

Vhat's Cookin

Ratatouille

A recipe for those garden veggies!

In one of my diet cook books, this one by Suzanne Somers, I found a recipe for ratatouille. I liked it so well I made it several times and then forgot about it until last year when my garden lover son gave me three eggplants. I mentioned to a friend that I didn't know what to do with them and she said, "Well, have you ever heard of ratatouille?" I then remembered this recipe! What a perfect way to use the eggplants, along with zucchini and bell peppers. This dish keeps a long time in the refrigerator. I like it as a side dish, over pasta or rice, or even a spoonful on a cracker.

Ratatouille:

1/3 cup plus 2 Tbsp olive oil 2 medium onions, thinly sliced

2 garlic cloves, minced

1 can (28 ounces) peeled tomatoes, with juice

4 bell peppers, julienned

salt and freshly ground black pepper

1 large eggplant, peeled and diced

3 medium zucchini, cut into 1/2 inch slices

Heat a large, deep skillet over medium heat. Add 1/3 cup of the oil and the onion; sauté until translucent. Add the garlic and cook for 1 more minute. Remove onion and garlic from the pan and set aside. Ouarter the tomatoes, reserving any juice, set aside. Layer the bottom of the skillet with the peppers, salt and pepper and 1/4 of the onion-garlic mixture. Then layer with the eggplant, more salt and pepper another 1/4 of the onion-garlic mixture. Repeat layers using the zucchini, then the tomatoes in place of the eggplant, finally topping with the remaining onion-garlic mixture. Pour in the reserved tomato juice and top with the last of the onion-garlic mixture. Top with the remaining 2 tablespoons of oil. Cover and simmer over very low heat for 35-45 minutes, Uncover and cook an additional 10-15 minutes to reduce the liquid. This can be served either hot or cold. Have a great week!







I live in southern Min-"Everything is nearly nesota, but I live in the northern part of the county. So to some, I live in northern Minnesota. A hummingbird zipped by. Orwin Rustad of Faribault watched hummingbirds for years. The last day he saw a hummingbird each year was September 23 on average.

I saw a male cardinal. It was so, searching for a word here, red! I found a turkey feather on the lawn. At the end of summer many birds begin to replace feathers in a molt. When we had free-range chickens, it could take them one to two months to complete a molt. Wild birds are about the same. Most songbirds take one to two months, with the largest, the common raven, taking four or five months.

Molting can be more complicated for larger birds, because larger feathers take longer to grow. in the spring. That's why some birds undergo partial molts. Molting leaves ducks and geese flightless. Some species acquire adult plumages in a single year. Others, such as bald eagles, require up to five years.

The plant looks similar the flowers are vellowishgreen instead of white. The three to five foot tall stalks of parsnip have narrow ridges and small yellow flowers, blooming in June or July in clusters called compound umbels.

The juice of parsnip on skin exposed to sunlight can result in a burn. This is called phytophotodermatitis and the skin discoloration may last two years. Wild parsnip is native to Europe and Asia, and is found throughout most of Minnesota where it's increasing its density. tensive the bright white According to the records of the Wisconsin State Herbarium, the plant was recorded in Wisconsin in 1896. Some scientists believe colonists brought the plant here in the 1600s.





Aldermen whose terms normally expired that year were James McNerney, alderman-at-large; Gene Nave, First Ward; A. B. Colvin, Second Ward and Gordon Benschoter, Third Ward. Dr. W. L. Webb was mayor.



All were taken to a registered recyclist and smelter in St. Paul. Lead acid batteries contain about 18 pounds of toxic materials each and about a gallon of corrosive lead-contaminated acids.
