## Heartland Senior Living breaks new ground

Heartland Senior Living broke ground on two new construction projects on Tuesday, October 9th, 2018.

The ceremonies began in Winnebago, where construction is set to begin on an addition to Parker Oaks Senior Living that will include 12 assisted living apartments, a community room, dining room and lounge, as well as space for support staff. That afternoon festivities moved to Wells, where ground was broken on a new, free-standing 20-unit facility at 315 2nd Avenue NW (across from Casey's). This project will feature 10 assisted living apartments and 10 memory care apartments. Both projects are expected to be completed and ready for occupancy in 2019.

Bill Erickson, Heartland Senior Living President, said, "Heartland Senior Living takes great pleasure in announcing the start of construction for new senior living properties in Wells and Winnebago. These new facilities will significantly enhance the lives of seniors in

our area and provide great assurance to their families."

Heartland Senior Living is a community-based, locally operated non-profit organization offering a variety of living options for seniors in south central Minnesota. Its facilities include Truman Senior Living and Manor Apartments in Truman, Parkview Care Center in Wells and Parker Oaks Senior Living in Winnebago. Heartland Rural Services, LLC will continue to provide management services at all three locations.

The projects are funded by a United States Department of Agriculture (USDA) Direct Loan and a USDA Guaranteed Loan through Profinium, Inc. of Truman. The general contractor is Fairmont-based Tech Builders. Design services were provided by Trossen Wright Plutowski Architects, PA of Minneapolis.

The three facilities currently employ 179 area workers and are licensed to provide housing and various levels of care services to 164 residents.

The Chubb House, which was built by Orville P. Chubb and his wife Sarah in 1867 is located at 209 Lake Avenue in Fairmont.

The Chubb House is on

the National Register of Historic Places and is managed by the Martin County Preservation Association.

Cost for the meal is \$10 per person and the meal will feature homemade stew, apple sauce, assorted breads, beet pickles and pumpkin dessert.

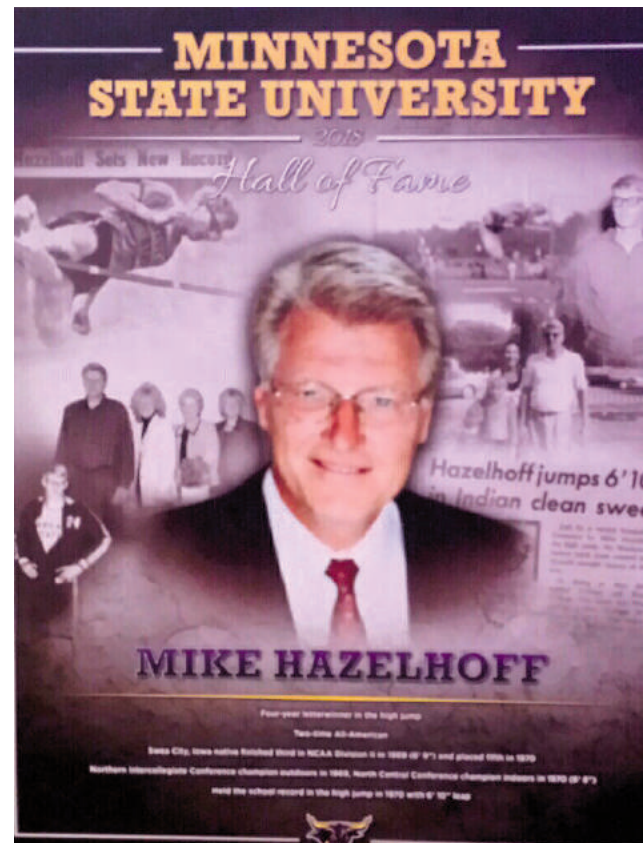

# A Legendary Football Coach

Fall is upon us and with the cool, crisp autumn air we know that the football season is here. Whether you choose to follow the Minnesota Vikings, the Minnesota Gophers, the Fairmont Cardinals, or all of these local favorites, you're sure to be in for some exciting games.

Closer to home, the Fairmont Cardinals have provided the local area with successful, exciting, and well coached games for many years. For those that have followed Fairmont Cardinal football for many years, the name Tom Mahoney quickly comes to mind. He had a long and very successful career coaching football in Fairmont and was considered one of the greatest football minds in Minnesota prep history. So successful, in fact, that he was honored by having the football field in Fairmont named after him, Mahoney Field.

