## Nutrition Facts: Reading the Label

Reading labels can help you make smart food choices. Processed and packaged foods and drinks found in cans, boxes, bottles, jars, and bags have a lot of information on their labels or packaging about nutrition and food safety. Following are some types of information found on the labels.

### Product dates

• "Sell by" tells you how long the store can sell foods like meat, poultry, eggs, or milk products. Buy them before this date.

• "Use by" tells you how long the food will be at peak quality. If you buy or use them after that date, some foods might not be safe any longer.

• "Best if used by" (or "best if used before") tells you how long the food has the best flavor or quality. It is not a purchase or safety date.

### Ingredients list

Ingredients in processed

food are listed on the label from largest to smallest amount. That is, there's more of the first ingredient listed than any other ingredient.

### Nutrition Facts Label

At the top of the Nutrition Facts label, you'll find how much is considered one serving of that food or drink and the number of servings in the container.

Daily Value (DV) is how much of each nutrient most people need each day. The % DV says what part (as a percent) of the total daily recommendation for a nutrient is in a serving based on eating 2,000 calories each day.

# What's Cooking

## Maple-Roasted Chicken and Acorn Squash

Love those one dish meals!

I am always on the lookout for a new recipe to try. The all-in-one, easy kind are the best! I was browsing through the latest Taste of Home magazine and saw one that caught my eye. I love roasted veggies so this one called out to me, I made it today for lunch and I will definitely make it again. I did make some minor changes. I didn't have squash and didn't want to make a trip to the store so I used what I had. I think sweet potatoes would be good, too. I used the onion, carrots, and parsnips for the veggies, and I drizzled them with a little olive oil before putting the chicken on top. I also scattered some fresh sage leaves over them. The sage grows right outside my kitchen door. The recipe didn't call for any herbs, but I couldn't resist, I would also like to try thyme or rosemary, but that's up to you. Here is the recipe as written:

### Maple-Roasted Chicken and Acorn Squash:

1 medium acorn squash  
4 medium carrots, cut lengthwise and cut in chunks  
1 medium onion, cut in wedges  
6 bone-in chicken thighs  
1/2 cup maple syrup  
1 tsp salt  
1/2 tsp pepper

Preheat oven to 450 degrees (that's the temp I used throughout the roasting). Cut acorn squash lengthwise in half; remove and discard seeds. Cut each half into 1/2 inch slices, discard ends. Place squash, carrots and onion in greased 13x9 inch baking pan (I lined the pan with tin foil), top with chicken thighs skin side down, roast 15 minutes. Turn chicken over, drizzle with the maple syrup, sprinkle with salt and pepper, continue roasting another 30-35 minutes until a thermometer reads 170-175 degrees, until top of chicken is nice and brown and veggies are fork tender. Have a great week!



## Ask A Trooper: Feet on the Dashboard

**Question: I spend a fair amount of time on the highway and often see passengers in vehicles with their feet on the dash. How can their seat belts be in the proper location to do their job? What would happen in the case of an air bag deployment?**

**Answer:** There is no law that prohibits a passenger from placing their feet on the dashboard while the vehicle is in motion.

However, passengers who put their feet up in a moving vehicle could be putting themselves at even greater risk of injury in the event of a crash. It comes down to using good judgement. I would bet that most passengers never think about what could happen to them in the event of a collision when the airbags deploy.

Airbags are designed to cushion the head and chest of an adult passenger sitting in an upright position when wearing a correctly fitted seatbelt. If the passenger is sitting incorrectly, there is a greater risk of injury in a crash. This could result in their knees being forced into their chest or face that could cause a serious injury or death. There is also a risk of leg fractures or spinal injuries.

Here are some recommendations and information on airbag safety from the National Highway Traffic Safety Administration.

- When there is a moderate to severe crash, a signal is sent from the air bag

system's electronic control unit to the inflator within the air bag module.

- An igniter in the inflator starts a chemical reaction that produces a harmless gas, which inflates the air bag within the blink of an eye - or less than 1/20th of a second.

