#### **Maple-Roasted Chicken** and Acorn Squash


Love those one dish meals!

I am always on the lookout for a new recipe to try. The all-in-one, easy kind are the best! I was browsing through the latest Taste of Home magazine and saw one that caught my eye. I love roasted veggies so this one called out to me, I made it today for lunch and I will definitely make it again. I did make some minor changes. I didn't have squash and didn't want to make a trip to the store so I used what I had. I think sweet potatoes would be good, too. I used the onion, carrots, and parsnips for the veggies, and I drizzled them with a little olive oil before putting the chicken on top. I also scattered some fresh sage leaves over them. The sage grows right outside my kitchen door. The recipe didn't call for any herbs, but I couldn't resist, I would also like to try thyme or rosemary, but that's up to you. Here is the recipe as written:

#### Maple-Roasted Chicken and Acorn Squash:

- 1 medium acorn squash
- 4 medium carrots, cut lengthwise and cut in chunks
  - 1 medium onion, cut in wedges
  - 6 bone-in chicken thighs
  - 1/2 cup maple syrup
  - 1 tsp salt
  - 1/2 tsp pepper

Preheat oven to 450 degrees (that's the temp I used throughout the roasting). Cut acorn squash lengthwise in half; remove and discard seeds. Cut each half into 1/2 inch slices, discard ends. Place squash, carrots and onion in greased 13x9 inch baking pan (I lined the pan with tin foil), top with chicken thighs skin side down, roast 15 minutes. Turn chicken over, drizzle with the maple syrup, sprinkle with salt and pepper, continue roasting another 30-35 minutes until a thermometer reads 170-175 degrees, until top of chicken is nice and brown and veggies are fork tender. Have a great week!

Answer: There is no law from placing their feet on the dashboard while the vehicle is in motion.



Gov. now serves a three year term: as Lt. Gov.; Elect, Lt. Gov., and Immediate Past Lt.

The first Kiwanis Club in Fairmont was charted in 1922. Some of the members who served as Lt. Gov. were: Harvey M. Johnson, C. Warren Gunsten, John P. Brandenhoff, Harley R. Langman, J. W. "Jack" Lefore, Todd Paulus, Russell G. Hanna, Car T. Gauck, Lester H. Bauman, John D. Swartz and Rev. Edwin Hakel.

The Early Risers Club was chartered in 1978 and the following have served as Lt. Gov: James R. Smith, Donald N. Milbrandt and Joseph Burns. The above served only one year in the Division makeup. James M. Bock, a member of the Early Risers Club, is serving his second term as Lt. Gov. in the Region setup. This is a team effort with all three working together covering all the clubs. Since there are 43 clubs in Region 6, each 12 to 16 clubs that they work closely

Qualifications to be a Lt. Gov. include being a President of a Club, knowledgeable of basic Kiwanis operations, and aware of Kiwanis tools and resources. The Lt. Gov. develops a Region plan, serves as leader with resources to help clubs and answer questions that they may have.

Current duties include:

- 1. Install the Officers of the Club, usually done between September 15 and October 15 each year.
- 2. Visit a Board Meeting of each Club.
- 3. Present a Program at a Regular Meeting.
- 4. Deliver education to officers.
- 5. Shares messages from the District and International Offices.
- 6, Serves on the District Board of Trustees.
- 7. Other duties as may be assigned.





Rod Halvorsen (Media) Rod Halvorsen earned his rightful place in the Fairmont Athletic Hall of Fame after having covered all six of his fellow 2015 classmates during the prime of their respective high school athletic careers, along with all 10 years of fellow Hallmate Jim Simser's tenure along the Cardinals' football sideline during the 1990s.

The KSUM/KFMC news director earned a broadcasting degree from Brown Institute in Minneapolis in 1972 before starting at the Fairmont-based radio station in 1977.

Halvorsen said his biggest thrill was covering the 1990 Fairmont boys basketball team's third-place state finish, with the Cardinals' state runner-up showing in the 1993 baseball tournament running a close second. He added current Fairmont head football coach Mat Mahoney's state

The Fairmont Area High runner-up performance in 2011, Patti Strukel and the Cardinal girls basketball program's first-ever trip to the state tournament in 2007, and Simser and the Fairmont football team's state appearance in the Metrodome in 1992 as career highlights.

Halvorsen, who resides in Fairmont with his wife Sue. continues to cover a wide array of Cardinal athletics through the local airwayes.



Wollschlager (1992) - Wollschlager excelled in three prep sports and in the classroom at Fairmont High School in the early 1990s.

The 12-time Fairmont letterwinner netted all-South Central Conference volleyball accolades along with all-conference honors during both her junior and senior seasons to complement an appearance in the 1992 district championship game.