Mahoney was born in Duluth, Minnesota,

and moved with his family to Minneapolis where he attended Minneapolis Edison High School. He played for the Edison football team until he graduated in 1945. After high school he served in the Navy and then attended the University of Minnesota graduating in 1950. Following graduation, he became the assistant athletic trainer for the Gopher football and hockey teams. However, his love of sports was moving him toward coaching.

As a result, Mahoney accepted a position at Lake City as football coach in 1951. He was also the school's athletic director and served as the head

baseball coach for three years. He then took a position teaching and coaching football in Fairmont in 1956 succeeding Dick Potvin.

In his first year of coaching in 1956 he had a five-four record. During his thirty-nine-year career from 1956 until he retired in 1990, he recorded a 256-94-8. That stretch, including a thirty-one game winning streak from 1967-69, made him the winningest

football coach in Minnesota history at that time.

Mahoney apparently had the ability to unite his players and coaches toward a common

goal while simultaneously serving as a positive role model. This "family atmosphere" he was able to create proved successful in his coaching career as well as providing a positive environment for the community regarding high school football in Fairmont. Among the many student athletes he coached was Jerry Rosburg, a 1974 FHS graduate, presently a special teams coach for the Baltimore Ravens in the NFL. As a result of his successful coaching career, he was inducted into a number of Halls of Fame including being honored with numerous other awards.

During, and subsequent, to his coaching career he was active in a

number of other athletic endeavors. He was on the "chain gang" for Gopher games for many years, he was active in the Minnesota State High School Coaches Association, and he refereed in the North Central Conference for many years.

Mahoney was also very civic minded. Consequently, he volunteered and served on a number of different organizations including the Police Commission, the Safety Council, the Park Board, and other organizations as well as being active in his church, St. John Vianney.

The term "legend" is defined by dictionary.com as

a non-historical or unverifiable story handed down by tradition from earlier times and popularly accepted as historical. In Mahoney's instance, however, his record over his many years of coaching is certainly verifiable and historically documented. It would seem safe to say that Tom Mahoney was indeed a legendary football coach. His legacy from those early games at the athletic field on Tilden Street by Grace Lutheran Church to those played at Mahoney Field is now being carried on by his grandson, Mat Mahoney.

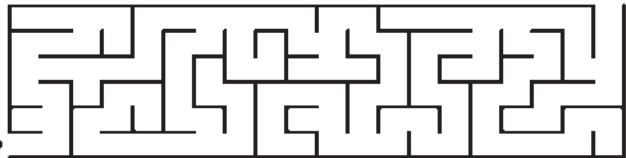

**LETTERS TO THE EDITOR****Community Center - citizen approval?**

There have been several "Letters to the Editor" relative to the construction of a "Community Center" in Fairmont. The recent letter in the Sentinel from Craig Nelson, questioning the impact that the proposed facility will have on local non-profit organizations, prompted this letter.

I am a member of the Knights of Columbus and in 2003, after '8' years of meetings and fundraising efforts, we opened our facility located at 920 East 10th Street. The intent of this facility was, and continues to be, our desire to help make Fairmont a little better place in which to live. During these past 15 years our council has oper-

ated its facility completely with volunteer help. This allowed funds available to be donated rather than being paid to our members. Using this mentality has proven to be very effective.

During this past year our council has been able to donate in excess of \$70,000 back to our community. These funds were not only donated to our church and our school, but also to many local non-profits organizations. In addition to the funds donated, our council also paid in excess of \$1,000 per month in real estate taxes. These tax dollars not only helped to support our community, but more specifically helped to support "3" non-profit or-

ganizations, that compete with our facility, and pay nothing in real estate taxes. These three organizations also have paid managers/directors, while our manager donates his time.

The proposed community center has a banquet facility with seating for 300, duplicating the present seating capacity for our Knights of Columbus Hall. If/when the community center is built this will result in "4" local tax subsidized businesses our council will be asked to support via our real estate taxes. This is being done, once again, while each has paid employee(s), while competing with our organization and paying nothing in real estate taxes. We, as members of the Knights of Columbus, do not mind competition if it is on a level playing field. Competition by tax subsidized competitors is not meeting this requirement.

In conversations with city officials I have been

told that the proposed city commitment to the community center will be \$14,000,000, with the community center committee being required to come up with the remaining \$10,000,000. The city will be "bonding" for these funds and therefore "no citizen voting" will take place, only approval by our city council will be required. If a referendum were used for financing, as was the case in previous years regarding this issue, citizen approval would have been required.