- Side-impact air bags inflate even more quickly since there is less space between the occupant and the striking object, such as the interior of the vehicle, another vehicle, a tree, or a pole.

- Because air bags deploy very rapidly, serious or sometimes fatal injuries can occur if the occupant is too close to - or is in direct contact with - the air bag when it first begins to deploy.

- Sitting as far back from the steering wheel or dashboard as possible and using seat belts help prevent occupants from being "too close" to a deploying frontal air bag.

I highly recommend that you do not place your feet on the dashboard while the vehicle is in motion.

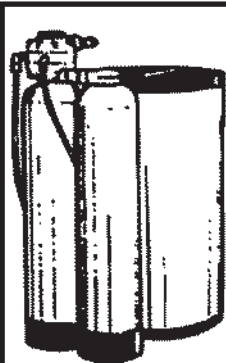

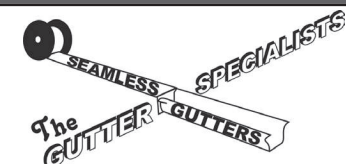

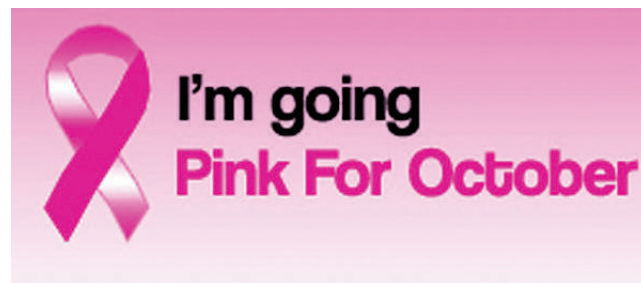

### Kiwanis Lieutenant Governors

Each Kiwanis Club is run by their members, but they also have the help of a Lieutenant Governor. For many years, the Lt. Gov. served only one year and had six to twelve clubs assigned to them in

what was called a "Division." Now the Minnesota-Dakotas District of Kiwanis International is divided into seven Regions made up of seven clubs around Rapid City, SD to the 43 clubs in Region 6 that Fairmont is in. The Lt. Gov. now serves a three year term: as Lt. Gov.; Elect, Lt. Gov., and Immediate Past Lt. Gov.

The first Kiwanis Club in Fairmont was chartered in 1922. Some of the members who served as Lt. Gov. were: Harvey M. Johnson, C. Warren Gunsten, John P. Brandenhoff, Harley R. Langman, J. W. "Jack" Lefore, Todd Paulus, Russell G. Hanna, Car T. Gauck, Lester H. Bauman, John D. Swartz and Rev. Edwin Hakel.

The Early Risers Club was chartered in 1978 and the following have served as Lt. Gov: James R. Smith, Donald N. Milbrandt and Joseph Burns. The above served only one year in the Division makeup. James M. Bock, a member of the Early Risers Club, is serving his second term as Lt. Gov. in the Region setup. This is a team effort with all three working together covering all the clubs. Since there are 43 clubs in Region 6, each 12 to 16 clubs that they work closely with.

Qualifications to be a Lt. Gov. include being a President of a Club, knowledgeable of basic Kiwanis operations, and aware of Kiwanis tools and resources. The Lt. Gov. develops a Region plan, serves as leader with resources to help clubs and answer questions that they may have.

Current duties include:

1. Install the Officers of the Club, usually done between September 15 and October 15 each year.
2. Visit a Board Meeting of each Club.
3. Present a Program at a Regular Meeting.
4. Deliver education to officers.
5. Shares messages from the District and International Offices.
6. Serves on the District Board of Trustees.
7. Other duties as may be assigned.

Yes, this takes time, but it is very enjoyable. I have visited a number of clubs as they celebrated milestones. I have learned more about the history of Kiwanis in Southwest Minnesota and made many new friends.

