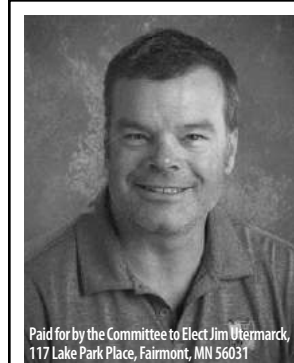

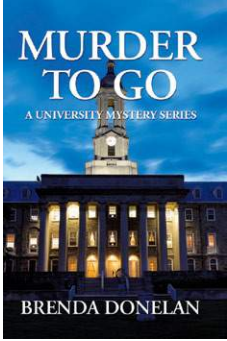


## Donelan Signing Newest Mystery at Happy Owl

# JC Penney and Martin County

JC Penney's stores are well known both locally and nationally. It's interesting to see how the company originally came

the scenes at the company to help plan the chain's future. During the Great Depression, his stores survived by offering a good value to customers on a budget. He was a member of the company's Board of Directors until his death on February 12th, 1971.

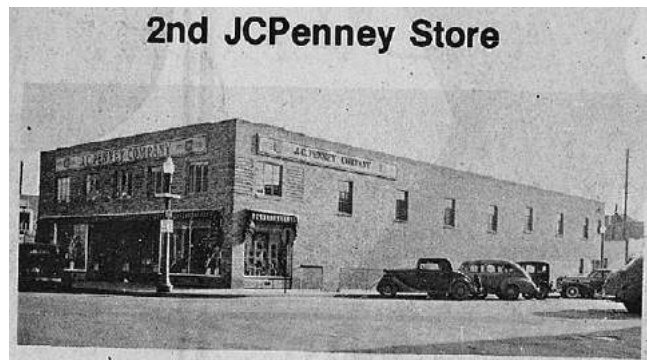
from 83 stores to 175. The chain expanded rapidly as store managers were allowed to open new stores, keeping one quarter of the profits, as soon as they were successful. This simple concept led the stores massive expansion and making it the second-biggest retailer in the country by 1970.

The first JC Penney store in Martin County opened on September 4th, 1925, at 212 N. North Avenue in Fairmont. The managers of that first store were Earl Haire and Donald Campbell. The second JC Penney store opened in 1940 at 300 N. North Avenue in Fairmont. Its managers were Donald Campbell, Charles Helms, and Thomas Thompson. The third, and current, JC Penney store opened on April 15th, 1970, in the then Fair Mall Shopping Center in Fairmont. The manager of the store at that time was William Krick. That store at one time also had an auto center to the north side of the lot toward Blue Earth Avenue. What was at one time the JC Penney Auto Center is now the State Bank of Fairmont.



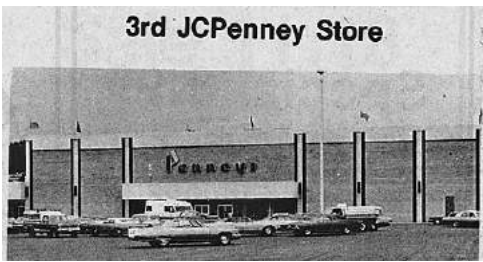
into existence. However, perhaps even more interesting might be to uncover the history of the JC Penney store in Martin County.

The original name for the store that started J.C. Penney in the dry goods business was The Golden Rule. By 1912 there were 34 Golden Rule stores, but the following year it was changed to JC



J.C. Penney was an American businessman born on September 16, 1875, in Caldwell County, Missouri. He worked at a dry goods store where he learned the business and eventually opened his own store in 1902. He expanded to 175 stores by the time he retired in 1917. He stayed active behind

Penney when Penney accepted a majority ownership of the chain, William McManus still being a partner. In two years alone, from 1915 to 1917, the company grew



JC Penney stores were at one time found primarily in downtown locations. However, as times and retail changed, their locations have evolved into shopping mall locations as did the Fairmont store.

The JC Penney store in Fairmont has been in existence in various locations and has been a mainstay of the local retail community serving Martin County since 1925.

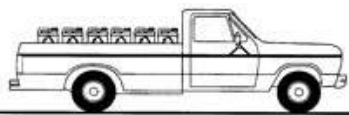

## What's Cooking

### Blueberry Pound Cake

One of my favorite berries are blueberries and they are so good for you, too. You can use either fresh or frozen in this recipe. If you use frozen, don't thaw them first.

