## Medicare Open Enrollments in Fairmont

The 2016 annual enrollment period for Medicare Prescription Drug Plans and Medicare Advantage Plans runs from October 15th, 2015 to December 7th, 2015. During this time you can enroll in a plan if you did not previously enroll or change to a new plan. Changes then become effective on January 1st, 2016. If you do not make changes by December 7th, 2015, in most cases you will not be able to change plans again until 2017.

The Minnesota River Area Agency on Aging, Inc. will once again be assisting Medicare beneficiaries with their 2015 Medicare plan research and enrollment. Trained volunteers will be available by appointment in Fairmont at the Martin County Library on Wednesday,

November 4th and Tuesday, November 17th. To schedule an appointment call the Senior LinkAge Line® at 1-800-333-2433.

Medicare beneficiaries need to bring with them current insurance information, their Medicare card and their medications. smith demonstrations, kids games and train rides, apple pressing, cookie baking and more. Fairmont Market Square also hosted many visitors to take in the local vendors, food stands, and entertainment provided.



## Project 1590 Trails Update

On Friday, October 16th, members of the 1590 steering committee and a few interested community members met with Minnesota State Senator Julie Rosen and Minnesota State Representative Bob Gunther. The purpose of that meeting was twofold: 1. To provide information to our officials regarding the projects Project 1590 has gathered from the community-wide survey and, 2. to ask the Senator Rosen and Representative Gunther for their help as these projects move forward (specifically with fund, i.e. grants).

Four projects were discussed during the session and both Senator Rosen and Representative Gunther were helpful with suggestions as to how to

proceed with each project. Wes Brown, an engineer with Bolton and Menk, provided detailed maps for proposed walking and bike trails. Some for connecting existing trails with the city, and secondly to build regional trails that would connect with trails to Sherburn, Jackson and the Okoboji area, along with a trail in Watonwan County. Information was provided on grants that would be available for these regional trails. The city has allocated funds for some trails within Fairmont in its 2016 budget.

## Dutch Creek Pond Proposal

A holding pond on Dutch Creek would enhance the water quality of our lakes as well as improving spawning areas for game fish. This project was discussed with Representative Bob Gunther and Senator Julie Rosen at an information session with members of the 1590 Steering Committee. The Fairmont Lakes Foundation was also present and indicated the retaining pond on Dutch Creek was their top priority in lake management at this time.

Martin Soil and Wa-

ter Conservation District is presently monitoring sedimentation, flow rates and contamination coming out of Dutch Creek. By creating a reservoir on the creek, sediments would settle there rather than in Hall Lake. Also, nutrients which contribute to algae growth would be "filtered out" by aquatic vegetation in the retaining pond.

Both Senator Rosen and Representative Gunther were supportive and provided grant information.

The Fairmont Lakes Foundation has been instrumental in clearing shoreline, lake cleanups (George and Amber), as well as fish management. They have expanded lake access in the form of three new fishing piers and securing public access on the south end of Amber Lake.

The Dutch Creek holding pond has been proposed for years; it's hoped that Project 1590 and the Fairmont Lakes Foundation can bring the project to fruition. For more information or to become a member of the Fairmont Lakes Foundation, contact Mike Katzenmeyer.

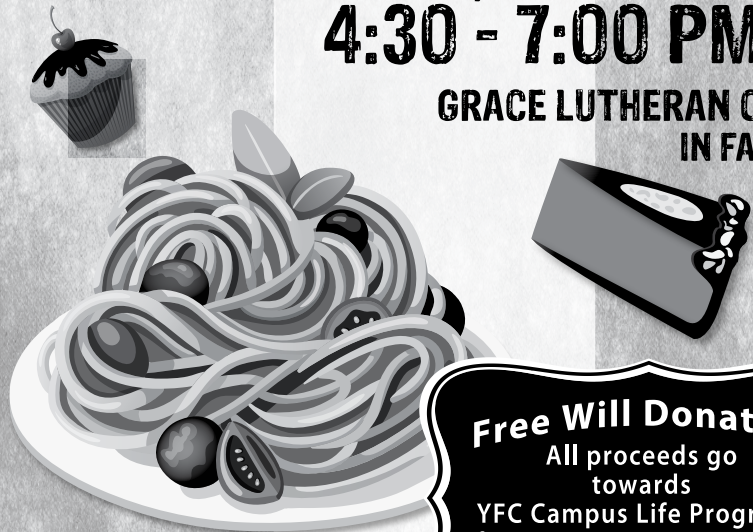

## Easy Spaghetti

### Time at the park

Pa Lloyd is up north helping one of our sons so that leaves me in charge of Maggie, our adorable pup. Pa is her activity director; I'm her feeder and her cuddler! In the afternoon, Maggie starts fussing and barking and I realize this is the time she is taken on her car ride around the lake. She has a set schedule. For the last two days, I have taken her to Gomsrud Park. She had great fun exploring and sniffing out new territory. Today she chased a wind blown feather into the lake and got her feet wet. Three Canadian geese were sitting on the sand and upon seeing this frisky little dog, they high-tailed it into the water while scolding Maggie. The upside is that the excursion wears her out and she naps all evening not wanting to play tug of war or fetch so I can read in peace! I am grateful for the beautiful weather so we can enjoy the park. We both will be glad when the man of the house returns!