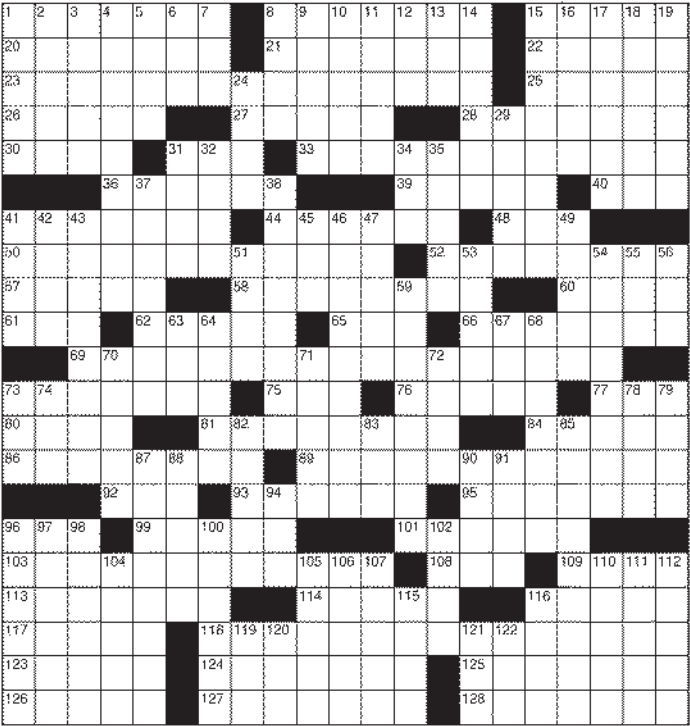

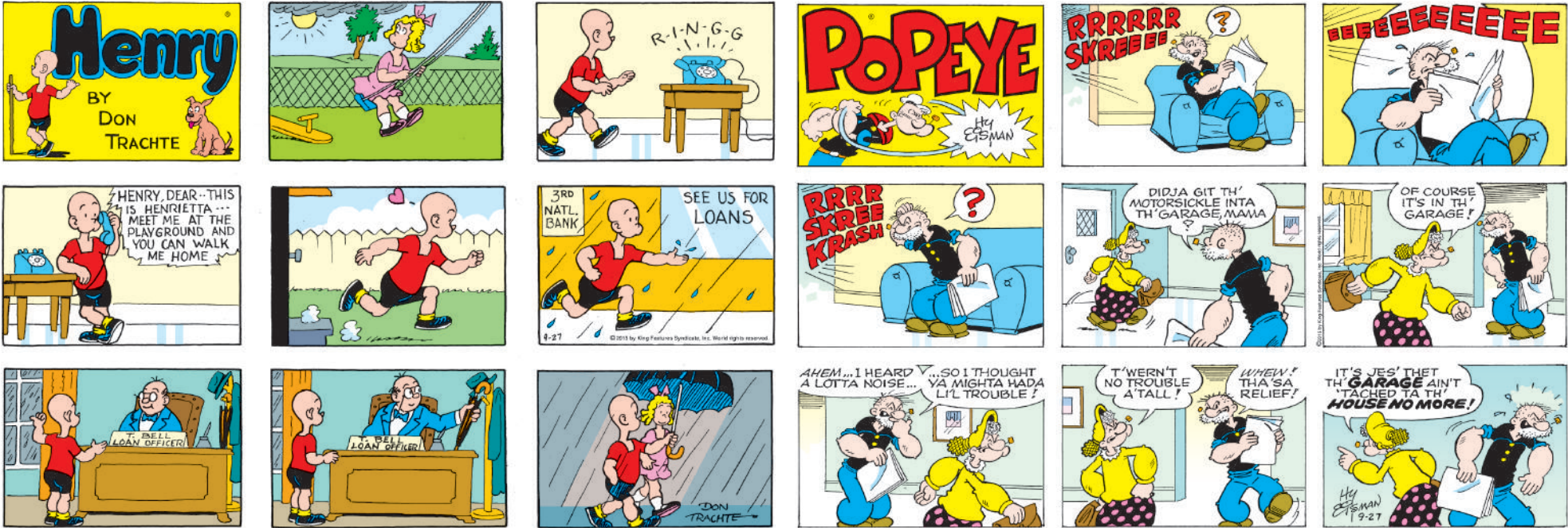
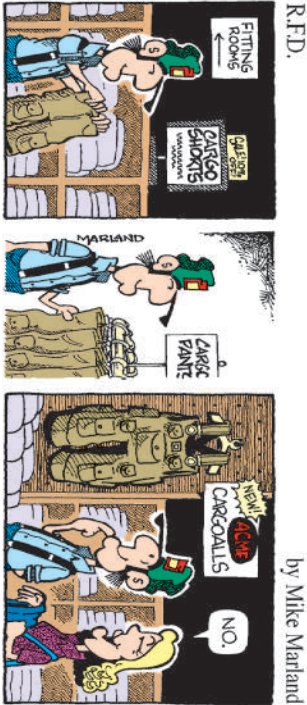

