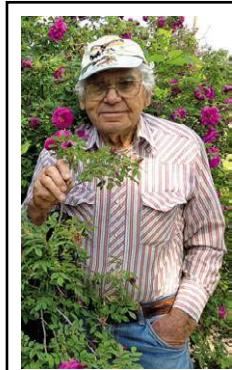

## Back to School Nutrition

Your kids are back to school and we are settling back into our "normal" routines. After school snacks (healthy ones of course) and homework, family meals around the table WITHOUT smart phones, iPads, etc., saying grace before our meal, and taking our multi vitamins again.

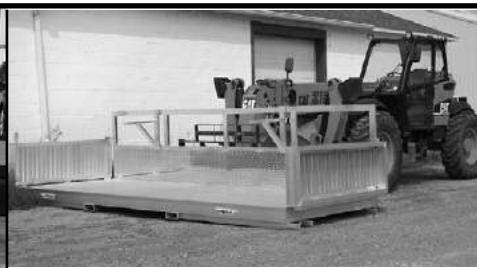

## Ratatouille

### A recipe for those garden veggies!

In one of my diet cook books, this one by Suzanne Somers, I found a recipe for ratatouille. I liked it so well I made it several times and then forgot about it until last year when my garden lover son gave me three eggplants. I mentioned to a friend that I didn't know what to do with them and she said, "Well, have you ever heard of ratatouille?" I then remembered this recipe! What a perfect way to use the eggplants, along with zucchini and bell peppers. This dish keeps a long time in the refrigerator. I like it as a side dish, over pasta or rice, or even a spoonful on a cracker.

### Ratatouille:

1/3 cup plus 2 Tbsp olive oil  
2 medium onions, thinly sliced  
2 garlic cloves, minced  
1 can (28 ounces) peeled tomatoes, with juice  
4 bell peppers, julienned  
salt and freshly ground black pepper  
1 large eggplant, peeled and diced  
3 medium zucchini, cut into 1/2 inch slices

Heat a large, deep skillet over medium heat. Add 1/3 cup of the oil and the onion; sauté until translucent. Add the garlic and cook for 1 more minute. Remove onion and garlic from the pan and set aside. Quarter the tomatoes, reserving any juice, set aside. Layer the bottom of the skillet with the peppers, salt and pepper and 1/4 of the onion-garlic mixture. Then layer with the eggplant, more salt and pepper another 1/4 of the onion-garlic mixture. Repeat layers using the zucchini, then the tomatoes in place of the eggplant, finally topping with the remaining onion-garlic mixture. Pour in the reserved tomato juice and top with the last of the onion-garlic mixture. Top with the remaining 2 tablespoons of oil. Cover and simmer over very low heat for 35-45 minutes. Uncover and cook an additional 10-15 minutes to reduce the liquid. This can be served either hot or cold. Have a great week!

literary artists and their registration fee, travel, etc. Please contact Brenda Byron to discuss your artist project and budget prior to submitting an application. Prairie Lakes Regional Arts Council also has YouTube videos that explain the process to apply for a grant. This program is made possible by funds provided by the McKnight Foundation of Minneapolis under a program designed and administered by the Prairie Lakes Regional Arts Council, Waseca.

Prairie Lakes also provides grants for arts organizations, community groups and schools for arts activities including dance, music, theater, literature, and visual art classes and exhibitions. There is a monthly deadline on the 1st of each month for the Small Arts Project and Arts-In-Education Grant for Schools of up to \$2,500. ## Local Boy Scout Takes Part in World Scout Jamboree in Japan

In 2015, more than 30,000 Scouts and leaders from 161 countries around the world converged on Kirara-hama, Yamaguchi, Japan, for the 23rd World Scout Jamboree recently.

The event provided opportunities to raise awareness about global issues, explore the environment, participate in community service, make friends from around the world, and deepen understanding of developments in science and technology.