Today I am sharing one of my favorite recipes with you. It's one my friend Sharon Hanson shared with me several years ago. Serve this with garlic toast and salad and you are all set! I like it 'cause you don't cook the spaghetti separately. It does need two hours to bake so you need to plan ahead. If your family doesn't care for mushrooms or olives, omit them.

### Easy Spaghetti:

- 1 1/2 pounds hamburger
- 1 small onion, chopped
- 1 small green pepper, chopped
- 1/2 cup sliced ripe olives
- 1 - 4oz. can sliced mushrooms, drained
- 8 oz. can tomato sauce
- 2 1/2 cups canned tomatoes
- 2 cups water
- 2 tsp salt, 1/2 tsp. pepper
- 1 tsp Worcestershire sauce
- 6 drops tabasco sauce
- 1 tsp dried oregano or Italian seasoning
- 4 oz. long spaghetti, broken

Brown hamburger, add onion and green pepper; cook 5 minutes. Add mushrooms, tomato sauce, salt and pepper, Worcestershire sauce, tabasco and oregano; then add water and tomatoes, bring to boil. Add broken, uncooked spaghetti; cover tightly and bake at 325 degrees for one hour. Uncover, stir and bake an additional hour. Have a great week!

## WFS and CVC Announce Merger Plan to Members

After careful consideration, Watonwan Farm Service Co. (WFS) headquartered in Truman, and Central Valley Cooperative (CVC) headquartered in Owatonna, announced that their boards have unanimously approved a plan of merger for the two cooperatives. Both boards are seeking support from their members in this decision as the plan moves to a patron vote in December. Informational meetings have been scheduled for November 12th, 19th, 20th and 24th. Ballots will be mailed to voting members on December 2nd with the voting process closing on December 21st and 22nd. If the members support the merger, the effective date of the unified cooperative would be March 1st, 2016. The merged cooperatives would be named CFS.

The two cooperatives currently work together in several partnerships and for more than a year have been exploring the possibility of consolidation. Although both cooperatives are financially strong, a study involving the boards and management teams, as well as an independent consultant, found there would be significant value to the patrons if the two cooperatives were to consolidate.

WFS Board Chairman, Charlie Johnson, and CVC Board Chairman, Eric Schrader, both feel that a

merger would enhance member value and preserve control by member-owners for a long-term, viable local cooperative.

"So often mergers occur due to financial instability or to overcome weaknesses," said Johnson. "This is not the situation with WFS and CVC; both cooperative are financially stable. As the dynamics in agriculture continue to change, we want to bring the strengths of our cooperatives into a unified company that will thrive in the decades ahead."

The cooperatives identified \$5 - \$7 million in expected savings if the merger were to pass and noted that their combined sales would be in the \$600 million range at today's commodity prices.

"The efficiencies and savings that were identified in the study could not be overlooked," added Schrader. "Together, we would operate more effectively, creating greater value to our members than if we were on our own."

Beyond financial gains, WFS and CVC identified many other benefits with a merger, including employee opportunity and retention, access to capital, risk management, geographic diversity and arbitrage, and maintaining member control.

Although the two companies cover a trade area that is adjacent to each other, they do not operate facilities in the same communities and have no immediate plans to close locations.

## Water Quality and Agriculture Field Day Scheduled

A field day will be held on Tuesday, October 27th, that will focus on the University of Minnesota research and demonstrations being done at the Roberts Research Site Two, north of Granada. We will be discussing the Tile Outlet Treatment Train [TOTT] demonstration at this site, soil health, saturated buffers, bioreactors, root ball instream weirs and cover crops. The site address is 1840 270th Avenue, Granada. This is not the usual research site at the Roberts farm. The site access is one mile east of the Roberts home. Watch for signs. The event will start at 2:00 p.m. and go until 4:00 p.m.

TOTTs are a sequence of conservation practices that cumulatively improve water quality from agricultural lands better than an individual practice. Conservation practices are targeted to the upland, near the tile outlet and in the stream. This site has a bio-reactor-saturated buffer combo, root ball instream weir and cover crops.

In 2015 Mr. Roberts

was selected as a national leader in the Soil Health Champion Network sponsored by the National Association of Conservation Districts. As a Soil Health Champion, Darwin will help raise awareness about the many benefits of soil health practices.