## FHS Hall of Fame Announces the Class of 2015 Honorees

The Fairmont Area High School Twenty-second Annual "Cardinal Athletic Hall of Fame Banquet" will be held Saturday, October 3rd, 5 p.m. at the Fairmont Area High School Commons. This year's inductees will be honored on Friday night at half-time of the Albert Lea/Cardinal football game and at the Hall of Fame banquet on Saturday.

Tickets are \$10 and are available at FHS and from Committee Members (Judy Lohrenz, Jared Thompson, Charlie Sorrells, Sue Mosloski, Gary Wollschlager, Dick Gould, Bob Bonk, Milah Howlett, Sue Ruen, Brad Gerhardt and Mat Mahoney). Inductees for this year's Hall of Fame class include:



**Rod Halvorsen (Media)** — Rod Halvorsen earned his rightful place in the Fairmont Athletic Hall of Fame after having covered all six of his fellow 2015 classmates during the prime of their respective high school athletic careers, along with all 10 years of fellow Hallmate Jim Simser's tenure along the Cardinals' football sideline during the 1990s.

The KSUM/KFMC news director earned a broadcasting degree from Brown Institute in Minneapolis in 1972 before starting at the Fairmont-based radio station in 1977.

Halvorsen said his biggest thrill was covering the 1990 Fairmont boys basketball team's third-place state finish, with the Cardinals' state runner-up showing in the 1993 baseball tournament running a close second. He added current Fairmont head football coach Mat Mahoney's state

runner-up performance in 2011, Patti Strukel and the Cardinal girls basketball program's first-ever trip to the state tournament in 2007, and Simser and the Fairmont football team's state appearance in the Metrodome in 1992 as career highlights.

Halvorsen, who resides in Fairmont with his wife Sue, continues to cover a wide array of Cardinal athletics through the local airwaves.



**Heather Wollschlager (1992)** — Wollschlager excelled in three prep sports and in the classroom at Fairmont High School in the early 1990s.

The 12-time Fairmont letterwinner netted all-South Central Conference volleyball accolades along with all-conference honors during both her junior and senior seasons to complement an appearance in the 1992 district championship game.

The five-year varsity golfer played a key role in powering the Cardinals to four consecutive conference championships from 1989-92 and three straight trips to the Class AA state tournament (1990-92). Wollschlager earned sectional individual medalist honors in 1991 and 1992, netted academic all-state honors in golf in 1990 and 1992, and captured weekly all-state individual honors on three occasions during her senior season in the fairways.

Wollschlager played golf at Gustavus Adolphus College in St. Peter.

Wollschlager, who has double bachelor degrees in busi-

ness and psychology has been director of America's Executive Recruiting services with Ernst & Young in Minneapolis for the last 14 years.



**Jim Simser (Coach)** — Jim Simser accepted the unenviable challenge of replacing a legendary prep football coach and athletic director at Fairmont High School in the fall of 1990. Simser, however, exceeded even his close friend and retired Cardinals head coach Tom Mahoney's expectations during his 10-year tenure along the Fairmont sideline.