I certainly want what is best for the City of Fairmont, but with this initiative it appears as if the Knights could be paying a very high price---our facility.

Please contact your mayor and council members with any questions, concerns or comments that you might have. Your input is needed!

## Sharing Her Story

### Melinda Chambers

You never think you are going to be the one to hear those words that you have breast cancer. I began thinking about getting my mammograms at 40 with no real worries. My journey began in October of 2017. I was laying down on the couch watching a movie with my youngest daughter, Avery, when I felt an uncomfortable pain on my right breast. I always do a self-check exam at the beginning of each month with no worries, but this time I felt a lump. I went in for a checkup with Dr. Marie Morris at Mayo Clinic and she recommended I have a mammogram and ultrasound here in Fairmont. Both identified calcifications which led to another referral to the Andreas Cancer Center-Mayo Health in Mankato for another mammogram and biopsy.

It was confirmed that I had Invasive Ductal Carcinoma in the right breast and one lymph node. I received the call on November 16th, 2017, the day after my biopsy. This was the day that my world had changed. So many questions went through my mind, but the main thing I worried most about was not myself, but my family. I have three children. McKayla, who at the time was 15 years old, Caleb age 10, and my youngest Avery, age 7. I did not want my children and my husband, Shawn Chambers, to live

in a world where they would grow up and live without me. I remember the responses that I received from my children as my two youngest did not have a clear understanding of what Cancer really was and the fact that they immediately thought that I was going to die. I knew that was when I had to be strong and do whatever it took to fight this battle.

I went for my MRI to have a better knowledge of what

me that he was sorry because I would lose all of my hair. This is when it became all to surreal. I would have neoadjuvant chemotherapy starting on December 12th, 2017 in Fairmont. I started with weekly paclitaxel with trastuzumab and pertuzumab, for a total of 12 weeks. I had an array of side effects, which was relieved through medication. I also had the best nurses and team at the Infusion Center at Fairmont

we were up against. I had found that I was ER+/PR+/HER2+. My Surgical Oncologist, Dr. Tara Krosch, gave me a timeline of what treatment would take place prior to my surgery, as they had wanted to shrink my tumor first. There were so many options to choose from for surgery. However, we knew that chemotherapy would come first. On December 7th, 2017, is when I had met my Oncologist, Dr. Amrit Singh. We went through a thorough timeline of my treatment. I remember when he told

Medical Center. They made me feel at ease throughout my treatment. I was able to continue working at Fairmont High School through this time. I received so much support from not only my family, but also our community, especially through Fairmont High School and Elementary.

I remember when I began to lose my hair. This was 5 weeks after my first treatment had started. It was a few pieces at first, but it soon quickly turned into big clumps of hair. I remember I



only allowed myself to have one big cry over it at night. My husband was there to comfort me. He is my rock. It was devastating for me as I had loved my long hair. I had it cut short at first, but soon I had my friend, Lisa De Boer, buzz it all off. I would wear a wig, beanies, and scarves for the rest of my treatment until my hair would grow back again.

I took two months of medical leave when I began my infusion of Adriamycin and Cytosan (aka "The Red Devil") in March and April. This was to be given every two weeks for a total of four cycles. This was the hardest part of my treatment. For two months I was not in control of myself as the side effects were strong. I would go in for my infusion, feel better after a week, only to follow along with the next cycle of treatment. I remember how happy I was to have rang the bell during my last treatment. I would have a month to recover before my surgery in June.

After all I had went through I knew that having surgery was my next step on my journey. On Wednesday, June 6th, 2017, I had went in for my bilateral mastectomy

and sentinel node removal. Although I had cancer in my right breast, I did not want to have to go through this whole process again, so I chose to have both removed followed with the first step of reconstruction by having expanders. Surgery had went well. However, the following Monday I had received a call from my Surgical Oncologist. I remember her telling me over the phone that they had found an additional tumor that was not detected by the MRI and that all three of the sentinel nodes that were removed also had cancer. I would go in for surgery again that week to have the all of my lymph nodes removed from my upper right arm area along with more of my breast tissue. I was scared again, but still had the love and support from everyone, especially my husband, children and extended family. On June 15th, 2018, I had gone again to remove the cancer. This time pathology reported that there was "No Evidence Detected" from the remaining nodes along with the area of breast tissue removed. To ensure that I would be "healthier" I received 28 rounds of radiation in Mankato, MN with the help of my Radiology Oncologist, Dr. David Owens and his wonderful team. I was lucky to have friends and family members drive me to each of my treatments. Once again I was able to ring

the bell as I had finished another form of cancer treatment.