**K**aris and I took a trip out to Door County, Wisconsin last week (it is something we have wanted to do for some time now) to see



the fall colors and take in some great views. We stayed in Sturgeon Bay, which is located on the east shore of Green Bay lake. Door County is a peninsula in northeast Wisconsin that is bordered by Green Bay lake on the west side and Lake Michigan on the east side. It was the perfect time to take in the fall colors there! Karis was snapping photos like crazy, capturing the sights of our time there. We were able to enjoy time on both Green Bay and Lake Michigan. My favorite parts

of the trip were taking in some of the local wineries and all the fresh cherries that were abundant in that area! We had fresh cherries for breakfast every day and they tasted so good. It

## Nature by the yard

by Al Batt

The friendly frost warning had become a reality. I thought it would. The bird feeders were so busy, I knew something was up with the weather. White-throated sparrows and juncos were welcome visitors from up north. Blue jays, woodpeckers (red-bellied, downy and hairy), goldfinches, chickadees, nuthatches, and house finches were birds that fed regularly at the trough. There weren't as many birds as the 500,000 likely seen at Hawk Ridge in Duluth, but they were just as cool.

The familiar is special. If I look hard at the ordinary, it becomes extraordinary. Buddhism teaches the principle of awareness. I try to be aware of all things in nature. I never fail to find endless wonders waiting for me. I read once that we shouldn't look for what we saw yesterday. I don't believe that. I love seeing the familiar things over and over again.



Milkweed pods dispersed seeds on silky tufts. The curly pods, when sun-dried and empty of seeds, provide visual interest in winter as their stalks protrude through the snow. Baltimore orioles use strips of fiber from those stalks to weave nests in the spring.

I watched a blue jay cache food. The jay was hiding comestibles for future use. One study found a single blue jay capable of caching 3,000 to 5,000 acorns in a fall.

A noisy flock of blackbirds twisted overhead. The collaborative energy of the flock was apparent. The flock provided an extraordinarily ordinary look at nature.

### Q-and-A

"What kind of birds nest in road ditches?" The DNR says 40 kinds of animals do. That includes pheasants, mallards, gray partridges, and rabbits. I've seen red-winged blackbirds nesting in ditches. Other songbirds do nest there, but ditches are primarily pheasant habitat.

"Is vinegar a good weed killer?" The concentration of acetic acid in grocery store vinegar is too low to provide effective weed control. It may give decent

control on small annual weeds such as chickweed or lambsquarters, but not if the plants are good-sized. Vinegar won't con-

trol perennial weeds like bindweed, bittersweet nightshade, dandelions, or thistles. The foliage might burn, but the roots survive. Salt is often used as an herbicide, but it's not a good practice because of the negative impacts of adding salt to soil. Boiling water may control small annuals, but not large annuals or perennials. Other common weed killers including diesel fuel, gasoline, kerosene, oil, and solvents kill plants, but present fire and environ-

mental hazards. Alcohol, baking soda, bleach, borax, dish soap, and oven cleaner kill plants when applied repeatedly at sufficient concentrations. These applications could prove expensive and time consuming.

"How big a territory does a chickadee have?" It varies with habitat quality, but research has found that a breeding territory is approximately 4 to 18 acres with a winter flock ranging up to 50 acres. Young black-capped chickadees leave their parents about a month after hatching to hang out a couple of miles away with other chickadees. The average lifespan of chickadees in the wild is somewhere between 1.5 and 2.5 years.

"How many hummingbirds in a pound?" It varies, but in June Osborne's book, "The Ruby-throated Hummingbird," she said that it takes 160.

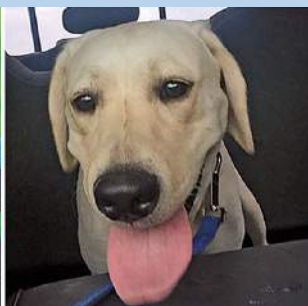

thoughtful mother, grandmother, friend and neighbor.

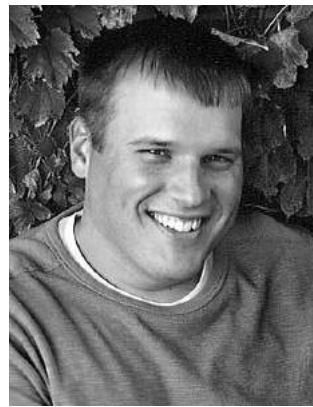

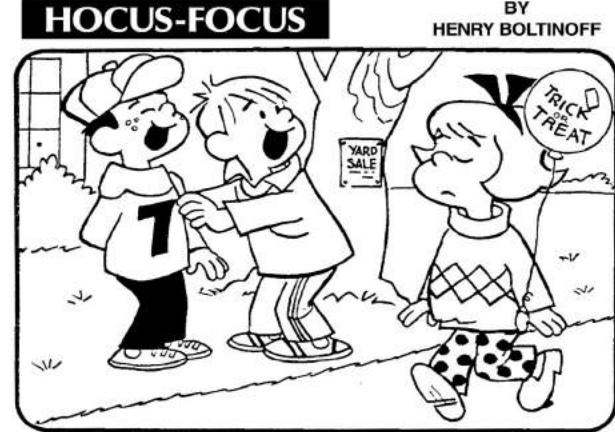

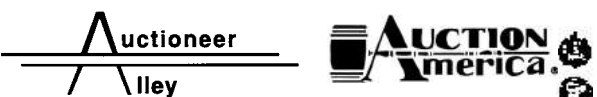