The former New Richland-Hartland-Ellendale-Geneva High School coaching guru engineered three state football bids from 1990-99 — including Fairmont's first-ever appearance in the Metrodome by reaching the 1992 Class A state semifinals. He also guided the Cardinals to back-to-back appearances in the Class A state quarterfinals in 1996 and 1997.

Simser earned a place in the Minnesota Football Coaches Association's Hall of Fame in 2000 after retiring with a 223-91-1 overall record — which currently ranks 31st all-time in the state.

Simser continues to serve as a valuable volunteer in the Fairmont area by contributing his time and skills to programs like Golden Deeds, Fairmont Kinship, the Fairmont Kiwanis Success Academy, Meals on Wheels, Let's Go Fishing and the Minnesota State University-Mankato's Tomorrow's Teachers just to name a few.

Jim and his wife Winn Ann, who passed away in 2013, had four sons who all played high school football for the legendary coach.



**Alysia Zielske Danielson (1992)** — Alysia Zielske Danielson possessed a quick wit, outstanding sense of humor, a contagious smile and the will to achieve success in every aspect of her life.

Zielske and fellow Hallmate Heather Wollschlager combined court skills to guide Fairmont to an appearance in the District 5 championship game in 1992.

The two-time individual state qualifier and four-year all-South Central Conference cross country runner played a key role in guiding the Cardinal girls to the school's first-ever state team championship in any sport when Fairmont garnered the 1988 cross country crown.

The 2011 Sentinel Relays honorary referee closed out her stellar five-year prep track & field career in 1992 as the Cardinals' No. 4 all-time leading scorer with 1,386 points. Zielske also finished with the program's third-best time in the high hurdles, fourth-best time in the 300-meter hurdles and sixth-best distance in the long jump.

Zielske earned a track & field scholarship to the University of St. Thomas in St. Paul.

Zielske merited all-American status five times as a member of the UST women's track & field team, while also earning magna cum laude academic honors in graduating with a degree in finance. UST honored Zielske Danielson posthumously by naming the women's track & field team's MVP after her.

Zielske Danielson worked as a manager for Travelers Insurance Company's IT global sourcing in St. Paul before passing away at the age of 35 on Dec. 20, 2009, after a battle with squamous cell carcinoma.

Zielske Danielson is sur-

vived by husband, Ben Danielson, along with son, Cooper, and daughter, Sawyer, and her mother, Sue Zielske.



**Jill Newlin Peterson (1996)** — Jill Newlin Peterson assembled one of the most memorable and prolific three-sport prep careers in the history of Fairmont athletics.

The 11-time letterwinner powered the Cardinal gymnasts to the state tournament three times during her five-year varsity tenure. Newlin also qualified for the individual state gymnastics meet during her freshman through senior years.

Newlin, who competed in tennis during her final two prep years, played a key role in powering Fairmont to the state track & field meet four times as a team, in addition to earning state medals four straight seasons as an individual qualifier.

The 10-time South Central Conference individual track & field champion — four times in the triple jump, three in the long jump and three in the high hurdles — still holds the Fairmont girls long jump record while ranking No. 2 in the triple jump.

The perennial state-qualifying long jumper, triple jumper and hurdler went on to capture four letters in track & field at the University of Wisconsin-La Crosse.

Newlin Peterson earned a bachelor's degree in sports management in 2001, and now serves as the marketing director for GMR Marketing/Pierce Promotions in New Berlin, Wis. She and husband, Josh Peterson, have twins — Jasmine and Isaac. The family resides in Brookfield, Wis.



**Kyle Seifert (1993)** — Kyle Seifert defined the term 'student-athlete' as one of Fairmont High School's most prolific three-sport standouts.

Seifert played offensive and defensive tackle for Jim Simser from 1990-92. The three-year football letterwinner played a key role in guiding Fairmont to the 1991 South Central Conference championship and 1992 Class A state semifinals in the Metrodome in Minneapolis.

Seifert earned all-conference and Sentinel All-Area honors for a second straight season in 1992 and was chosen for a spot on the Minneapolis Star Tribune's all-state team en route to being selected to play in the Minnesota Football Coaches Association's annual all-star game.