The five-year varsity golfer played a key role in powering the Cardinals to four consecutive conference championships from 1989-92 and three straight trips to the Class AA state tournament (1990-92). Wollschlager earned sectional individual medalist honors in 1991 and 1992, netted academic all-state honors in golf in 1990 and 1992, and captured weekly all-state individual honors on three occasions during her senior season in the

Wollschlager played golf at Gustavus Adolphus College in

Wollschlager, who has double bachelor degrees in business and psychology has been director of America's Executive Recruiting services with Ernst & Young in Minneapolis for the last 14 years.



Jim Simser (Coach)— Jim Simser accepted the unenviable challenge of replacing a legendary prep football coach and athletic director at Fairmont High School in the fall of 1990. Simser, however, exceeded even his close friend and retired Cardinals head coach Tom Mahoney's expectations during his 10-year tenure along the Fairmont sideline.

The former New Richland-Hartland-Ellendale-Geneva High School coaching guru engineered three state football bids from 1990-99 - including Fairmont's first-ever appearance in the Metrodome by reaching the 1992 Class A state semifinals. He also guided the Cardinals to back-to-back appearances in the Class A state quarterfinals in 1996 and 1997.

Simser earned a place in the Minnesota Football Coaches Association's Hall of Fame in 2000 after retiring with a 223-91-1 overall record — which currently ranks 31st all-time in

Simser continues to serve as a valuable volunteer in the Fairmont area by contributing his time and skills to programs like Golden Deeds, Fairmont Kinship, the Fairmont Kiwanis Success Academy, Meals on Wheels, Let's Go Fishing and the Minnesota State Universitv-Mankato's Tomorrow's Teachers just to name a few.

Jim and his wife Winn Ann, who passed away in 2013, had four sons who all played high school football for the legendarv coach.



Alysia Zielske Danielson (1992) — Alysia Zielske Danielson possessed a quick wit, outstanding sense of humor, a contagious smile and the will to achieve success in every aspect of her life.

Zielske and fellow Hallmate Heather Wollschlager combined court skills to guide Fairmont to an appearance in the District 5 championship game

The two-time individual state qualifier and four-year all-South Central Conference cross country runner played a key role in guiding the Cardinal girls to the school's firstever state team championship in any sport when Fairmont garnered the 1988 cross country crown.


The 2011 Sentinel Relays honorary referee closed out her stellar five-year prep track & field career in 1992 as the Cardinals' No. 4 all-time leading scorer with 1,386 points. Zielske also finished with the program's third-best time in the high hurdles, fourth-best time in the 300-meter hurdles and sixth-best distance in the long jump.

Zielske earned a track & field scholarship to the University of St. Thomas in St. Paul.

Zielske merited all-American status five times as a member of the UST women's track & field team, while also earning magna cum laude academic honors in graduating with a degree in finance. UST honored Zielske Danielson posthumously by naming the women's track & field team's MVP after her.

Zielske Danielson worked as a manager for Travelers Insurance Company's IT global sourcing in St. Paul before passing away at the age of 35 on Dec. 20, 2009, after a battle with squamous cell carcino-

Peterson Newlin (1996)— Jill Newlin Peterson assembled one of the most memorable and prolific threesport prep careers in the history of Fairmont athletics.

The 11-time letterwinner powered the Cardinal gymnasts to the state tournament three times during her fiveyear varsity tenure. Newlin also qualified for the individual state gymnastics meet during her freshman through senior years.

Newlin, who competed in tennis during her final two prep years, played a key role in powering Fairmont to the state track & field meet four times as a team, in addition to earning state medals four straight seasons as an individual qualifier.

The 10-time South Central Conference individual track & field champion — four times in the triple jump, three in the long jump and three in the high hurdles — still holds the Fairmont girls long jump record while ranking No. 2 in the triple jump.

The perennial state-qualifying long jumper, triple jumper and hurdler went on to capture four letters in track & field at the University of Wisconsin-La

Newlin Peterson earned a bachelor's degree in sports management in 2001, and now serves as the marketing director for GMR Marketing/Pierce Promotions in New Berlin, Wis. She and husband, Josh Peterson, have twins - Jasmine and Isaac. The family resides in Brookfield, Wis.



Kyle Seifert (1993) — Kyle Seifert defined the term 'student-athlete' as one of Fairmont High School's most prolific three-sport standouts.

Seifert played offensive and defensive tackle for Jim Simser from 1990-92. The three-year football letterwinner played a key role in guiding Fairmont to the 1991 South Central Conference championship and 1992 Class A state semifinals in the Metrodome in Minneapolis.