There is a delicious blueberry sauce that you can make and serve with the cake. I don't always make the sauce. Sometimes I serve a slice of the pound cake with a dollop of whipped topping for dessert. It makes two loaves so you can tuck one into the freezer and have a quick dessert on hand for that unexpected company!

#### Blueberry Pound Cake:

1 cup butter (no substitutes) softened  
3 cups sugar  
1 1/2 tsp vanilla extract  
1/2 tsp lemon extract  
6 eggs  
3 cups all-purpose flour  
1/4 tsp baking soda  
1 cup (8 oz) sour cream  
3 cups fresh or frozen blueberries  
confectioner's sugar

In a large mixing bowl, cream butter and sugar, beat in extracts. Add eggs, one at a time, beating well after each addition. Combine flour and baking soda; add to creamed mixture alternately with sour cream. Fold in blueberries.

Spoon into two greased and waxed paper-lined 9 inch x 5 in. x 3-in. loaf pans. Bake at 350 degrees for 60-65 minutes or until a tooth pick inserted near the center comes out clean. Cool for 10 minutes before removing from pans to wire racks until cool, dust with confectioner's sugar.

#### Blueberry Sauce:

1 cup sugar  
1/4 cup cornstarch  
1/2 cup cranberry juice concentrate  
6 cups fresh or frozen blueberries

In a saucepan combine the sugar, cornstarch and cranberry juice concentrate until smooth, add blueberries. Bring to a boil over medium heat; cook and stir for 2 minutes or until thickened. Serve warm or cold over slices of the pound cake.

### WEEK OF SEPTEMBER 12, 1965

Lake dredging began after five years of planning and building up a dredge fund. The dredge was to cost \$115,000, pontoons \$11,500, pipe \$15,000, connections, sleeves, etc., \$4,000 and work boat \$8,004. Estimated cost of operation per year was \$32,051 figuring about 7½ months. This would include two work shifts daily of 8 hours each by a dredge operator, workboat man, and incidental help from city street and park crews. The hydraulic dredge, an Elliot "Dragon" model, was to be delivered momentarily. It was 52 feet long, 21 feet wide. The multi-bladed cutter, which revolved as it fed lake-bottom silt into the suction pipe, was mounted on the end of a 40-foot boom which swung from side to side. The cutter was powered through a transmission independent from the propelling machinery.

**Nature by the yard**  
By Al Batt

The day had many charms. Minnesota does fall weather well, but not often and not always in the fall. Monarch butterflies stopped by on their way to Mexico. I heard hope and joy in the calls of the goldfinches. I received sanctimonious scolding from blue jays for not offering them peanuts in the shell.



A red-tailed hawk circled above. As I watched the raptor set sail, I thought of the musical, "Oklahoma," "Watch the hawk, making lazy circles in the sky."

I saw twin fawns. I recalled an article I'd read about deer in Pennsylvania. It stated that in two-year-olds: 34 percent carried a single embryo, 63 percent carried twins and 3 percent carried triplets. In adult does (older than three): 22 percent carried a single embryo, 73 percent carried twins, and 5 percent carried triplets.

**Q-and-A**

"Do swallows reuse their nests?" Barn and cliff swallows repair and reuse old nests. Cliff swallows nest colonially in gourd-shaped mud nests, often on bridges or the outsides of buildings. Any swallow building a nest inside a building is likely a barn swallow, which builds a cup nest of mud.

Toni Perschbacher of Albert Lea asked what leaves show color first. Sumac and Virginia creeper show red, dogwood is purple, and cottonwood, walnut and ash offer yellow.

Tom Belshan of Glenville asked if Chinese elms are susceptible to Dutch elm disease and if milkweed is a perennial. Dutch elm disease is a fungal disease discovered in Minnesota in 1961. It's capable of infecting all native Minnesota elm trees, which includes American elm, red or slippery elm, and rock elm. Chinese elm (which isn't hardy in Minnesota), Japanese elm and Siberian elm are resistant, but not immune to the disease. Siberian elm, often colloquially called Chinese elm, is distinguished from native elms by its small leaves. Chinese Elm (lace-bark elm) has a flaky rather

than furrowed bark and flowers in late summer or fall.

Milkweed is a perennial that reproduces by seeds and rhizomes. Common milkweed flowers in pinkish-purple clusters and the fruits are spindle-shaped pods. The brown seeds are attached to tufts of white, silky hairs. Once the pods dry and split open, the seeds become wind-borne.