The three-year all-SCC and two-time All-Area first baseman/outfielder also made a big impact on the diamond, powering the Cardinals to runner-up state accolades in the 1993 Class A baseball tournament. Seifert was selected to the all-state tournament team. Seifert also lettered twice in basketball.

Seifert received academic offers and a football scholarship to Augustana College in Sioux Falls, S.D. He earned academic all-North Central Conference honors in 1997 and later a bachelor of arts degree in biology that spring. Seifert earned a doctorate degree in biomedical sciences, with an emphasis in microbiology and immunology, from the University of Florida in 2004.

Seifert currently serves as an associated professor of biology at James Madison University in Harrisonburg, Va. Kyle has three children.

**Jenna Tietje Gilday (1994)** — Jenna Tietje Gilday excelled in volleyball and basketball along with track & field. In 1994 she was Region 2AA Triple A award winner and state finalist and she earned all-conference honors for three years in a row — 1992-94.

Jenna played an integral role in helping steer the Cardinals to the 1991 True Team state championship, in addition to third-place showings in 1992 and 1994, and a fifth-place finish in 1993.

Tietje, however, excelled on both the volleyball and basketball courts for four and three years, respectively. The two-time Fairmont volleyball MVP earned both all-conference and Sentinel All-Area honors three times. The two-time Cardinals' basketball MVP also netted all-SCC and All-Area accolades two years apiece. Tietje finished her career as Fairmont's 20th all-time scorer and 17th-best rebounder.

Tietje earned athletic and academic scholarships to Augustana College. She was a conference finalist in the javelin as a collegiate freshman. Tietje earned a bachelor of arts in business/communications from Augustana in 1998, also an MBA in marketing and international business from the Carlson School of Management at the University of Minnesota in 2008.

Tietje Gilday works as the group marketing manager for the baby and kids division at Target in Minneapolis.

**Eric Anderson (1997)** — Eric Anderson closed out his prep track & field career at Fairmont High School as one of the program's top point producers in the spring sport.

Anderson captured both the South Central Conference's 1,600- and 3,200-meter championships during his outstanding track & field career, in addition to qualifying for the Class AA state meet three times in 2-mile run. The No. 2 all-time record holder at Fairmont in the 3,200 was a member of the Cardinals' 1995 squad that won the Section 2AA True Team Meet and a fifth-place showing at state.

Anderson still holds the No. 4 all-time mark in the 1,600. Anderson also excelled in cross country in the fall. The three-year all-state runner placed fifth at the Class AA state cross country meet in 1996, and is one of only three 1,000-point scorers in the 50-year history of Fairmont cross country. The four-year all-conference and three-year academic all-state runner also is one of just three runners in school history to run under 16 minutes for a 5K race.

Anderson serves as the senior pastor at Lifespring Evangelical Church in Crosby, Minn. Eric and his wife, Miriam, have seven children while expecting an eighth addition to the family in the near future.

### Act Soon to Close Your "Insurance Gap"

If you work for a fairly sizable company, you may be entering your open enrollment season, when you can add or adjust your employer-sponsored benefits. While you probably should review all your benefits, you may want to pay special attention to your life insurance to determine if you and your family are adequately protected.

How much life insurance do you need? You may hear that you require anywhere from seven to 10 times your annual income in life insurance coverage, but this rule of thumb might not be appropriate for everyone; the amount of insurance you need will depend on your individual situation.

To help determine if a "gap" exists between the amount of insurance you have from your employer and the amount you need, your first step is to identify all those expenses that your family would face alone if you were gone. Here are some to consider:

• **Ongoing income replacement needs and living expenses** – If you were to pass away, and your paychecks were to stop, it would likely create a gigantic hole in your family's finances. Adequate life insurance is necessary to replace the loss of your

future salary and cover ongoing living expenses.

• **Mortgage** – If you weren't around, and your income were to disappear, would your family still be able to remain in their home? Factor in your mortgage in any calculation of life insurance needs.