Justice Badgley of Jackson took part in this Jamboree and was one of three scouts that were from Minnesota. He gives us a look at the event in his own words:

We left the Minneapolis airport on July 26th. The airplane had a USB charger per chair and a small TV with a bunch of movies to watch. The flight attendants would walk around and say "chicken or beef?" and then you were served a meal tray with your choice. During this time I mastered the use of chopsticks. We flew for about 10 hours and I woke up in Narita International Airport. The first thing we noticed was how hot it was. It was 94 degrees with 100% humidity. After grabbing our luggage and going through customs we got into a bus. While riding we learned three things: 1. The roads in Japan were a lot smaller. 2. The chairs in the back of the bus can rotate around so we can all face each other and 3. The busses are a lot shorter than us and we hit our heads a lot. When we arrived at the hotel we met our tour guide, Coco. When we got to our rooms we opened the door and flipped the light switch but nothing happened. I looked at my roommate

Ryan and he shrugged so we went into our hotel room with flashlights. We explored the room, flipping switches for five minutes trying to find the solution to our problem. Then our scoutmaster knocked on our door to see if everything was okay and we asked him how to turn the lights on. He took our key and put it in a small slot in the wall AND THERE WAS LIGHT. After a grand celebration we put away our backpacks and opened up our small boxes. Inside the boxes were food of all shapes and sizes. We learned these boxes are called Bento Boxes. I tried all of the food even though I didn't know what I was eating. All of the meat in bento boxes is served cold, which takes some getting used to.

The next day we had a wonderful breakfast with spaghetti, raw bacon and french fries. After that we drove to Tokyo. My first impression of Tokyo was seeing a bunch of people all wearing a white shirt with black pants. We successfully navigated Tokyo station with thousands of other scouts from around the world. We then got on a bullet train, which travels at a maximum speed of 246 MPH. We rode on this train for four hours while we traveled to the Jamboree site.

We arrived at the Jamboree and there were scouts everywhere. After removing our duffles we walked three miles to our campsite. Our campsite was really dirty and dusty. The next day we woke up at 6 am to start cooking. Being patrol leader, I had to wake all of my patrol members up and assign tasks. We received a case of Yakult which is a strange Japanese yogurt drink, a bag of almond jelly (even though it tastes like pears) and bread. After breakfast we were sent to go explore the camp. I immediately went over to Brazil and made some friends. That night they had a show at the stage. There was a J-pop band and a tribal drum band, which were really cool.

The next day we were all sent to a nature area to do group exercises to help us bond more. That day it hit 110 degrees at noon.

On July 30th I met my "twin" Joe. Joe and I look exactly the same except he is 3 inches shorter and he lives in the UK. The same day I met my best friend Olivia from Switzerland who invited us over for spaghetti that night.

The next day was culture day where we had to sing a traditional Czech song and do a dance and then play some traditional Japanese games. After breakfast I was invited go with Brazil to do a tradi-

tional wedding dance and they gave me a cool woven hat that they wear in Brazil. After that we went over to Poland's tent and played a game where you flick a bottle cap on a race car track/obstacle course and then the next player goes and you all race to the end.

The next day was world food day. We cooked marshmallows and made funnel cakes. I tried real Swiss chocolate, Brazilian peanut butter and weird UK pancake things that are really floppy. That night was the midweek show where the prince of Japan gave a speech. On August 4th I finally got to go swimming!!! After swimming, we went to the food area and had the best french fries of all time.

The Japanese taught about the food we were eating and the names of it all. We made a miso stew that was pretty scary at first, but everyone enjoyed it.

The next day we were up early and we drove to Kudamatsu-shi and were happily greeted at Karyo high school. I got to try traditional tea from Japan and did origami with the students. After that we went to an auditorium and saw a drum performance and a speech from the mayor. Later that day we toured a steel processing plant and it was 150 degrees in there!

On the final night of jamboree, Marty Friedman played some songs and they passed the torch to America so that they can host the 2019 Jamboree. Afterwards there were

fireworks and we took down camp and all slept on cots outside.

We left the jamboree site very early the next day and headed back to Tokyo. We toured an amusement park/aquarium and went to the tomb of the unknown soldier in Japan and also went to a restaurant where you cooked your own food on some coals in the table.

The final day in Japan we toured a Buddhist temple and Shinto shrine and went shopping. We left Japan at 4 pm and flew back home. It was nice to have warm meat again and I watched six seasons of Big Bang Theory and didn't sleep. We arrived in Minneapolis the same day we left Tokyo at 1 pm.

### Fairmont High School's First Cross Country Team

Fairmont High School's first boys cross country team was organized just before the start of 1965 school year.

Retired Fairmont teacher Maynard Johnson wrote the following about how the team was organized:

"50 years ago I was a new teacher at Fairmont High School, hired to be a math teacher and to coach track and cross country. I had coached track but never cross country and FHS never had a cross country program. How do I start in August before school starts? Well, my old math teacher Lou Gertsen at Jackson H.S. had moved to Fairmont and was the head basketball coach in Fairmont. I asked him if he knew any runners and he said 'I have all my players that don't go out for football run miles, lots of them.'"