I hate cancer. All of it. I hate that so many suffer, and it doesn't stop. It is also one thing that scares me for myself and others. I have learned so much and have been blessed that there was specific medication for my type of cancer. I am continuing on through my journey by having a year of hormonal therapy, physical therapy, surgery to have my ovaries and fallopian tubes removed in the month of October, as well as my second step towards completing my reconstruction by having breast implants, which will occur next summer.

Through all of this I have found strength in myself and have been reminded what amazing family and friends I am blessed with. I give those extra hugs because I don't want to take time for granted. Positivity is key to survival. I am now in a club I didn't want to be in but wouldn't change now that I have joined. I am bonded with some amazing women that will be my friends and sisters for life. And we are all strong and fighting for raising awareness towards finding a cure. I think it is so important to remember to get your mammograms and do monthly self-checks.

# What is Fire Prevention Week?

National Fire Prevention Week is observed in the United States and Canada, during the week (from Sunday to Saturday) in which October 9th falls.

In the United States, the first Presidential proclamation of Fire Prevention Week was made in 1925 by President Calvin Coolidge. The National Fire Protection Association (NFPA) continues to be the international sponsor of the week.

The Fire Prevention Week commemorates the Great Chicago Fire. On the 40th anniversary (1911) of the Great Chicago Fire, the Fire Marshals Association of North America (FMANA); the oldest membership section of the National Fire Protection Association (NFPA), sponsored the first National Fire Prevention Day, deciding to observe the anniversary as a way to keep the public informed

about the importance of fire prevention. In May 1919, when the NFPA held its 23rd annual meeting in Ottawa at the invitation of the Dominion Fire Prevention Association (DFPA), the NFPA and DFPA both passed resolutions urging governments in the United States and Canada to support the campaign for a common Fire Prevention Day. This was expanded to Fire Prevention Week in 1922. The non-profit

NFPA, which has officially sponsored Fire Prevention Week since its inception, selects the annual theme for Fire Prevention Week.

In the United States, the first national Fire Prevention Day proclamation was issued by Presi-

dent Woodrow Wilson in 1920. When President Calvin Coolidge proclaimed the first National Fire Prevention Week on October 4th-10th, 1925, he noted that in the previous year some 15,000 lives were lost to fire in the United States. Calling the

## Minnesota Fallen Firefighter Memorial Service

Minnesotans – including families of firefighters who died in the line of duty, firefighters from around the state, community leaders and the public gathered at the Minnesota Fallen Firefighter Memorial September 30th to remember those who paid the ultimate price and honor the families that survive them.

The 2018 Minnesota Fallen Firefighter Memorial Service is a solemn ceremony.



This year's memorial service honored two firefighters who died with-

in the past year, and seven families and fire departments of firefighters who died between 1934 and 1989. Since 1881, 227 Minnesota firefighters have died in the line of duty. Their names have been inscribed on columns throughout the nationally recognized memorial, located on the south side of the Capitol grounds.

The memorial service is held each year on the last Sunday in September, which has been designated as the state's official day to honor Minnesota's fallen firefighters. This year's memorial service honored firefighter Timo-

thy Royce and Fire Captain Jeffrey Vollmer, who died in line of duty in 2017 – 2018, two fallen firefighters' families the Minnesota Fire Service Foundation was able to track down since last year's memorial service, as well as four Minnesota fire departments who lost firefighters in the 1950s, 1960s and 1980s. The foundation coordinates the effort to recognize the state's firefighters who died in the line of duty and provides support and resources to fire departments, firefighters and their families throughout Minnesota.

## "Look, Listen, Learn"

This year's Fire Prevention Week campaign, "Look. Listen. Learn. Be aware. Fire can happen anywhere," works to educate people about three basic but essential steps to take to reduce the likelihood of having a fire--and how to escape safely in the event of one:

### LOOK

Look for places fire could start. Take a good look around your home. Identify potential fire

### LISTEN

Listen for the sound of the smoke alarm. You could have only minutes to escape safely once the smoke alarm sounds. Go to your outside meeting place, which should be a safe distance from the home and where ev-

**LEARN**  
Learn two ways out of every room and make sure all doors and windows leading outside open easily and are free of clutter.