• **Debts** – Apart from your mortgage, what other debts do you have? Car loan? Credit cards? Perhaps even some old student loans? Even if you pass away, these debts won't all disappear, especially if some of them are in the names of you and your spouse. Determine how much you pay each month on all these debts and include this figure in your life insurance estimate.

• **Education** – As you know, higher education comes with some high expenses: Four years at an in-state public school can easily cost upwards of \$80,000, while the price tag can be twice as much for private schools. And these costs may continue rising. So, if you've always planned to send your children to college, you'd better pencil in some big figures for your life insurance calculations.

• **Emergency funds** – It's a good idea for most people to maintain an emergency fund containing six to

12 months' worth of living expenses, with the money kept in a liquid account. This fund can help with unexpected doctor's bills, costly auto repairs and so on. If you weren't there, could your family afford to contribute to such a fund? Again, it's something to think about when you estimate your insurance needs.

• **Surviving spouse's retirement** – If you're married, your income may contribute to your spouse's ability to put money away in a retirement account, such as an IRA or 401(k). If you're gone, your surviving spouse might well have to redirect those funds to the day-to-day costs of running a household. Therefore, include "surviving spouse's retirement funds" as one more item on your insurance estimate worksheet.

As you can see, your absence can jeopardize your family's ability to maintain both their current lifestyle and their aspirations for the future. So, take the time to figure out just how much of an "insurance gap" you face, and then consider options for filling it. It will be time well spent.

My father took over the operation of the Anthony home farm when he was very young. My grandfather came to Minnesota from New York in 1883. The farm was purchased for \$6.50 per acre and remains in the family today. Family history tells of how my grandfather loved hunting. He froze his feet while hunting moose near Ely in 1906 and could no longer farm. The responsibility of farming became the responsibility of his son. My father, born in 1893, was that son.

At that time almost every farm was a diversified livestock farm. It was also the time of very few trac-

tors. The heavy work of the farm was done by using workhorses. Maybe learning to work with horses at such a young age was the reason that my father "always loved his horses". Horses, cattle, and sheep required lots of roughage and the only roughage available at that time was hay. This made "making hay" a lengthy summer job that required lots of labor. Is it any wonder that my father thought there had to be an easier way? I remember him telling me how much he wanted A SILO. He had learned that large amounts of good roughage, called ensilage, could be stored in these

upright curricular-shaped structures. The corn stalks were harvested by chopping them into fine pieces and getting them into the silo. The corn would then ensile or ferment. The earliest silos were made of wood, but most were made of poured cement or individual cement staves that were stacked end to end and held together by surrounding steel bands. The feed from the silo was sweet smelling and tasty to the animals.

My father had learned that it took only few acres of corn to fill such A SILO. Such feed is what he needed. The corn was cut in the field by corn binder. It

cut only one row of corn at a time. The binder was pulled by several horses driven near the side of an outside row of standing corn. The binder would cut down the tall corn stalks and feed it into the body of the binder. It would then group several stalks together and tie them with twine. A corn binder worked much the same as a grain binder of that time. The bundles of corn were then picked up and loaded into wagons. They were hauled to the silo and fed into an "ensilage cutter" which was located near the base of the silo. It cut the stalks and ears into small pieces blew them into the silo through a long pipe. A tractor was needed to power the ensilage cutter. A large belt circled the pulleys of the tractor and cutter.

Many of the memories of my youth come from the

remembered sounds of the farm. The sound of the tractor pulling the heavy load of the ensilage cutter is one of those memories. Another fond memory is the sound of the steel-wheeled wagons traveling down a gravel road when they traveled from farm to farm. The sound of the steel wheels on gravel, the jingling noise coming from the chains on the harnesses, and the rhythm of the horse hooves at a trot, are wonderful memories of my youth. Filling silo was much like threshing grain. It was a community thing. The neighbors that had silos worked together each fall. They would arrive at the designated farm at a certain time in the morning. They would go into the cornfield and load the bundles and haul them to the ensilage cutter. The bundles were then thrown, one by one, onto

a moving apron that carried them to the knives, which cut the stalks and fed them into the blower. It was a time of large dinners, laughter, and pride in their work.