"How can I keep the neighbor's cat out of my yard?" Ask your neighbor to keep the cat indoors. It's better for the cat. Some folks humanely trap cats. Check local laws

first. Some animal control agencies or shelters lend live traps. Sardines are good bait, but you

may catch a wild animal. Check traps often. Some people try to discourage cats by spraying them with a garden hose. This is an effective deterrent only if the cat gets sprayed every time it's in your yard. A cat-proof fence. Putting bells on a cat's collar doesn't prevent predation on birds. A bird doesn't

necessarily associate the sound of a bell with danger. Well-fed cats kill birds because the urge to hunt and the urge to eat are controlled by different parts of the brain. Declawing a cat doesn't stop predation.

"I saw a monarch butterfly with only four legs. Shouldn't it have six?" A monarch's thorax has three segments. Each segment has a pair of legs attached. The second and third segments also have a pair of wings attached. Monarchs appear to have only four legs because the two front legs are tiny and curl up next to the thorax.

"Does a beaver eat fish?" Beavers eat the leaves, inner bark and twigs of deciduous trees. They also eat aquatic plants, soybeans, corn, ferns, grasses, shrubs and occasionally, coniferous trees. Muskrats will eat shellfish, snails, fish, frogs, and salamanders, generally when plants are scarce.

"I saw a huge green and blue dragonfly. What was it?"

A green darner is a large

dragonfly that can be over 3 inches long, with a wingspan of 4 1/2 inches. It has a green thorax (middle section of body). Males have a blue abdomen (back part of body), while females have a purplish-gray abdomen. Green darners are found near water sources.

Multiple Benefits to Minimally Invasive Surgery

Minimally invasive operating techniques have had a tremendous impact on surgery since the 1990s. This advancement in surgical technique is leading to an improvement in the quality of life for patients undergoing surgical interventions.

In minimally invasive surgery, surgeons use a variety of techniques to operate with less injury to the body than with open surgery. Minimally invasive surgery is usually done on an outpatient basis or requires only a short hospital stay. A common form of minimally invasive surgery is laparoscopy, which is surgery conducted through one or more small incisions, using small tubes and tiny video cameras and surgical instruments.

The advantages of minimally invasive operating techniques are:

- Less pain
- Faster recovery after an operation
- Earlier return to work
- Better cosmetic results

Minimally invasive surgeries have now become the standard surgical techniques in many routine operations, such as cholecystectomy (removal of the gallbladder), appendectomy (removal of the appendix) and hernia repair.

Ultra-minilaparoscopic, or needlescopic surgery, represents the continued evolution of minimally invasive surgery. By definition, it is based on the use of instruments and telescopes with a diameter of 2-3 millimeters. The terms ultra-minilaparoscopic and needlescopic surgery were introduced to differentiate the approach to minimally invasive procedures performed with 5-12 millimeter instruments.


Approximately 800,000 gallbladder removals are performed annually in the United States. The vast majority are removed laparoscopically with 5-12 millimeter instruments. For the past two years, surgeons in Fairmont have successfully removed about 12 gallbladders on selected patients using the ultra-minilaparoscopic approach. These gallbladders have been removed using 3 millimeter instruments entered into the abdominal cavity through one 5 millimeter and two 3.5 millimeter skin incisions.

The cosmetic results have been outstanding, resulting in surgeries with very little scarring. The incisional scars are virtually invisible three months after the operation. Patient's post-operative pain appears to have significantly decreased, but this is hard to quantify. We have had some patients undergo this surgical procedure on a Friday, and they are able to return to work on the following Monday. Since such tiny incisions are used, there are no post-operative restrictions.

State-of-the-art 3 millimeter instruments have recently been purchased for Mayo Clinic Health System in Fairmont to expand the availability of this cosmetically advanced, patient-friendly technique to more patients in our region. Three-millimeter instruments can also be used for some gynecological surgeries, appendix removal, hernia repairs and abdominal explorations.


Surgeons and physicians in Fairmont continue to strive to provide the best and most innovative care for patients. Mayo Clinic Health System in Fairmont is the first Mayo Clinic site in the region to offer this type of surgery.

## Ask A Trooper: School Bus Safety Tips

With school starting this article will be entirely focused on the safety of our children. Traffic safety is a two-way street and everyone has an investment.