"That was the beginning. They had friends and we started with 10-15 kids, and ran around the now Elementary School. The team had seven or eight meets, all out of town."

"We started slow but showed improvement. They all had a personal

best times and enjoyed seeing their own improvement. Visiting schools that had cross country for years was another learning experience. We had district meets in those days and some made it to the region and one made it to the state meet, one of the fall basketball players, Tom Wannarka."

The very first meet was at St. James. St. James won the meet with 29 points, Blue Earth, 52, Wells and Fairmont, 76. Fairmont's best time was 11:20 by Tom Wannarka (5th place).

Coach Johnson went on with the 1965 season summary:

"Fairmont High School started its first season with not only inexperience but with no idea of what cross country was all about. Their first meeting, of course, was a big learning experience. They tied Wells for last place at St. James."

"The second meet at Mankato was against two

of the top teams in Region 2. Fairmont placed a poor second to each, but experienced running on hills and very poor weather conditions."

"The District 5 meet was probably the high spot of our first season. We placed 2nd to Blue Earth and Tom Wannarka took individual honors. He advanced to the regional meet at Jackson. He placed 35th among 95 runners."

### Ask A Trooper: Ticketing Slow Drivers

by Sgt. Troy Christianson, MN State Patrol

**Question: Can a person get a ticket for driving too slow?**

**Answer:** Yes. Freeways in Minnesota have an actual posted minimum speed limit. A driver must use due care in operating a vehicle, so there are times when traveling under that limit would be legal and encouraged because of weather conditions (snow, ice, fog, etc.) and actual or potential hazards on the highway.

Here is what Minnesota State Statute 169.15 says about impeding traffic: "No person shall drive a motor vehicle at such a slow speed as to impede or block the normal and reasonable movement of traffic except when reduced speed is necessary for safe operation or in compliance with law or except when the vehicle is temporarily unable to maintain a greater speed due to a combination of the weight of the vehicle and the grade of the highway."

I look at it as how a "normal and reasonable" person would travel on a road. If a motorist is unable to maintain a safe speed when it's a clear, sunny day and roads are in good condition, I would look for a reason beyond the violation, including:

- Impairment from alcohol or drugs, even prescription medications
- General physical/health problems
- Diabetic loss of consciousness or seizures
- Vision problems
- Lack of physical driving skills
- Lack of knowledge of traffic laws
- Mental or emotional problems (including road rage, memory loss, etc.)

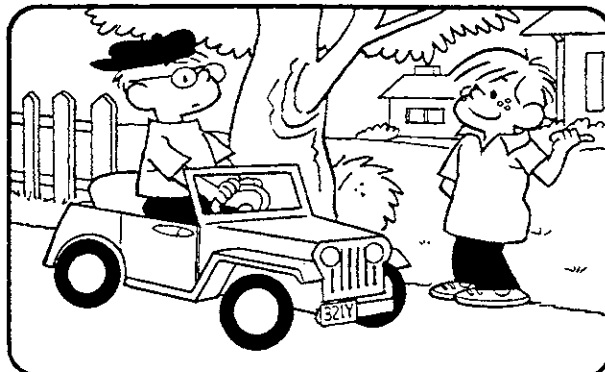

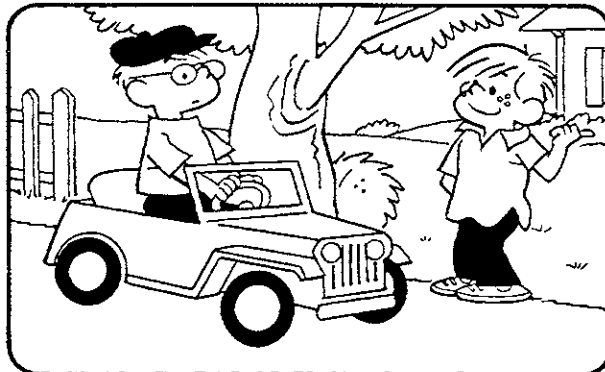

# Fall Travel

—Oil, Tires, Tune-ups and the Works!—

## My neighbor Crandall stops by

"How are you doing?" I ask.