We continue using a silo on the farm where we live. I drove the large tractor that pulled the two-row ensilage cutter this fall. I watched as the stalks of tall green corn disappeared into a machine that chopped it up and threw it back into a large wagon. I saw a long white plastic tube and A SILO filled with but a few acres of corn. This amounted to over 400 ton of feed. It will be part of the roughage needed by the cattle for the coming year.

A SILO was opened for feeding today. The smell of ensilage is the same! Some things never change.



## Nature By the Yard

Ducks flew over. It was the quack of dawn. The sun cast a new light upon the day.

I heard a call that could only be described as "hwaah." A Eurasian collared dove flew in. The dove makes this sound before alighting. Once perched, it began doing its repetitive cooing, "koo-KOO-kook."



A chipmunk was both chipping and munking.

I saw a hen turkey. A neighbor had hit a young turkey with his truck. The turkeys feed often in road ditches. There are many insects there, particularly grasshoppers.

I gazed across the road at a cornfield, realizing that there were at least 30,000 plants per acre. An acre is about 3/4 the size of a football field with the end zones included.

A deer ran into the cornfield, intent on scoring a touchdown.

### Q-and-A

"How big are pelicans?" The American white pelican, which matures at three to four years of age, weighs 10 to 30 pounds, is 4 to 5 feet long and has a 9.5-foot wingspan. Other large white birds include the trumpeter swan that weighs 20 to 30 pounds, is 5 feet long and has a 7 to 8-foot wingspan.

The great egret weighs 2.25 pounds, is 41 inches long and has a 4.5-foot wingspan. The great egret is the symbol of the National Audubon Society. Great egrets were decimated by 19th-Century hunters who supplied plumes to purveyors of ladies' fashions. The great egret population plunged by 95 percent.

A great blue heron, big not white, weighs about 6 pounds, is around 4 feet long and has a 6-foot wingspan. The pelicans feed cooperatively. A group swims in a semicircle to herd fish into shallow water for easy pickings. A pelican's bill can hold approximately 3 gallons of water. Dixon Lanier Merritt wrote, "A wonderful bird is the pelican. His beak can hold more than his belly can. He can hold in his beak, enough food for a week! But I'll be darned if I know how the hellican?" Pelicans migrate in September to mid-November.

ing immediately and are weaned by September. They are able to digest forage by that time. Most fawns lose their spots during the first couple of weeks of September. The adults transition from reddish-brown to darker fall coats in late August and early September.

Kay Boyken of Albert Lea asked how to keep bees and ants out of hummingbird feeders. Some people put oily stuff on the feeders, but I don't like doing that. Moving the feeder might work. Insects usually take longer than hummingbirds to find new locations. Bees prefer basking in sunlight. Keeping the feeder in a shady location could help. Mix a batch of nectar especially for the bees, using three

cups of water and one cup of sugar. Pour into a bowl (a yellow one is best) and place near the hummingbird feeder. When the bees find it, move the bowl a bit farther away from the feeder every day until the bees are no longer near the feeder. Ants and wasps may also find the bowl attractive. There are traps and moats available as well as feeders that discourage insects. Someone told me that she uses chalk to mark the area where the feeder attaches to the hanger. She claims that ants don't like crossing the chalk. I've never tried that.

"Why weren't there many mosquitoes this year?" They were terrible until I'd finished picking the raspberries. There are 51 species in Minnesota and 28 bite us. The weather seemed conducive. Maybe sprays, chemicals or predators? I don't know. Perhaps mosquitoes have embraced Minnesota nice.

"Has the avian flu been found in any wild birds in the state?" Since its outbreak in Minnesota in March, the DNR has found only two positive cases of avian influenza in Minnesota wildlife - a Cooper's hawk in Yellow Medicine County and a black-capped chickadee in Ramsey County.
