubbed halved lengthwise, cut lengthwise into 1/2 inch thick wedges.

1/2 cup sour cream 1/4 cup mayonnaise 1 teaspoon garlic powder dash of black pepper

Preheat oven to 400 degrees, place 2 heavy duty baking sheets in oven until very hot, about 10 minutes. In a large bowl, stir together oil, cinnamon, 1 teaspoon salt, cumin and red pepper; add sweet potatoes and toss until well combined. Carefully spread potatoes evenly onto hot pans.

Bake until tender, 20-25 minutes stirring potatoes

halfway through baking.

In a small bowl, stir together sour cream, mayo, garlic powder, black pepper and remaining 1/2 teaspoon salt. Serve with sweet potatoes. Garnish with parsley if desired. Have a great week!



Martin County Sheriff gives tour of county jail facilities to local officials

Growing up on the farm, I remember having to "do what you can with what you

I was invited last week to join other local officials, business people, county employees and county commissioners on a tour of the Martin County Jail and Law **Enforcement Center.**

The Martin County Law Enforcement Center was built in 1974 and at that time, it was to have a "life expectancy" of 25 years. Of course, when you do the math, it has now been 45 plus years and like all older buildings, it is definitely showing its wear.

Fortunately for me, I have never seen the inside of the Martin County Jail, so it was a definite eye-opening experience. Sheriff Jeff Markquart and Chief Deputy Corey Klanderud guided the group of about 25 people through the maze of corridors and hallways that make up the Martin County Jail, explaining things as they went along and answering questions about various ar-

As we made our way nrough the parts of the jail and law enforcement center, I noticed many signs of water damage from roof leaks, pipes that were obviously showing their age and wear, hallways and rooms that were workable at the time it was built, but now many years later do not meet state standards.

The Martin County Jail recieves a state inspection every year and these inspections have found issues with the route that inmates are escorted through public areas to court, a communication system in the building that is obsolete, storage area shortages, plumbing issues, infrastructure issues and the entire building is not ADA

(Americans with Disabilities Act) compliant.

Martin Since 2003, County has had to get variances from the state for many of these issues because the "fixes" are not able to be made in the existing structure.

The group tour also took us on the route that is taken when law enforcement has to escort inmates from the iail to the courtroom for hearings. The route takes you through many areas frequented by the public, which raises many security concerns.

At a question and answer session held in the courtroom with the group, Sheriff Markquart stated that the Martin County Law Enforcement Center has not been able to house female inmates in the jail since August 1st, 2010, which means that all female inmates have to be housed outside of the county, at county taxpayer expense. The average daily population of Martin County inmates is between 32 and 36, yet according to state corrections guidelines, Martin County can only house 25 in its jail. That means all those above that number again has to be housed outside of the county at an expense to Martin

Martin County Commissioners have been involved in the process of determining the needs of the county law enforcement and state corrections requirements, which will require a new "Justice Center" or having to put a LOT of money into the current structure, but vet still not be in compliance with state standards.

Sheriff Markquart will be giving a tour this week to the Minnesota Financial Bonding Committee, showing the need for state funding assistance towards the building of a new Justice Center. Markquart has already testified at the state capitol about the current facilities and expects to appear before the Minnesota House and Senate to appeal

for funding. Even though financial help from the state will not cover all costs of building, it would go a long way in helping out local taxpayers, should a new facility be built.

Is there a need to build a new justice center? From what I saw on this tour

there is no question in my mind, but that decision lies in the hands of state officials and local residents.

Martin County has been "having to do with what they have" and have done what they can to maintain balance between meeting the needs of the county

along with being compliant with increasing Department of Corrections guidelines for a number of years. We can all do our part by educating ourselves in what is needed for the future.

Granada resident's journey back to complete the TCO Vikings 5k event

Local Granada author Carol Spear was interviewed recently by Minnesota Vikings reporter Lindsey Young on Carol's incredible book "My Million Dollar Miracle".

Carol talked about her long recovery from a massive heart attack two years ago, two days after she took part in the TCO Vikings 5K run at TCF Bank Stadium with her husband, Larry and son, Brian. After going into cardiac arrest on the operating table, Carol miraculously was brought back to life after 60 minutes of CPR on the surgical table at Rochester. Shortly after that, Carol had to undergo a 19-hour surgery to remove a blood clot that was moving toward her heart.

Following surgery, doctors gave Carol a zero percent chance of survival, but God was on her side and on day eight after surgery, doctors increased her chances

to 50 percent, saying she was "a fighter". For the next 97 days, Carol proved medical professionals wrong by continuing to improve and overcome obstacles on her way to re-

covery When Carol announced that she had her sights set this vear's TCO Vikings 5K, family and friends initially

urged her to slow down. She didn't want her memory of the Vikings 5K to be "the place where I had my heart attack". She wanted it to be a positive memory. Doctors cleared her for the event, and she participated in the

event, on September 29th, 2019.

family my came to support me for the event. We all checked into a motel and a friend, Ryan and family, his brought and paid for pizza, cheese pop, sticks and bread sticks for my entire family.

What fun night we had and how blessed we were.

On the day of the 5K, I made it to the hill by the stadium field and said "Okay, God, it's between You and me. I need your help to walk across the fin-

I stood there and looked down on the field and saw that most of the people had left. The cheerleaders were still there and a camera man. I could hear the announcer over the loudspeakers and saw some drummers.

Everyone had told me to look for the big purple arch with the Vikings' head on it, which was the finish line.

I found the big arch, but what was under the arch is what was important to me.

I saw my entire family, except my husband, one grandchild and two of my children, who were walking with me, but not hanging on to me - just walking with me, just in case. All my family were standing under the arch clapping and cheering for me and yelling out my name with words of encouragement, "Come on mom - Come on grandma - you can do

"And I did."