### School Bus Safety Tips for Motorists:

- Motorists must stop at least 20 feet from a school bus that is displaying red flashing lights and/or its stop arm is extended when approaching from the rear and from the opposite direction on undivided roads.
- Red flashing lights on buses indicates students are either entering or exiting the bus.
- Motorists are not required to stop for a bus if the bus is on the opposite side of a separated roadway (median, etc.) — but they should remain alert for children.
- Altering a route or schedule to avoid a bus is one way motorists can help improve safety. In doing so, motorists won't find themselves behind a bus and as a result, potentially putting children at risk.
- Watch for school crossing patrols and pedestrians. Reduce speeds in and around school zones.
- Watch and stop for pedestrians — the law ap-

plies to all street corners, for both marked and unmarked crosswalks (all street corners) — every corner is a crosswalk.

### School Bus Safety Tips for Children:

Parents should discuss and demonstrate pedestrian safety with their children and reinforce safe crossing after exiting a bus:

- When getting off a bus, look to be sure no cars are passing on the shoulder (side of the road).
- Before crossing the street, take five “giant steps” out from the front of the bus, or until the driver's face can be seen.
- Wait for the driver to signal that it's safe to cross.
- Look left-right-left when coming to the edge of the bus to make sure traffic is stopped. Keep watching traffic when crossing.

## Communicating 'You Matter'

A fundamental way to create emotional connections is by communicating 'You Matter'. We communicate 'You Matter' to others whenever we honor others' needs. This happens in a special way when we honor their name, their voice and their need to belong. Other simple examples of 'You Matter' could be walking in to a store and having a staff person say "hi", going to a meeting where you do not know anyone and being welcomed, talking with someone who is really listening to you. In this article the focus will be on listening to understand. When we listen we are giving that person our attention and communicating, 'You Matter'.

In our fast paced society, many of us feel the pressure to do more in less time. This sounds productive until it involves intently listening to someone. Our listening can actually be dysfunctional even though it may feel normal to us. Being aware of five different levels of listening, can support us in communicating more effectively with others.

**Level 1. My Life Is On My Mind.** Thinking about our own life and its demands is normal and necessary.

- Being concerned about paying bills.
- Worrying about a sick family member.

We just do not want to do that when it takes us away from being present with others. It interferes with effectively listening and communicating.

**Level 2. Judgmental.** When we are judging we are not listening.

- "Oh great not this issue again"
- "Why can't you figure this out on your own?"

Judgment is a vital part of our lives, especially when we are making decisions while driving a car, caring for children or developing an important project. Judging has a proper place in our day, but not when we need to be present in the moment. The formula is simple: listening should precede judging. One challenge is we often pre-judge before or during the 'listening'.

**Level 3. Distracted.** Falling victim to physical distractions can lead us to not really listening.

- Answering a text or an email while someone is talking to you.
- We all can be distracted by things like an uncomfortable room temperature or too much noise near you.

**Level 4. Processing.** This level of listening can be a tricky one. When we are processing, as the other person is speaking, our poor listening is comprised of rapid-fire thinking, creating solutions or responses for the issue at hand. We should be sim-

ply listening. When the other person has finished speaking, following a short pause is when our thinking should be switched on and only then should we be offering ideas or suggestions to the other person.

**Level 5. The Listening Zone.** People using TOP 20 concepts try to get in the Listening Zone as often as possible. In this level, they work hard to eliminate the other four levels and put themselves in the moment. This is an addition by subtraction equation. When we eliminate 'Life on My Mind', 'Judgmental', 'Distracted' or 'Processing' modes, we automatically move to the 'Listening Zone'.

Of course this is not new information, just a recap of the importance of honestly listening to someone and conveying 'You Matter'. We never create problems by listening. We often create problems or make them worse by not listening.

Action idea: Commit daily to communicating 'You Matter' by listening intently to someone.

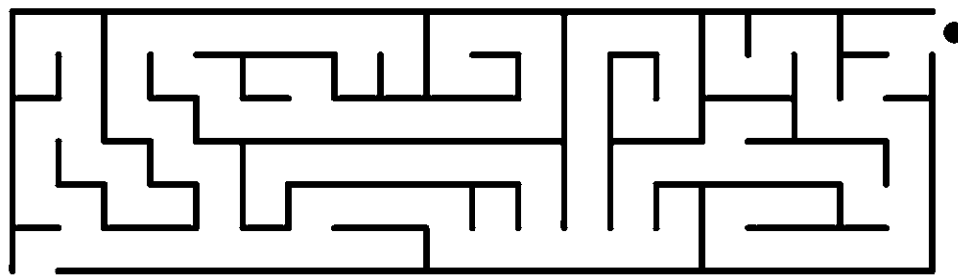

# The Plow Lay

It is something remembered from my childhood. One of the last duties of late summer was called "fall plowing". This meant plowing the oat stubble field after the oats had been threshed. Each moldboard on the plow had a PLOW LAY.