"Everything is nearly copacetic. I've learned a couple of things this week. I finally fixed that dripping faucet. That duct tape is a miracle worker. I've found that each time I look in a mirror, I realize that they don't make mirrors like they used to. I've discovered that I'm great at multitasking. I eat while watching TV. Sometimes I do both of those things while hating roundabouts. I have unlimited talk on my cellphone, but when I get the bill I'm reminded that the price of listening is killing me. Pop's dentures don't fit him. They're loose. Every time he sneezes, everyone ducks. But what drives Pop crazy are the squirrels raiding his birdfeeders. He can't take his much needed and well-deserved naps. He was so exhausted that he went to see Doc Splint Eastwood. Pop had become a doorstop that drooled. Splint gave him a prescription for some sleeping pills that worked like a dream. But Pop still wasn't getting an afternoon nap."

"Why not?" I ask.



"Didn't the pills work?"

"I don't know. Whenever Pop was able to catch a squirrel, it refused to swallow one of the pills."

### Nature by the yard

I live in southern Minnesota, but I live in the northern part of the county. So to some, I live in northern Minnesota. A hummingbird zipped by. Orwin Rustad of Faribault watched hummingbirds for years. The last day he saw a hummingbird each year was September 23 on average.

I saw a male cardinal. It was so, searching for a word here, red! I found a turkey feather on the lawn. At the end of summer many birds begin to replace feathers in a molt. When we had free-range chickens, it could take them one to two months to complete a molt. Wild birds are about the same. Most songbirds take one to two months, with the largest, the common raven, taking four or five months.

Molting can be more complicated for larger birds, because larger feath-

ers take longer to grow. That's why some birds undergo partial molts. Molting leaves ducks and geese flightless. Some species acquire adult plumages in a single year. Others, such as bald eagles, require up to five years.

I put out a bit of food for the crows. They raised a ruckus. When the noise subsided, they flew in and grabbed the grub. Loud sounds, food gone. Caws-and-effect.

### Q-and-A

"Is there a good online source of birdsongs?" There are many, but one of the best is xeno-canto. It's a website dedicated to sharing bird sounds from around the world.

Paul Schwab of Owatonna wondered if fledgling male goldfinches will be yellow now and then change before winter or get their first yellow in the spring? The young males do get some yellow feathers earlier, but don't turn bright yellow until their second summer.

The more mature the adult male, the more extensive the bright white patches on his tail feathers. An interesting aside is that a goldfinch's legs, feet and bill change from a dark grayish brown to a buffy yellow-orange color

in the spring.

Karen Wright of Mankato asks if there are albino insects. I'm not aware of any albino insects or spiders. Insects endemic to caves or those in the immediate aftermath of shedding exoskeletons could be white.

Daniel Otten of Hayward asks if we've had wild parsnip for long and if wild cucumber is native. As a boy, I knew wild parsnip as a tenacious weed that the cows wouldn't eat. The plant looks similar to Queen Anne's lace, but the flowers are yellowish-green instead of white. The three to five foot tall stalks of parsnip have narrow ridges and small yellow flowers, blooming in June or July in clusters called compound umbels.

The juice of parsnip on skin exposed to sunlight can result in a burn. This is called phytophotodermatitis and the skin discoloration may last two years. Wild parsnip is native to Europe and Asia, and is found throughout most of Minnesota where it's increasing its density. According to the records of the Wisconsin State Herbarium, the plant was recorded in Wisconsin in 1896. Some scientists believe colonists brought the plant here in the 1600s.

In reading "Child's History of Waseca County," I found wild parsnip mentioned in 1858. In late summer, trees or shrubs are festooned with wild cucumber vines that produce fragrant, yellowish-white flowers. The fruit resembles a small, round cucumber with spines on

it. It's a fast-growing, warm season annual that is native.

Arnold Koelpin of New Ulm asks why he didn't see many June bugs this year. I don't know. The insects, also called May beetles or June beetles, are about 1 inch long, a chestnut-brown color and fly to lights in early summer. The grubs are whitish with brown heads, are usually found curled in a "C" shape and range from 1/2 to 1 inch long. These are the largest grubs found in turf. I didn't see many either.