Also, Sparky the Fire Dog® has a new friend, Simon, who is helping teach this year's FPW messages – He's a smart, resourceful character who will join Sparky in spreading fire-safety messages to adults and children alike.

### Additional tips for preventing fires in homes

According to the National Fire Protection Association, 2 out of 5 home fires begin in the kitchen. Never leave the kitchen when food is cooking (especially on the burners), and keep a fire extinguisher in or near the kitchen.

- Have your chimneys cleaned regularly, and be very careful with portable space heaters. Make sure they are several feet away from drapes, clothing, or anything that could catch fire.
- Are your outlets overloaded? Check the circuit loads of your electrical appliances and devices. You might need to install additional circuits.
- Never smoke in bed or while lying on the sofa. (Or better yet, give up smoking altogether!)
- Inspect your appliance cords. If any are torn, ripped, or damaged in any way, replace them immediately. If a cord or plug ever feels hot, unplug it.



- Use extension cords correctly. Follow these recommendations from the Electrical Safety Foundation International.

### "Refrigerator Boxes"

At the end of a trip, we came home to a dead refrigerator. Ugh! With just two thumps on the side it would start running and worked well...until it died again a few hours later. I insisted, "We don't need a new refrigerator, I can fix this one." She was skeptical, but I assured her, "I just need to take the back panel off and find the obvious loose connection."

A week or so went by. I never did find time to make the repairs and a lot of food was being wasted. Meanwhile, my wife fired up the little refrigerator in the camper. That worked well for me. She, however, wasn't going to settle for crossing the driveway in house slippers during the upcoming Minnesota winter weather to fetch milk for breakfast. She got online to start looking at new appliances. I helped by grumbling from the

sidelines.

I wasn't going to spend three or four grand on a refrigerator. "All I want is an ice and water dispenser in the door!" I said, resistant to buying a new fridge. "I don't want a TV monitor, internet access or any of that fancy-pants stuff and I won't have some high-falutin appliance telling me when I'm low on milk!" We decided on a very basic, side-by-side and it was only \$827.

I went to Duluth the next day to pick it up and bring it home. Using an appliance dolly I brought it up on the back deck and unwrapped it. This baby was so cheap it didn't even come in a box - just protective styrofoam corner pieces, shrink wrapped in plastic. "Refrigerators should come in boxes." I grumbled to myself, feeling slighted.

As I pulled the plastic

and removed the sticks of styrofoam, I thought about days long ago, when the girls were little. They loved refrigerator boxes. Every summer I would call Mike's TV and Appliance: "Hey Mike, can I come get a big box?" He would laugh, "For the girls?" "Yeah," I said, "School's out." Mike had a daughter. He understood where I was coming from. "Sure, come on over. If I don't have a box, we'll unpack a fridge for the display floor."

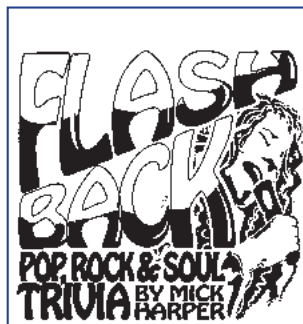
The girls were always excited when I came home with a big box. I would put it in the backyard and grab my utility knife. Only Dad was allowed to use the razor sharp tool, so they would tell me where they wanted things and I would do the cutting.

We always started with the door. Sometimes the

door had a window and sometimes not, but it always had a hole cut for a handle. Windows were made by cutting a capital I shape on the sides of the box. The girls could bend each piece back, leaving the sides attached, so they could be closed again like shutters.

O'Hara Hardware always had a quart or two of paint that was mixed a wrong color and I could pick them up for a buck or two each. I would give the girls a couple of old brushes and they would go to town painting their box anyway they wanted. When the paint dried, they would use fat sticks of bright, colorful sidewalk chalk to put the finishing touches on their house, club or fort...secret meetings... no boys were allowed... they were planning to take over the world...

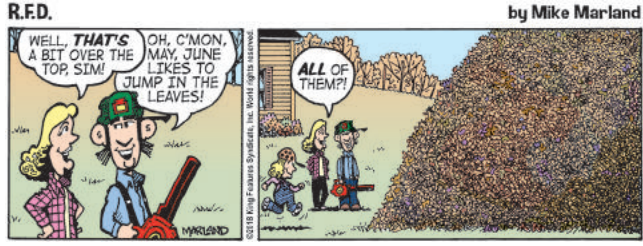