My first memory of fall plowing was when my father would hook up the IHC F-20 Regular tractor to his IHC two bottom 14-inch plow (called a Genius). The plow had two PLOW LAY that had to be sharpened before the plowing could begin. The most important part of the lay was its point. The points would wear down as they were pulled through the sometimes hard and packed black soil of the prairie. Plowing with a dull PLOW LAY meant that the plow would not go into the ground and the plow would pull hard. Each PLOW LAY was attached to the lower end of the moldboard with heavy bolts. These bolts

were usually rusty and very hard to remove. Once freed, each PLOW LAY was taken to the blacksmith to



be sharpened. My father was like many farmers. He usually waited until something was needed before getting it ready.

I liked going to the blacksmith shop with my father. He would carry a heavy PLOW LAY in each hand and put them down at the end of the many sets of PLOW LAY that lay on the dark floor of the shop. They were two of the many that the blacksmith needed to sharpen. The blacksmith would stop his work and write our name on the

back of each PLOW LAY with a large piece of white chalk. My father would try to start a conversation

with other farmers. The conversation would relate to how good the oat crop had been or the grain market. The only one that did not enter the conversation was the blacksmith. He had too much work to do.

The blacksmith shop was a very interesting place for a young boy. It was a dark place, full of smoke, with the smell of hot iron. The most remembered part of the shop was seeing the glowing red of the hot coals within the forge. The blacksmith would insert

several PLOW LAY into the hot coal one at a time. The blower of the forge roared as it forced air through the hot coals. The PLOW LAY had to be "red hot" before the sharpening process began. Once heated, the blacksmith would carry a heated PLOW LAY to the anvil and began the process of pounding the softened metal forward and down into the point with a heavy hammer. What I remember the most was the rhythm of his beat; three heavy hits on the PLOW LAY followed by two light hits on the anvil. For some reason the rhythm seemed to be necessary. Some blacksmiths used an automatic trip-hammer instead of a hammer. The force of the

trip-hammer did the same thing as a hammer. Once there was enough metal at the tip of the PLOW LAY the blacksmith would then form it to the desired point. The point had to be formed at a certain angle. The left side of the PLOW LAY had to line up with the landslide that formed the furrow. Once formed, the blacksmith would lower the heated PLOW LAY into a large vat of cold water, which "hardened the steel". Steam rose up from the large container and provided yet another remembered smell. The blacksmith finished sharpening the point and lower edge of the PLOW LAY by holding it against a large turning grinder. This process gave off yet

another remembered smell. A line of sparks flew into the darkness of the shop. The last step was the quiet noise when the blacksmith polished the restored PLOW LAY by holding it up to a large turning brush-like wheel. This process offered the only soft sound. The blacksmith worked hour after hour on the long line of PLOW LAY, sometimes never catching up with those who kept bringing them in. He knew that the farmers needed their sharpened PLOW LAY. Most farmers were patient with the blacksmith. However, there were always those who thought they should come first.

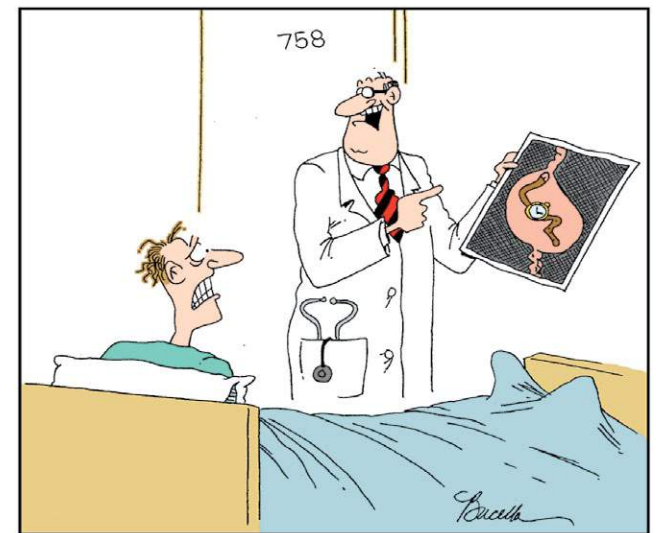