Seifert earned all-conference and Sentinel All-Area honors for a second straight season in 1992 and was chosen for a spot on the Minneapolis Star Tribune's all-state team en route to being selected to play in the Minnesota Football Coaches Association's annual all-star game.

The three-year all-SCC and two-time All-Area first baseman/outfielder also made a big impact on the diamond, powering the Cardinals to runner-up state accolades in the 1993 Class A baseball tournament. Seifert was selected to the all-state tournament team. Seifert also lettered twice in basketball.

Seifert received academic offers and a football scholarship to Augustana College in Sioux Falls, S.D. He earned academic all-North Central Conference honors in 1997 and later a bachelor of arts degree in biology that spring. Seifert earned a doctorate degree in biomedical sciences, with an emphasis in microbiology and immumology, from the University of Florida in 2004.

Seifert currently serves as an associated professor of biology at James Madison University in Harrisonburg, Va. Kyle has three children.











Jenna Tietje Gilday (1994) Jenna Tietje Gilday excelled in volleyball and basketball along with track & field. In 1994 she was Region 2AA Triple A award winner and state finalist amd she earned allconference honors for three years in a row — 1992-94.

Jenna played an integral role in helping steer the Cardinals to the 1991 True Team state championship, in addition to third-place showings in 1992 and 1994, and a fifthplace finish in 1993.

Tietje, however, excelled on both the volleyball and basketball courts for four and three years, respectively. The twotime Fairmont volleyball MVP earned both all-conference and Sentinel All-Area honors three times. The two-time Cardinals' basketball MVP also netted all-SCC and All-Area accolades two years apiece. Tietje finished her career as Fairmont's 20th all-time scorer and 17th-best rebounder.

Tietje earned athletic and academic scholarships to Augustana College. She was a conference finalist in the javelin as a collegiate freshman. Tietje earned a bachelor of arts in business/communications from Augustana in 1998, also an MBA in marketing and international business from the Carlson School of Management at the University of Minnesota in 2008.

Tietje Gilday works as the group marketing manager for the baby and kids division at Target in Minneapolis.

Eric Anderson (1997) -Eric Anderson closed out his prep track & field career at Fairmont High School as one of the program's top point producers in the spring sport.

Anderson captured both the South Central Conference's 1,600- and 3,200-meter championships during his outstanding track & field career, in addition to qualifying for the Class AA state meet three times in 2-mile run. The No. 2 all-time record holder at Fairmont in the 3,200 was a member of the Cardinals' 1995 squad that won the Section 2AA True Team Meet and a fifth-place showing at state.

Anderson still holds the No. 4 all-time mark in the 1,600. Anderson also excelled in cross country in the fall. The threeyear all-state runner placed fifth at the Class AA state cross country meet in 1996, and is one of only three 1,000-point scorers in the 50-year history of Fairmont cross country. The four-year all-conference and three-year academic all-state runner also is one of just three runners in school history to run under 16 minutes for a 5K

Anderson serves as the senior pastor at Lifespring Evangelical Church in Crosby, Minn. Eric and his wife, Miriam, have seven children while expecting an eighth addition to the family in the near future.

Ducks flew over. It was the quack of dawn. The sun cast a new light upon the day.

I heard a call that could only be described "hwaah." A Eurasian

Once perched, it began doing its repetitive cooing, "koo-KOO-kook."

A chipmunk was both chipping and munking.

I saw a hen turkey. A neighbor had hit a young turkey with his truck. The turkeys feed often in road ditches. There are many insects there, particularly grasshoppers.

I gazed across the road at a cornfield, realizing that there were at least 30,000 plants per acre. An acre is about 3/4 the size of a football field with the end zones included.

A deer ran into the cornfield, intent on scoring a touchdown.

#### Q-and-A

"How big are pelicans?" The American white pelican, which matures at three to four years of age, weighs 10 to 30 pounds, is 4 to 5 feet long and has a 9.5-foot wingspan. Other large white birds include the trumpeter swan that weighs 20 to 30 pounds, is 5 feet long and has a 7 to 8-foot wingspan.

The great egret weighs 2.25 pounds, is 41 inches long and has a 4.5-foot wingspan. The great egret is the symbol of the National Audubon Society. Great egrets were decimated by 19th-Century hunters who supplied plumes to purveyors of ladies' fashions. The great egret population plunged by 95 percent.

Mix a batch of nectar especially for the bees, using three

A great blue heron, big cups of water and one cup of sugar. Pour into a bowl (a yellow one is best) and place near the hummingbird feeder. When the bees find it, move the bowl a bit farther away from the feeder every day until the bees are no longer near the feeder. Ants and wasps may also find the bowl attractive.