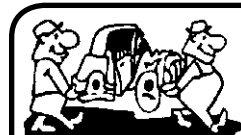

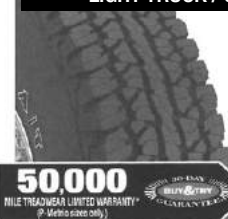

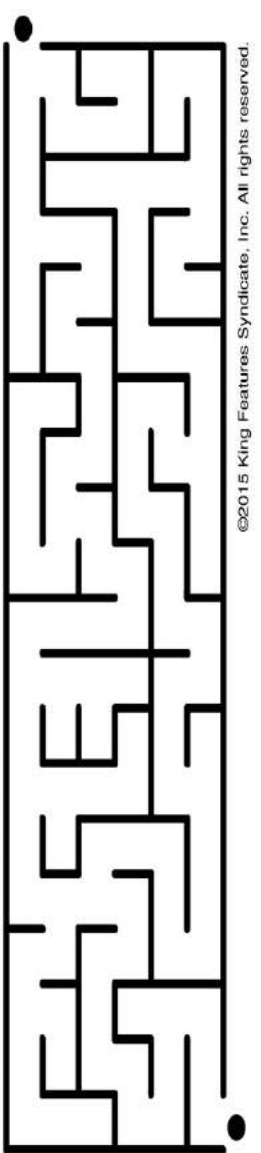

Fairmont was to vote on amending the City Charter to authorize a Fourth Ward. Recent annexation of suburbs and some farm land to the city proper had created the need for an additional ward for fair representation and to simplify voting procedures. Also included in the proposition was a revision of the City Council structure to eliminate the office of Alderman-At-Large and to elect two aldermen

from each of the four wards. The amendment proposal also provided for retaining the mayor and three aldermen whose terms did not expire that year, meaning that two aldermen would have to be elected for the Second Ward, one each for First, Third and Fourth Wards in the upcoming election in November. Aldermen whose terms normally expired that year were James McNerney, alderman-at-large; Gene Nave, First Ward; A. B. Colvin, Second Ward and Gordon Benschofer, Third Ward. Dr. W. L. Webb was mayor.

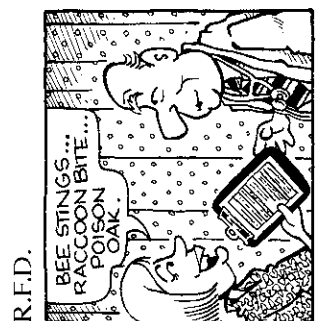
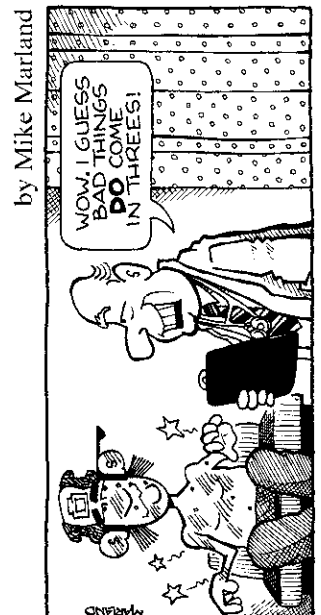

'Keep Your Day' is one of the key concepts of Top 20. It's about choosing to 'Keep Your Day' even when it's not going your way. When something negative happens in your day you can choose to bring positive energy to that situation and 'Keep your Day'. 2. Focus on the beauty in your life. Ask yourself "what did I experience today that was beautiful?" Notice that there is beauty all around you. Use all five senses: sight, sound, touch, taste and smell to experience beauty. Mother Theresa said, "Life is beauty, admire it." Think of the visual beauty of a sunrise or sunset, or the beautiful flowered gardens. Listen to beautiful music and the birds' beautiful songs. Taste the wonderful produce available this time of year like locally grown cantaloupe, peaches, raspberries, strawberries, blueberries, & fresh sweet corn. Really experience the taste

of a blueberry pie fresh from the oven with ice cream and really delight in it. Smell fresh bread, chocolate chip cookies, scrumptious caramel rolls hot from the oven. Notice the fresh air right after a rain, or the early morning flowers with dew still on them. Feel the touch of a baby's skin, a cool swim on a hot day, or warm fleece lined gloves on a cold day.

3. Focus on doing something for someone else. The best way to forget our problems is to focus on others. Mark Twain said, "The best way to cheer yourself up is to try to cheer somebody else." When we focus on someone else rather than ourselves, we feel better about ourselves and about life in general. Do random or intentional acts of kindness for others like giving someone in your life a warm compliment, a special ac-

knowledge, bringing them a flowers, sending a hand written note, or buying someone a special cup of coffee. Do this every day or as often as you can and let it become a habit.

4. Show appreciation to others and make them feel that they matter in this world and that they matter to you. In the world we live in today everyone needs some hope and encouragement, whether it's a spouse, a child, another family members, a friend, co-worker, a store clerk, a church member, or people you see in stores and on the street. People need to feel valued and appreciated. Many around us are starving for approval and appreciation. Make a commitment to show someone in your life genuine appreciation every day. This will make you feel better and make someone else's day much brighter.
